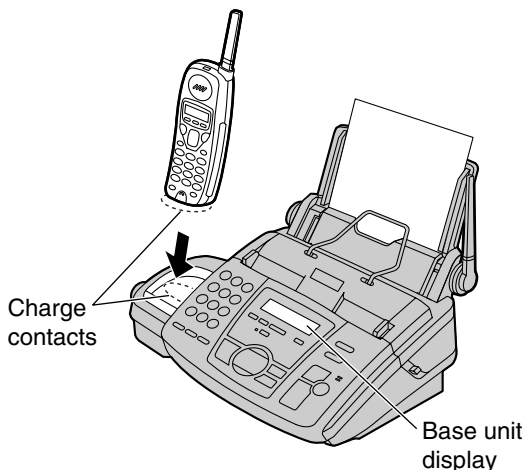
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Battery charge

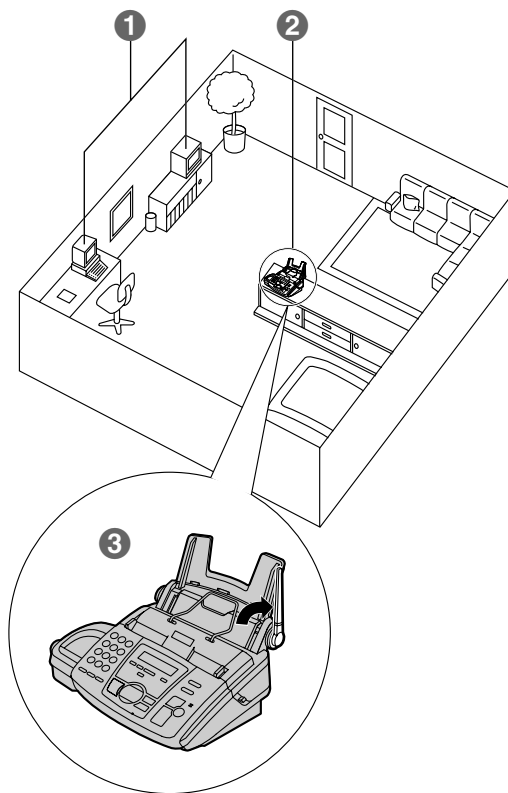

Operating distance and noise

Calls are transmitted between the base unit and the handset using wireless radio waves.

For maximum distance and noise-free operation, the recommended base unit location is:



- 1 **Away from electrical appliances such as a TV, personal computer or another cordless phone.**
- 2 **In a HIGH and CENTRAL location with no obstructions such as walls.**
- 3 **Raise the antenna vertically.**

Note:

- If you are using the handset near a microwave oven which is being used, noise may be heard from the receiver on the handset. Move away from the microwave oven and closer to the base unit.
- If more than one cordless phone is being used and your handset is near another cordless phone's base unit, noise may be heard. Move away from the other cordless phone's base unit and closer to your base unit.

Safety Instructions

Important safety instructions

When using this unit, basic safety precautions should always be followed to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, or personal injury.

1. Read and understand all instructions.
2. Follow all warnings and instructions marked on this unit.
3. Unplug this unit from power outlets before cleaning. Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.

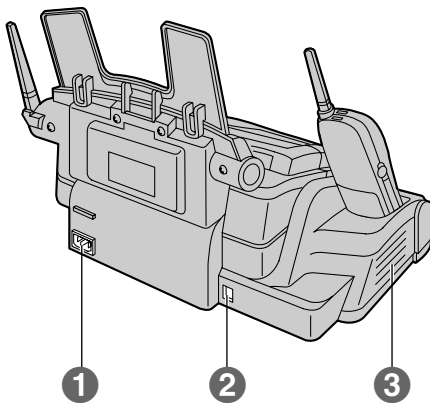

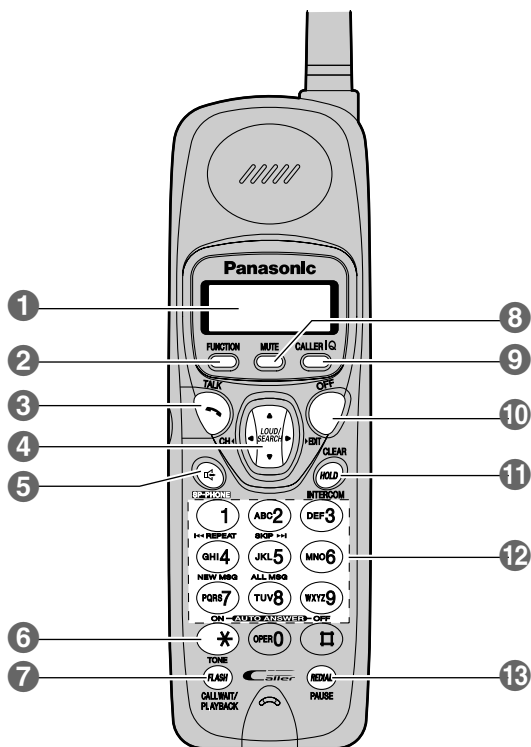

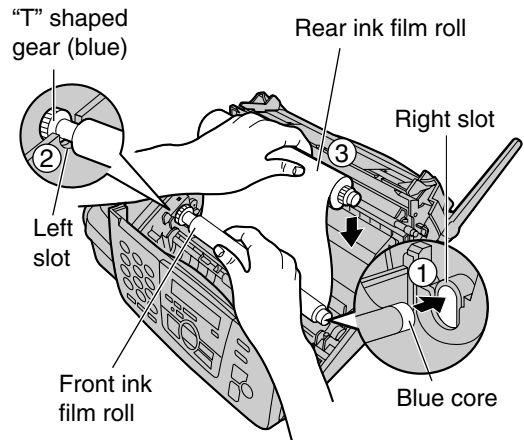
- 2** Release the back cover by pushing the back cover open button (green) on the right side of the unit.

- 3** Open the back cover.

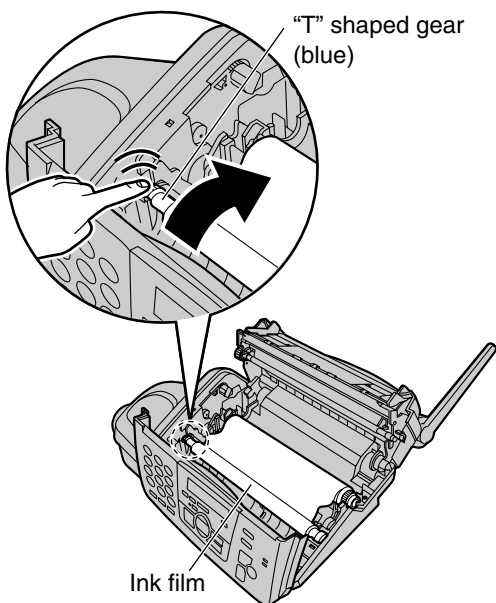


- 4** Insert the blue core of the front ink film roll into the right slot of the unit (①). Insert the "T" shaped gear (blue) into the left slot of the unit (②).
Insert the rear ink film roll (③).
● The ink film is safe to touch, and will not rub off on your hands like carbon paper.



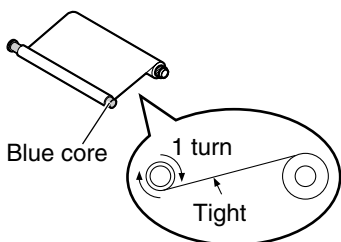

- 6** Close the back cover securely by pushing down on the dotted area at both ends (①). Close the front cover securely (②).
- When the power cord is connected, the following message will be displayed while the unit is checking that there is no slack in the ink film.

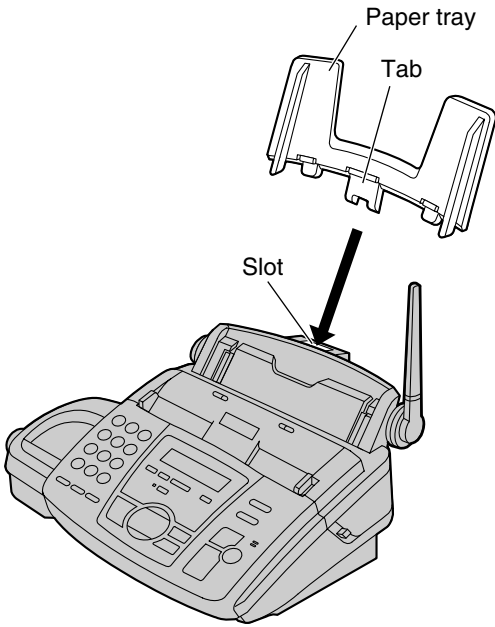

Setting (Base Unit)

Paper tray

The included paper tray is for letter size recording paper.
Insert the tab on the paper tray into the slot on the back of the unit.



Note:

- Do not place the unit in an area where the paper tray may be obstructed (i.e. by a wall etc.).

To use legal size paper

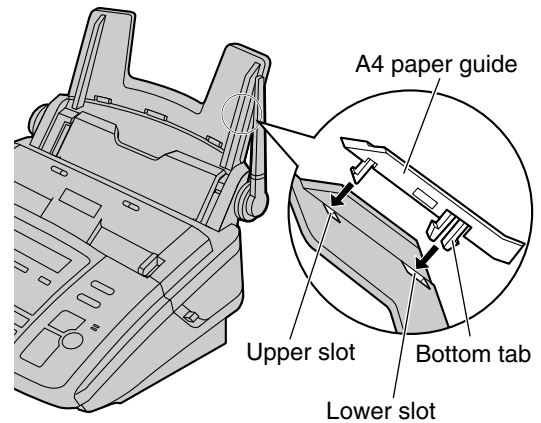

To use A4 size paper

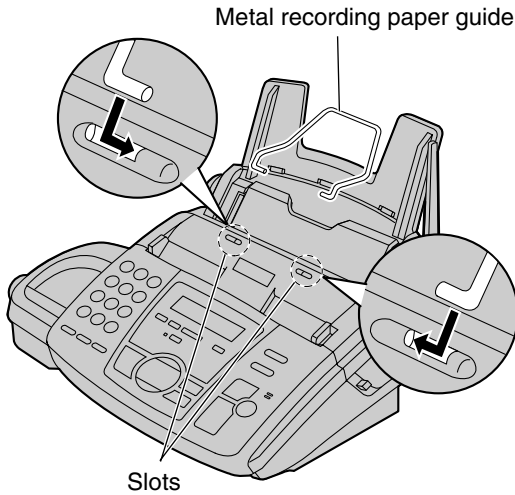
You need to install the A4 paper guide to the right side of the paper tray.

- Change the recording paper size (feature #16, page 88).
1. Insert the bottom tab on the A4 paper guide into the lower slot.
 2. Press the guide into the upper slot.

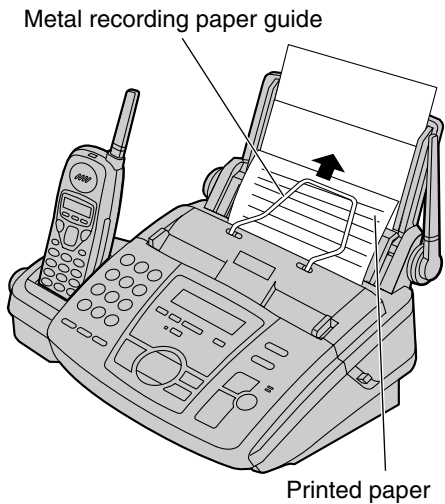


Metal recording paper guide

Attach the metal recording paper guide into the slots on the recording paper exit.



- The recording paper will be ejected from the top of the unit after printing. The metal recording paper guide prevents the printed paper from curling.

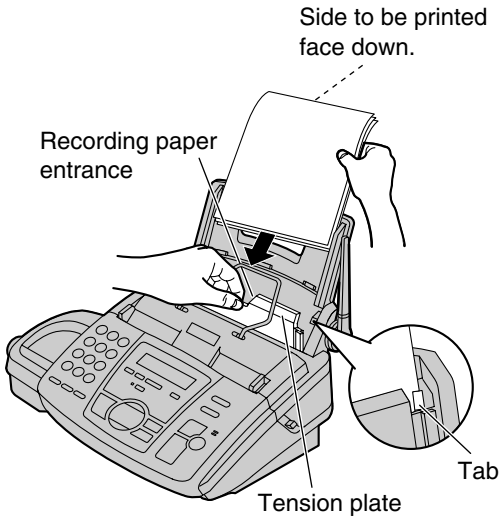
Recording paper

Letter, legal or A4 size recording paper can be loaded. The unit can hold up to 50 sheets of 75 g/m² (20 lb.) paper. You may use 60 g/m² to 90 g/m² (16 lb. to 24 lb.) paper. See the note for paper specifications (page 120). **For superior results, we recommend Hammermill® Jet Print paper.** If you use legal size paper, please install a legal paper tray (page 16).

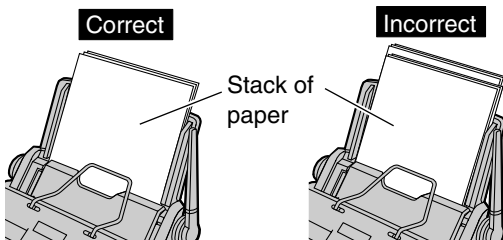
- 1 Fan the stack of paper to prevent a paper jam.



- 2 Pull the tension plate forward and hold open while inserting the paper.

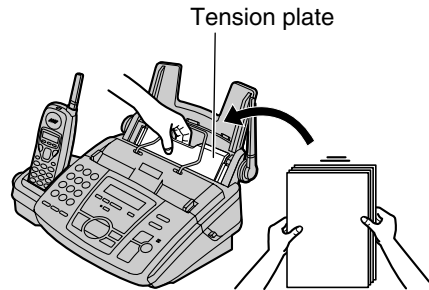


- The paper should not be over the tab.
- If the paper is not inserted correctly, readjust the paper, or the paper may jam.



To add paper

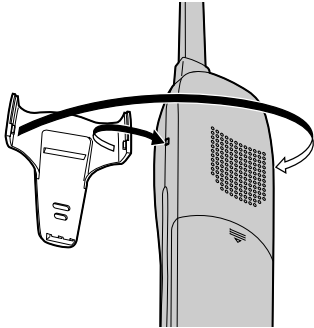
1. Pull the tension plate forward and hold open while removing all of the installed paper.
2. Add paper to the stack of paper you removed and straighten.
3. Fan the stack of paper.
4. Pull the tension plate forward and hold open while inserting the paper.

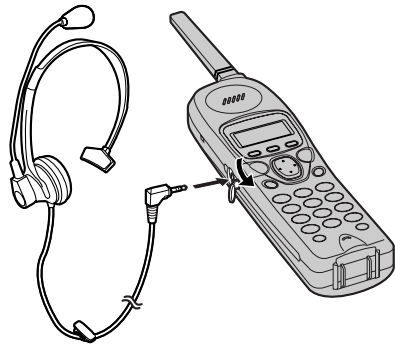

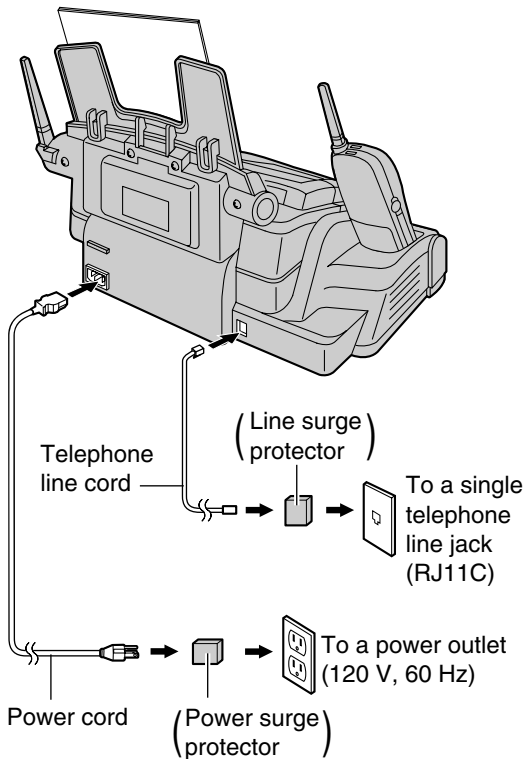

To use surge protectors

The following types are available: TELESPIKE BLOK MODEL TSB (TRIPPE MFG. CO.), SPIKE BLOK MODEL SK6-0 (TRIPPE MFG. CO.), SUPER MAX (PANAMAX) or MP1 (ITW LINX).

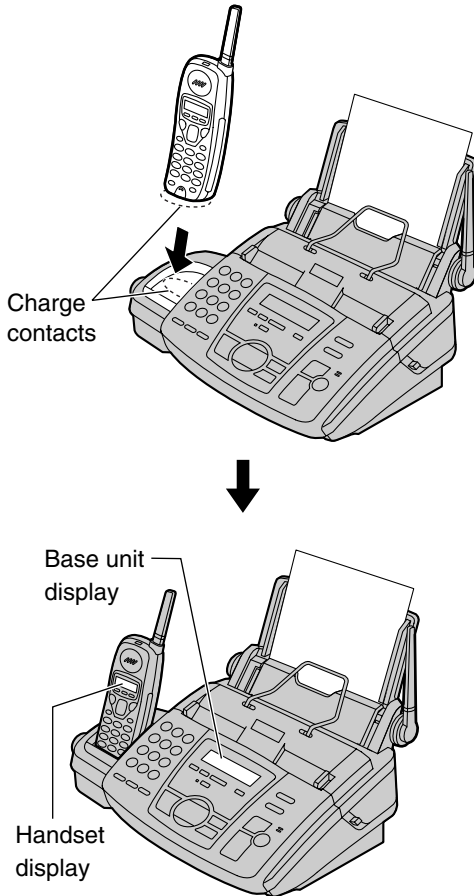

Battery charge



Place the handset on the cradle of the base unit for about **15 hours** before initial use.

- A beep will sound, and the following will be displayed for an instant on the base unit.

Base unit display: CHARGING

The display will show the date and time.

- If the base unit is in use, a beep may not sound and the message may not be shown.

Note:

- Clean the handset and the base unit charge contacts with a dry cloth once a month, or the battery may not charge properly.
- The battery cannot be overcharged.

Battery strength

You can check the battery strength on the handset display.

Battery life

If your Panasonic battery is fully charged;

- the battery life will last up to 5 hours while in use (in conversation).
- it will last for up to about 11 days while not in use (off the base unit).
- Battery life may vary depending on usage conditions and ambient temperature.

Recharge

Recharge the battery when:

- the handset beeps intermittently while it is in use, or
- the following is shown and “[■■]” flashes on the handset display.

- Recharge the handset battery for more than 15 minutes, or the display will continue showing the indication.

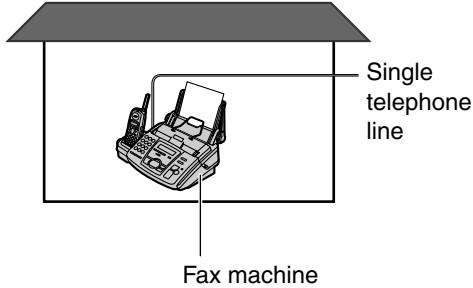

Distinctive Ring

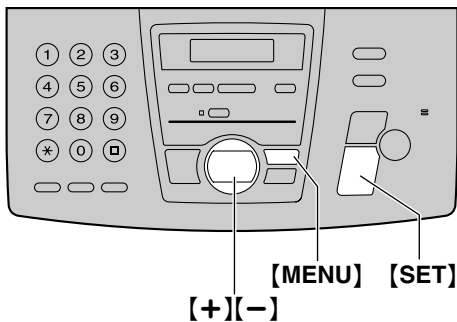
Using two or more phone numbers in a single telephone line

The Distinctive Ring service is a service offered by your local telephone company. This service provides several telephone numbers for a single telephone line, and the ring pattern differs according to which telephone number the call was addressed to. Originally, this service was designed for the purpose of allowing different ring patterns to distinguish which number the call was addressed to.

This unit distinguishes the different ring patterns. If the ring pattern is one which is assigned for a fax, the fax machine will automatically start fax reception. This service is convenient if you wish to have a different number for fax in a single telephone line.

To use this service, you must subscribe to the Distinctive Ring service offered by your local telephone company.

Activating the Distinctive Ring feature

Quick scan feature

If the document exceeds the memory capacity, copying of the exceeded document will be canceled and this feature will be turned off automatically.

- The memory is full of received documents due to a lack of recording paper or a recording paper jam. Install paper (page 18) or clear the jammed paper (page 103).
- When performing memory transmission, the document being stored exceeds the memory capacity of the unit. Transmit the entire document manually.

MEMORY FULL

- When making a copy, the document being stored exceeds the memory capacity of the unit. Press **[STOP]** to clear the message. Divide the document into sections.

MESSAGE FULL

- There is no room left in memory to record a voice message. Erase unnecessary messages (page 75, 76, 81).

MODEM ERROR

- There is something wrong with the modem circuit. Contact our service personnel.

NO FAX REPLY

- The other party's fax machine is busy or has run out of recording paper. Try again.

PAPER JAMMED

- A recording paper jam occurred. Clear the jammed paper (page 103).

PLEASE WAIT

- The unit is checking that there is no slack on the ink film. Wait for a moment while the check is completed.

REDIAL TIME OUT

- The other party's fax machine is busy or has run out of recording paper. Try again.

REMOVE DOCUMENT

- The document is jammed. Remove the jammed document (page 106).

TRANSMIT ERROR

- A transmission error occurred. Try again.

UNIT OVERHEATED

- The unit is too hot. Let the unit cool down.

Handset

Directory full

- There is no space to store new entries in the navigator directory. Erase unnecessary entries (page 45).

No link to base Place on cradle and try again.

- The handset has lost communication with the base unit. Move closer and try again.
- Place the handset on the base unit and try again.
- The power cord is disconnected. Plug in the power cord.

Not available

- [**▶**], [**▲**], [**▼**], [**FLASH**], [**CALL WAIT/PLAYBACK**], [**CLEAR**], [**HOLD**] or [**INTERCOM**] was pressed while the base unit was in use.

Please lift up and try again.

- A key was pressed while the handset was on the base unit. Lift the handset and press the button again.

Save error

- While programming, the handset has lost communication with the base unit. Move closer to the base unit.

Frequently Asked Questions

When a function does not work, check here

General

I cannot make and receive calls.

- The power cord or telephone line cord is not connected. Check the connections.
- If you used a splitter to connect the unit, remove the splitter and connect the unit to the wall jack directly. If the unit operates properly, check the splitter.

I cannot make calls.

- The dialing mode setting is wrong. Change the setting of feature #13 (page 88).

The unit does not work.

- Disconnect the unit from the telephone line and connect the line to a known working telephone. If the working telephone operates properly, contact our service personnel to have the unit repaired. If the working telephone does not operate properly, contact your telephone company.

The unit does not ring.

- The ringer volume is set to off. Adjust it (page 29, 30).
- The ring setting of feature #06 is set to "RINGER OFF". Change to another ring setting (page 88).

The unit displays the following though the paper is inserted.

CHECK PAPER

- The paper is inserted halfway. Insert it correctly (page 18) and press **[SET]** to clear the message.

The other party complains they only hear a fax tone and cannot talk.

- FAX ONLY mode is set. Tell the other party the number is only used for faxes.
- Change to TEL mode or TAD/FAX mode by pressing **[AUTO ANSWER]**.
- If you use a Distinctive Ring service, turn AUTO ANSWER off so that the fax machine is in TEL mode.

- If you use a Distinctive Ring service, make sure you have set the same ring pattern assigned by the telephone company (page 66).

The receiving mode does not function properly.

- Distinctive Ring feature #31 is set (page 89).

The **[REDIAL/PAUSE]** button does not function properly.

- If this button is pressed during dialing, a pause will be inserted. If pressed immediately after a dial tone is obtained, the last number dialed will be redialed.

During programming, I cannot enter the code or ID number.

- All or part of the numbers are the same. Change the number: feature #11 (page 88), #41 (page 90), #51 and #52 (page 91).

The ink film runs out quickly.

- The help printing function, copy function, and reports also use ink film.

The unit beeps.

- Recording paper or ink film has run out. Press **[STOP]** to stop the beeps and install paper/ink film.

Whenever I try to retrieve my Voice Mail messages, the retrieval is interrupted by the fax tone.

- You are probably entering ✕#9. This is the default setting for the fax activation code. If you use a Voice Mail service, set the fax activation feature to off or reprogram the activation code (feature #41, page 90).

The speakerphone is not working.

- Use the speakerphone in a quiet room.
