- We recommend using Panasonic discs. We also recommend using DVD-RAM discs with cartridges to protect them from scratches and dirt.
- You may not be able to record depending on the condition of the discs and you may not be able to play due to the condition of the recording.

\*<sup>1</sup> You can record onto the second layer of dual- or double-layer discs after closing the first layer (→ page 35). You will no longer be able to record to the first layer after you do this (→ page 16).

When playing a title recorded on both layers, video and audio may momentarily cut out when the unit is switching layers.

\*<sup>2</sup> You may not be able to use +R recorded on this unit in another Panasonic DVD recorder and vice versa. Once the disc is finalized, however, it can be played in the other unit.

\*<sup>3</sup> The amount of the recordable disc space doesn't increase even if the program is deleted when you use a one time recording disc.

### Regarding recording format

#### VR (DVD Video Recording) format

This is a recording method which allows you to freely record and edit television broadcasts and so on.






- Digital broadcasts that allow “One time only recording” can be recorded to a CPRM compatible disc. You can record to CPRM compatible DVD-RAM on this unit.
- Play is only possible on a compatible DVD player.

#### DVD-Video format

This recording method is the same as commercially available DVD-Video.

- Digital broadcasts that allow “One time only recording” cannot be recorded.
- You can play on compatible equipment such as DVD players after finalizing the disc on this unit.

### Regarding DVD-Audio

Some multi-channel DVD-Audio will prevent down-mixing (→ page 44) of all or part of their contents if this is the manufacturer's intention. Tracks that are prevented from being down-mixed will not play properly on this unit (e.g. audio is played from the front two channels only). Refer to the disc's jacket for more information.

### Note about using a DualDisc

The digital audio content side of a DualDisc does not meet the technical specifications of the Compact Disc Digital Audio (CD-DA) format so play may not be possible.

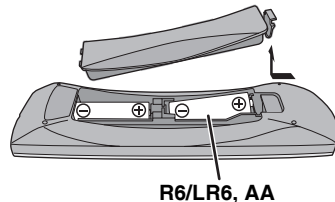

# The remote control information

## ■ Batteries

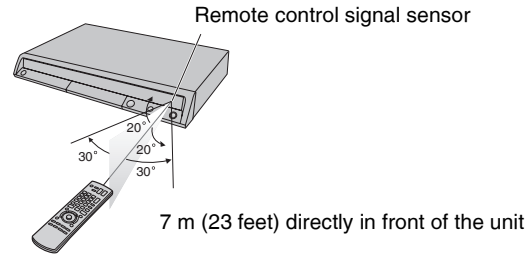
- Insert so the poles (+ and –) match those in the remote control.
- Do not use rechargeable type batteries.
- Do not mix old and new batteries.
- Do not use different types at the same time.
- Do not heat or expose to flame.
- Do not take apart or short circuit.
- Do not attempt to recharge alkaline or manganese batteries.
- Do not use batteries if the covering has been peeled off.



R6/LR6, AA

Mishandling of batteries can cause electrolyte leakage which can damage items the fluid contacts and may cause a fire. Remove if the remote control is not going to be used for a long period of time. Store in a cool, dark place.

# Disc handling

## ■ How to hold a disc

Do not touch the recorded surface.



## ■ Concerning non-cartridge discs

Be careful about scratches and dirt.

## ■ If there is dirt or condensation on the disc

Wipe with a damp cloth and then wipe dry.



## ■ Handling precautions

- Do not attach labels or stickers to discs. (This may cause disc warping and un-balanced rotation, rendering it unusable.)
- Write on the label side of the disc only with a soft, oil-based felt pen. Do not use ballpoint pens or other hard writing implements.
- Do not use record cleaning sprays, benzene, thinner, static electricity prevention liquids or any other solvent.

- Do not use scratch-proof protectors or covers.
- Do not drop, stack, or impact discs. Do not place objects on them.
- Do not use the following discs:
  - Discs with exposed adhesive from removed stickers or labels (rented discs, etc.).
  - Discs that are badly warped or cracked.
  - Irregularly shaped discs, such as heart shapes.
- Do not place in the following areas:
  - In direct sunlight.
  - In very dusty or humid areas.
  - Near a heater.
  - Locations susceptible to significant differences in temperature (condensation can occur).
  - Where static electricity or electromagnetic waves occur.
- To protect discs from scratches and dirt, return them to their cases or cartridges when you are not using them.

# Unit care

The precision parts in this unit are readily affected by the environment, especially temperature, humidity, and dust. Cigarette smoke also can cause malfunction or breakdown.

## To clean this unit, wipe with a soft, dry cloth.

- Never use alcohol, paint thinner or benzene to clean this unit.
- Before using chemically treated cloth, carefully read the instructions that came with the cloth.

## Observe the following points to ensure continued listening and viewing pleasure.

Dust and dirt may adhere to the unit's lens over time, making it impossible to record or play discs.

Use the **DVD lens cleaner** (RP-CL720PP) about once every year, depending on frequency of use and the operating environment. Carefully read the lens cleaner's instructions before use.

**Do not place the unit on amplifiers or equipment that may become hot.**

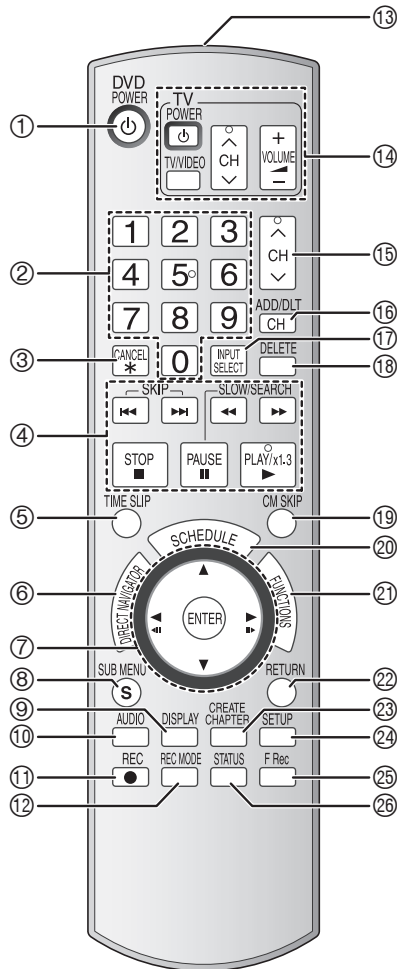

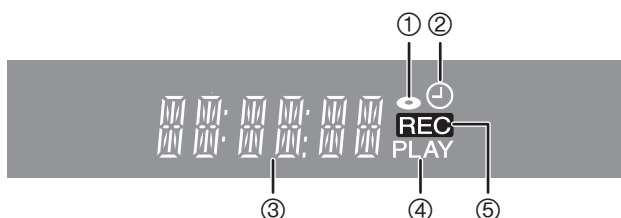

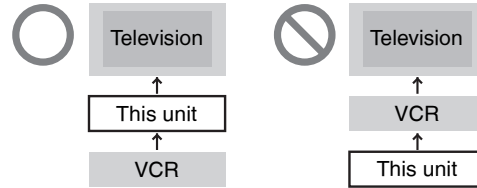

## ■ When the unit is not to be used for a long time

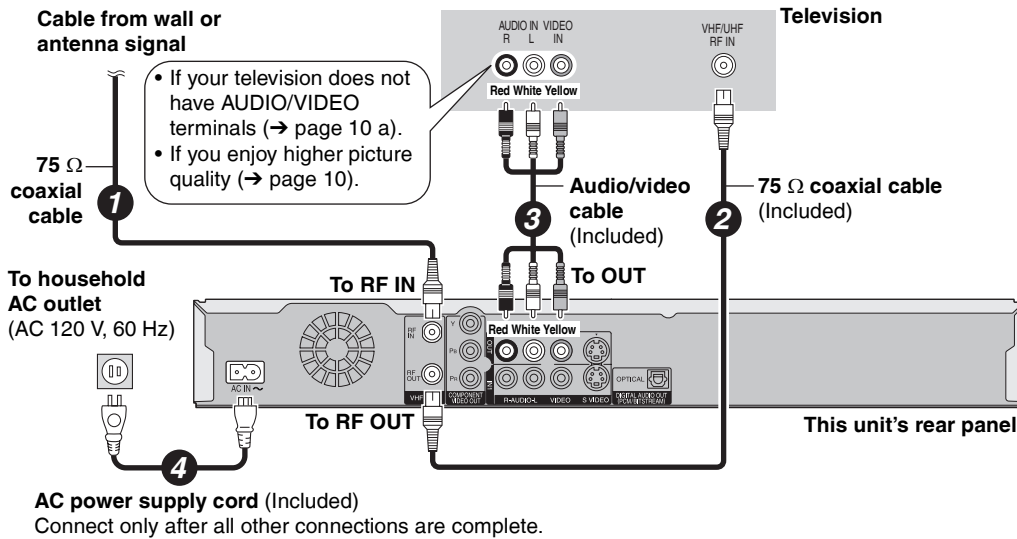
To save power, unplug it from the household AC outlet. This unit consumes a small amount of power, even when it is turned off (approx. 2.0 W).

Video signals fed through video cassette recorders will be affected by copyright protection systems and the picture will not be shown correctly on the television.

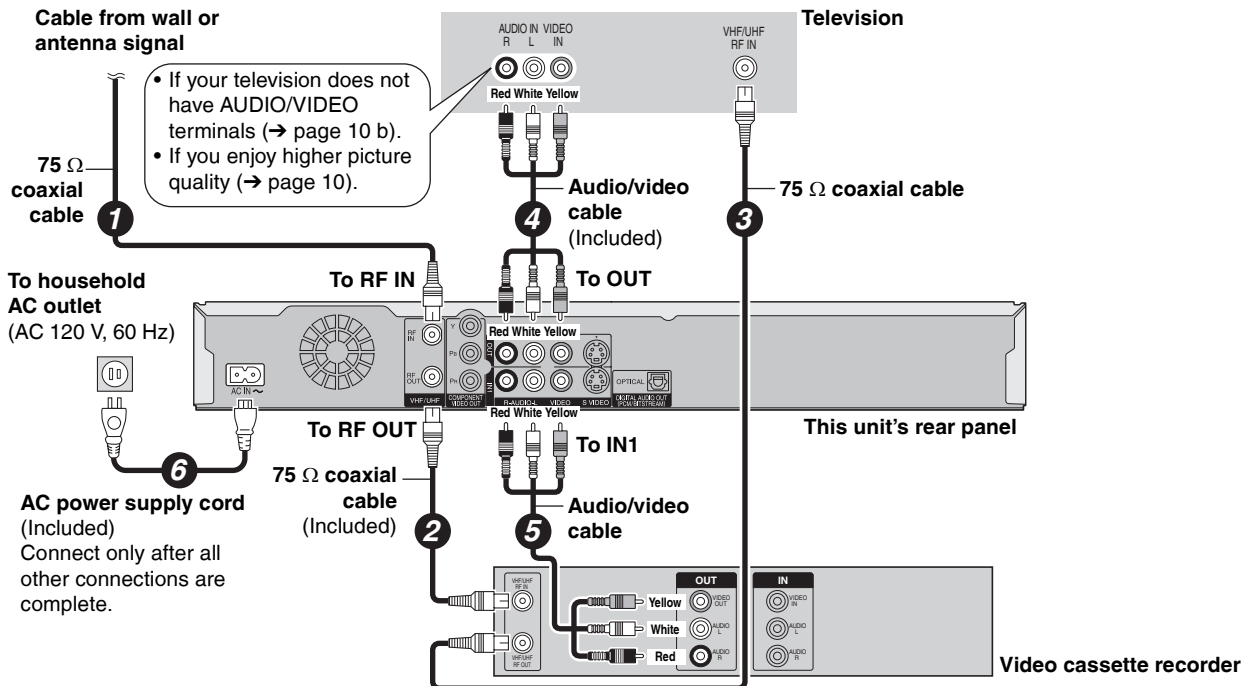


### A Connection with a television



### B Connection with a television and video cassette recorder

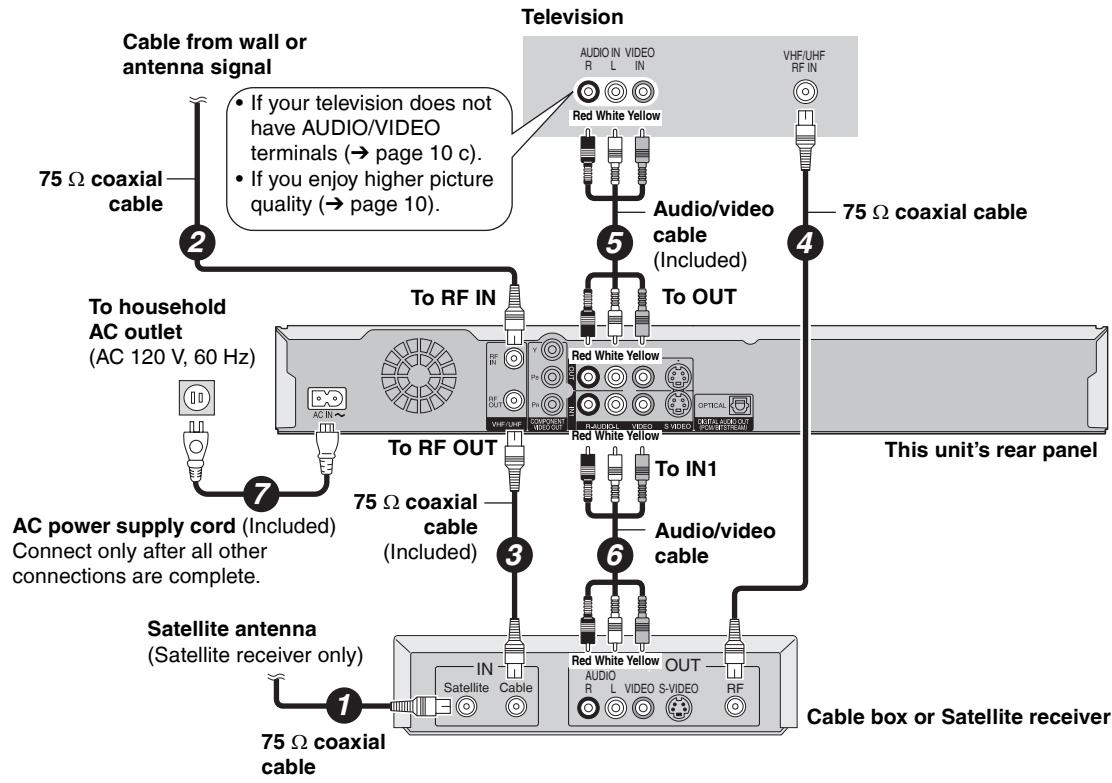

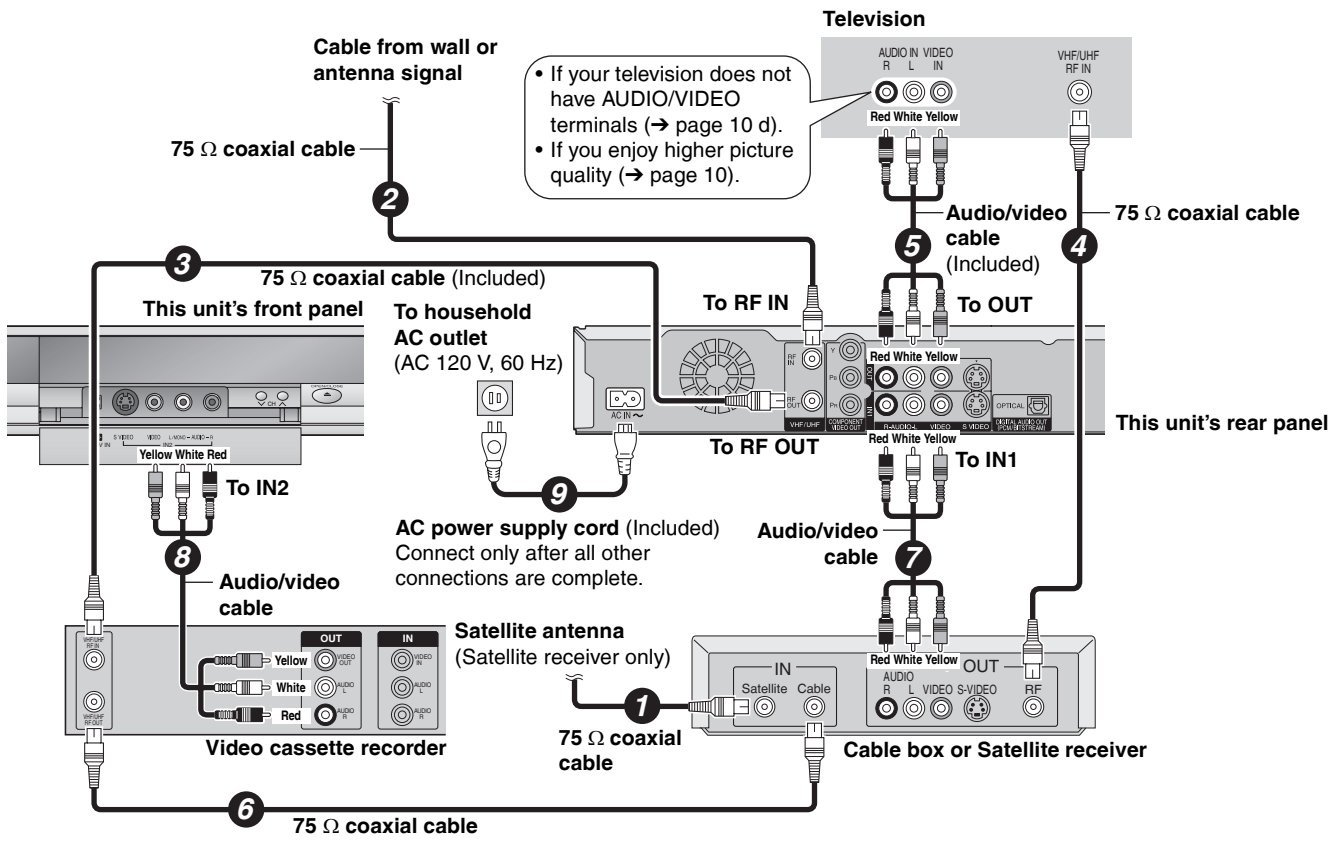

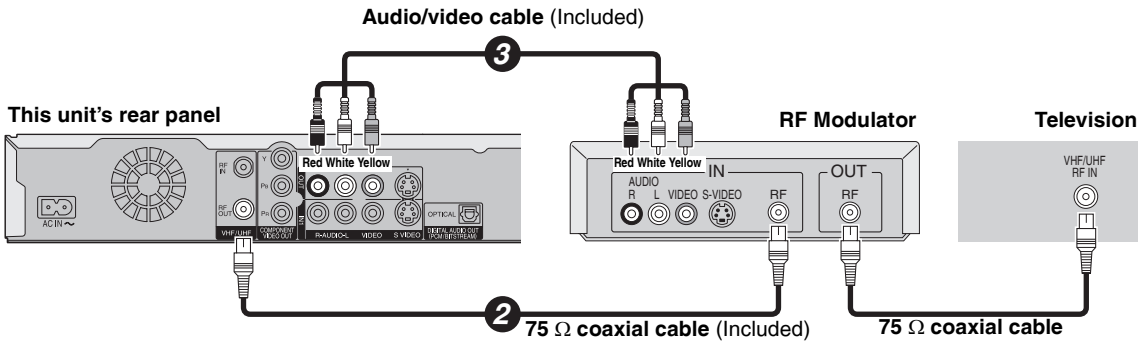

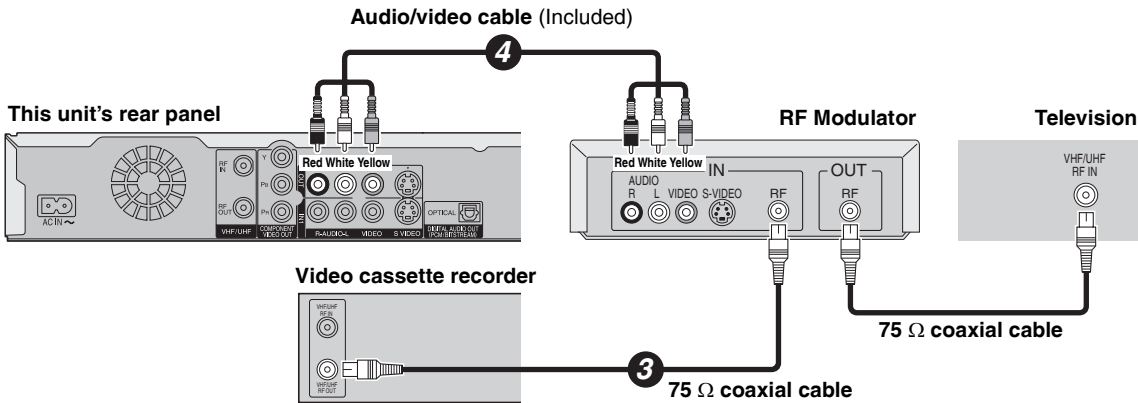

**a** Connection with a television (→ page 8 A)

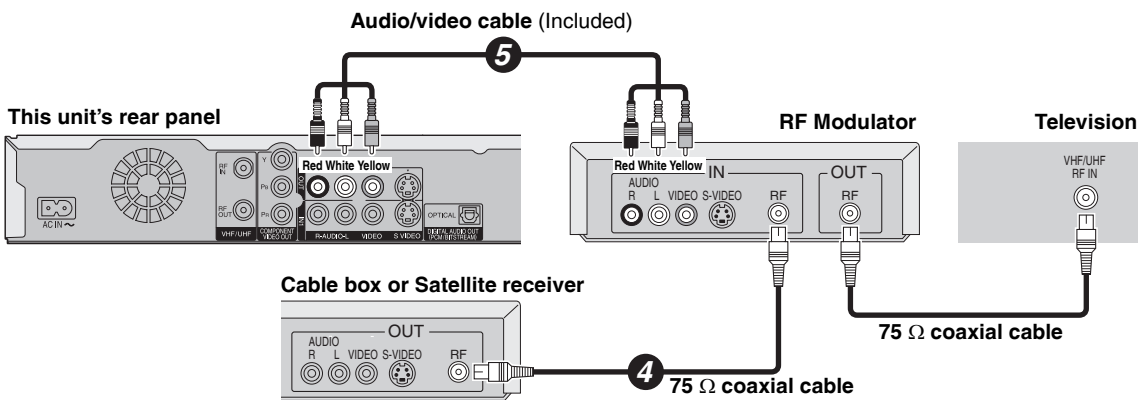


**b** Connection with a television and video cassette recorder (→ page 8 B)

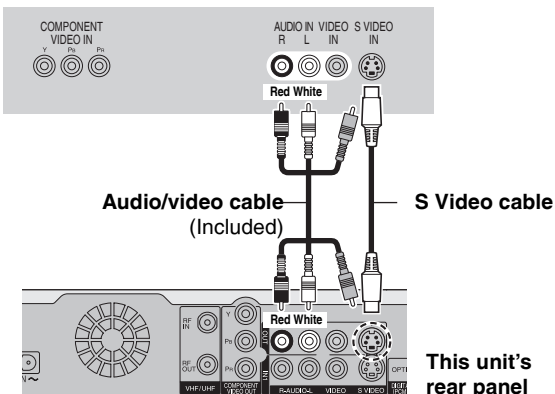

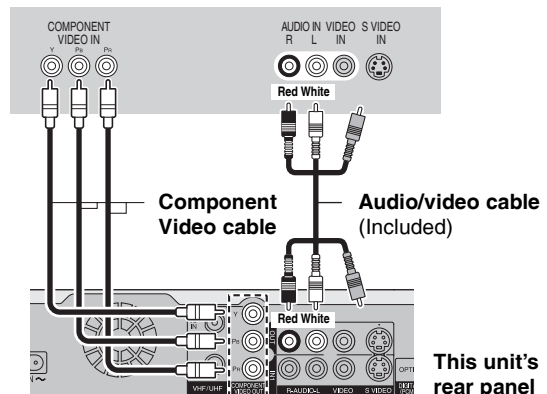


Connecting to the COMPONENT VIDEO IN terminal

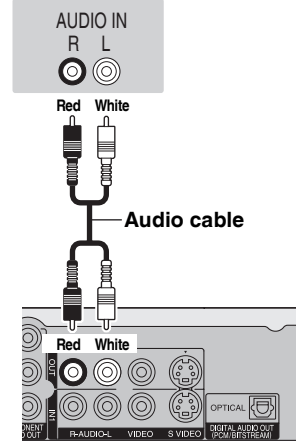

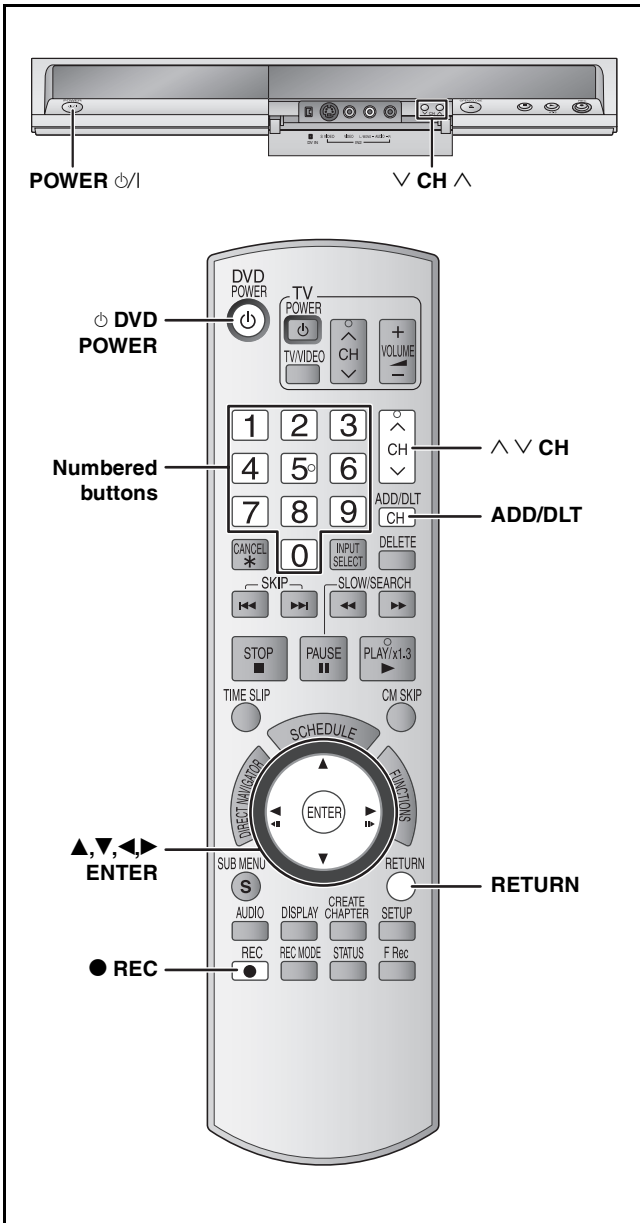

## Recording to a DVD-R DL and +R DL

DVD-R DL and +R DL discs have two layers of recording surface on one side.

**It is not possible to record continuously from the first layer to the second layer.** Recording stops when space on the first layer becomes full. You must close the first layer to start recording on the second layer. Closing makes the first layer unavailable for recording (editing is still available). You cannot cancel closing. Make certain before proceeding.

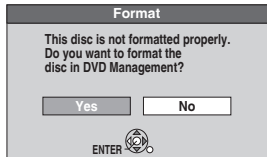
- This unit uses variable bit rate (VBR) recording which varies the amount of data recorded to suit the images, so actual recording times and remaining recording times shown by the unit will be different. (The difference will be especially noticeable with DVD-R DL and +R DL.) Use a disc with plenty of remaining time.
- **RAM** When recording to DVD-RAM using EP (8H) mode, play may not be possible on DVD players that are compatible with DVD-RAM. Use EP (6H) mode if playback may be on other equipment.

## Disc Insertion/Ejection

### When the format confirmation screen is displayed

When you insert a new disc and a disc recorded on a computer or other equipment, a format confirmation screen might be displayed. Format the disc to use it. However all the recorded contents are deleted.

### FR (Flexible Recording)

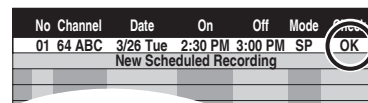
Press [◀▶] to select “Date” and [▲, ▼] to select daily timer or weekly timer.

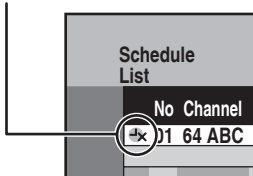

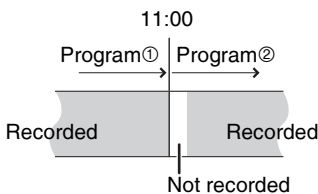

## Notes on scheduled recording

- “Ⓞ” flashes on the unit’s display for about 5 seconds when the unit cannot go to scheduled recording standby (e.g., a recordable disc is not in the disc tray).
- Scheduled recordings begin when the set time is reached even when recording or when playing.
- If the unit is turned on when scheduled recording begins, it remains turned on after recording finishes. It does not turn off automatically. You can turn the unit off during scheduled recording.
- If you are making consecutive recordings that will start one after the other, the beginning of the later program cannot be recorded.

e.g., Program① 10:00–11:00  
Program② 11:00–12:00



- If the actual broadcasting times of scheduled recordings overlap, the recording that starts first always has priority, and the recording of the later program will start only after the first scheduled recording has finished.
- If you set DST (Daylight Saving Time) to On when manually setting the clock (→ page 15), scheduled recording may not work when summer switches to winter and vice versa.

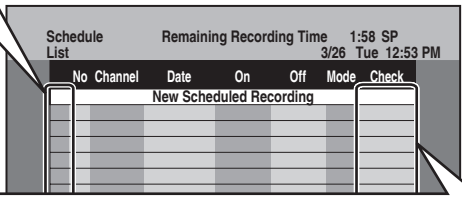
## Check, change or delete a program

Even when the unit is turned off, you can display the schedule list by pressing [SCHEDULE].

**!:** It may not be possible to record because:

- no disc is inserted
- the disc is write-protected
- there is no more space left
- the number of possible titles has reached its maximum
- scheduled recording standby is cancelled

**Overlap:** The times overlap those in another program. Recording of the program with the later start time starts when the earlier program finishes recording.

### ■ To change a program

Press [▲▼] to select the program and press [ENTER] (→ page 20, step 3).

- During scheduled recording, you can change the end time as long as the recording mode is not “FR”.

### ■ To delete a program

Press [▲▼] to select the program and press [CANCEL \*] or [ADD/DLT].

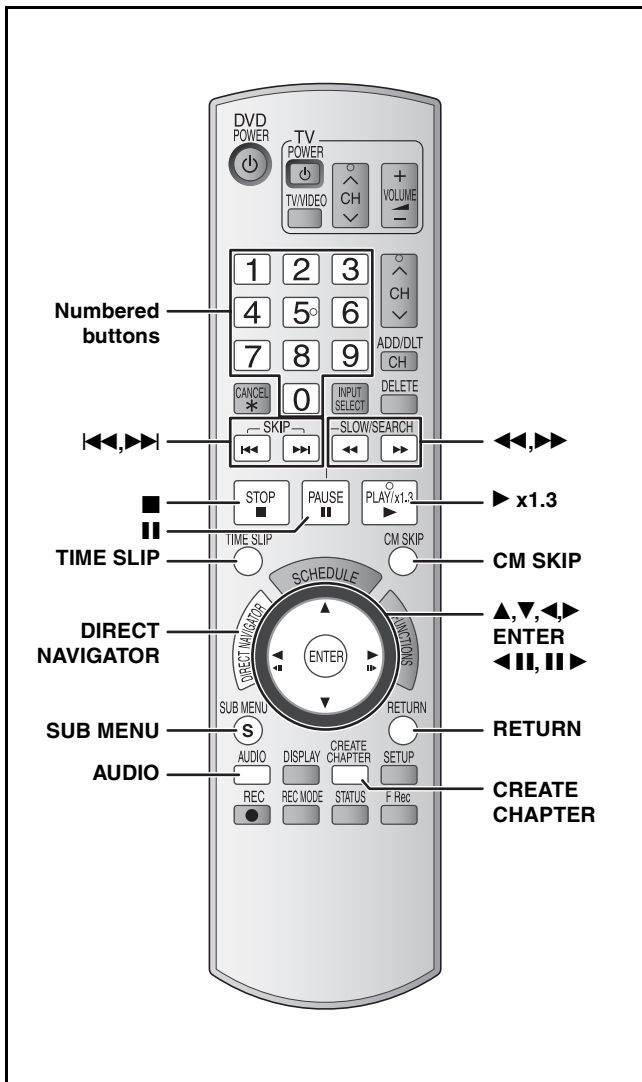

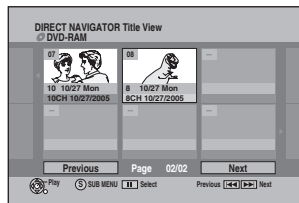

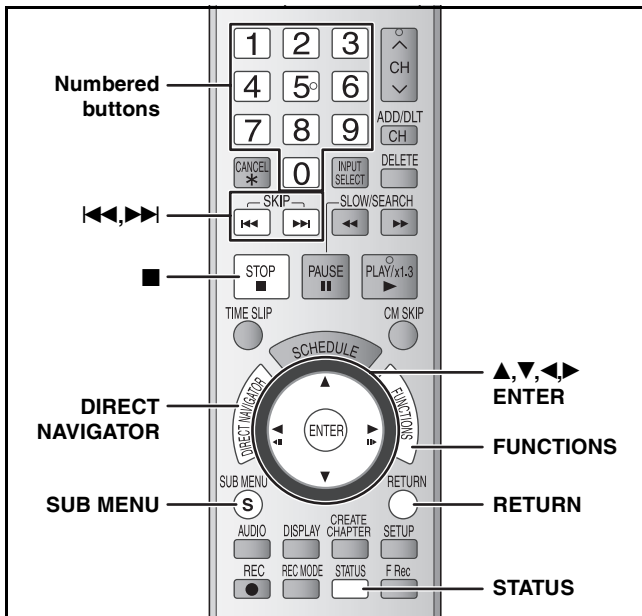

- Maximum number of files (tracks) and folders (groups) recognizable: 999 files\* (tracks) and 99 (including the root folder) folders (groups)
- \* Total number for all the MP3, JPEG and other type of files
- This unit is compatible with multi-session but reading or play of the disc may take time if there are a lot of sessions.
- Operation may take time to complete when there are many files (tracks) and/or folders (groups) and some may not display or be playable.
- The display order on this unit may differ from how the order is displayed on a computer.
- Depending on how you create the disc (writing software), files (tracks) and folders (groups) may not play in the order you numbered them.
- This unit is not compatible with packet-writing format.
- Depending on the recording, some items may not be playable.

## Regarding MP3

- File format: MP3
- Files must have the extension ".mp3" or ".MP3".
- Bit rates: 32 kbps to 320 kbps
- Sampling frequency: 16 kHz/22.05 kHz/24 kHz/32 kHz/44.1 kHz/48 kHz
- This unit is not compatible with ID3 tags.
- If there is a large amount of still picture data etc. within an MP3 file, play may not be possible.

## Regarding still pictures (JPEG/TIFF)

- File format: JPEG, TIFF (non-compressed RGB chunky format)
- Files must have the extension ".jpg", ".JPG", ".tif" and ".TIF".
- Number of pixels: between 34 x 34 and 6144 x 4096 (Sub sampling is 4:2:2 or 4:2:0)
- This unit cannot play images that have resolutions beyond the range shown.
- Operation may take time to complete when playing TIFF format still pictures.
- The unit is not compatible with MOTION JPEG.

You can play MP3 and still pictures (JPEG/TIFF) on this unit by making folders as shown below. However, depending on how you create the disc (writing software), play may not be in the order you numbered the folders.

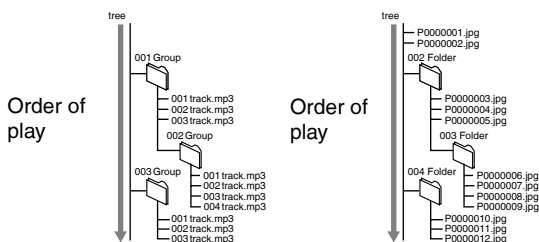
When the highest level folders are "DCIM" folders, they are displayed first on the tree.

  - The DV IN terminal on this unit is for use with DV equipment only. (It cannot be connected to a computer, etc.)

- Finalizing can take a few minutes, up to a maximum of 15 minutes, depending on the remaining space on the disc.  
(**-R DL +R DL** up to 60 minutes.)

Do not disconnect the AC power supply cord while finalizing. This will render the disc unusable.

#### After finalizing

+RW discs contain no Top Menu data. Top Menu is a convenient function. We recommend you to create the menu before playing a +RW disc on other equipment.

- 5 Press [**◀**,**▶**] to select “Yes” and press [ENTER].

Creating Top Menu starts. You cannot cancel creating. Creating Top Menu can take a few minutes.
- 7 Press [ENTER].

- Recording or editing on the disc may delete the menu. In that case, create the menu again.
- You cannot use the title menu for playing on this unit.

## Enabling the second layer on DL (dual- or double- layer on single side) discs to be recordable

### –Close First Layer

**-R DL +R DL**

DVD-R DL and +R DL discs have two layers of recording surface on one side. This unit does not offer seamless recording on two layers. Recording stops when space on the first layer becomes full. You must close the first layer to start recording on the second layer. Closing makes the first layer unavailable for recording (editing is still available). You cannot cancel closing. Make certain before proceeding.

After performing steps 1–3 (→ page 34)

- 4 Press [**▲**,**▼**] to select “Close First Layer” and press [ENTER].
- 5 Press [**◀**,**▶**] to select “Yes” and press [ENTER].
- 6 Press [**◀**,**▶**] to select “Start” and press [ENTER].

Closing the layer starts. You cannot cancel closing. Closing the layer can take several minutes, up to a maximum of 30 minutes, depending on the remaining space on the first layer.

#### Note

Do not disconnect the AC power supply cord while closing the layer. This will render the disc unusable.

## Bitstream

This is the digital form of multi-channel audio data (e.g., 5.1 channel) before it is decoded into its various channels.

## CPRM (Content Protection for Recordable Media)

CPRM is technology used to protect broadcasts that are allowed to be recorded only once. Such broadcasts can be recorded only with CPRM compatible recorders and discs.

## Dolby Digital

This is a method of coding digital signals developed by Dolby Laboratories. Apart from stereo (2-channel) audio, these signals can also be multi-channel audio. A large amount of audio information can be recorded on one disc using this method.

## Down-mixing

This is the process of remixing the multi-channel audio found on some discs into two channels for stereo output. It is useful when you want to listen to the 5.1-channel audio recorded on DVDs through your television's speakers. Some discs prohibit down-mixing and this unit can then only output the front two channels.

## DTS (Digital Theater Systems)

This surround system is used in many movie theaters. There is good separation between the channels, so realistic sound effects are possible.

## Dynamic range

Dynamic range is the difference between the lowest level of sound that can be heard above the noise of the equipment and the highest level of sound before distortion occurs. Dynamic range compression means reducing the gap between the loudest and softest sounds. This means you can listen at low volumes but still hear dialog clearly.

## Film and video

DVD-Videos are recorded using either film or video. This unit can determine which type has been used, then uses the most suitable method of progressive output.

Film:

Recorded at 24 or 30 frames per second. Generally appropriate for motion picture films.

Video:

Recorded at 30 frames/60 fields per second. Generally appropriate for TV drama programs or animation.

## Finalize

A process that makes play of a recorded CD-R, CD-RW, DVD-R, etc. possible on equipment that can play such media. You can finalize DVD-R, DVD-R DL, DVD-RW (DVD-Video format), +R or +R DL on this unit. After finalizing, the disc becomes play-only and you can no longer record or edit. However, finalized DVD-RW can be formatted to become recordable.

## Formatting

Formatting is the process of making media such as DVD-RAM recordable on recording equipment.

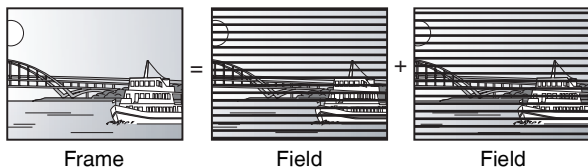
You can format DVD-RAM, DVD-RW (only as DVD-Video format), +R, +R DL or +RW on this unit.

When you use a new DVD-RW, +R, +R DL or +RW, it must be formatted.

Formatting irrevocably deletes all contents.

## Frames and fields

Frames refer to the single images that constitute the video you see on your television. Each frame consists of two fields.



- A frame still shows two fields, so there may be some blurring, but picture quality is generally better.
- A field still shows less picture information so it may be rougher, but there is no blurring.

## JPEG (Joint Photographic Experts Group)

This is a system used for compressing/decoding color still pictures. If you select JPEG as the storage system on digital cameras, etc., the data will be compressed to 1/10–1/100 of its original size. The feature of JPEG is less deterioration in picture quality considering the degree of compression.

## MP3 (MPEG Audio Layer 3)

An audio compression method that compresses audio to approximately one tenth of its size without any considerable loss of audio quality. You can play MP3 you have recorded onto CD-R and CD-RW.

## Pan & Scan/Letterbox

In general, DVD-Video are produced with the intention that they be viewed on a widescreen television (16:9 aspect ratio), so images often don't fit regular (4:3 aspect ratio) televisions. Two styles of picture, "Pan & Scan" and "Letterbox", deal with this problem.

Pan & Scan: The sides are cut off so the picture fills the screen.



Letterbox: Black bands appear at the top and bottom of the picture so the picture itself appears in an aspect ratio of 16:9.



## Playback control (PBC)

If a Video CD has playback control, you can select scenes and information with menus.

(This unit is compatible with version 2.0 and 1.1.)

## Progressive/Interlace

NTSC, the video signal standard, has 480 interlaced (i) scan lines, whereas progressive scanning uses twice the number of scan lines. This is called 480p.

Using progressive output, you can enjoy the high-resolution video recorded on media such as DVD-Video. Your television must be compatible to enjoy progressive video.

## Protection

You can prevent accidental deletion by setting writing protection or deletion protection.

## Sampling frequency

Sampling is the process of converting the heights of sound wave (analog signal) samples taken at set periods into digits (digital encoding). Sampling frequency is the number of samples taken per second, so larger numbers mean more faithful reproduction of the original sound.

## Thumbnail

This refers to a miniature representation of a picture used to display multiple pictures in the form of a list.

## TIFF (Tag Image File Format)

This is a system used for compressing/decoding color still pictures. A common format for storing high quality images on digital cameras and other devices.
