


Battery Charge

Calls are transmitted between the base unit and the handset using wireless radio waves. For maximum distance and noise free operation, the recommended base unit placement is







Handset



Base unit



Display

The handset gives you instructions and information on the display. These are the display prompts on pages 8, 9.

In the battery saver mode, the display is blank until you use the handset (p-11)





Battery Charge

Place the handset on the base unit for 10 hours

—The IN USE/CHARGE indicator lights



Battery saver mode

The handset goes into battery saver mode 5 minutes after you finished using the handset (ex. such as making a call, viewing the caller list, etc.)

In this mode, the display is blank, but the handset receives calls To exit the battery saver mode, use the handset again. The display automatically 'wakes up' from 'sleeping'

To check the battery strength

You can check the present battery strength while the handset is in the battery saver or stand-by mode

Press (F1) (BATT key)

—If the display is blank, press one of the function keys to turn the display on

The display shows the present battery strength as shown in the chart below

Recharge

When the BATT LOW indicator flashes or beeps intermittently, recharge the battery



Standard battery life

If your Panasonic battery is fully charged,


While in use (TALK)	Up to about 8 hours			
While not in use (Stand-By)	Up to about 14 days			

- Battery life may vary depending on usage conditions and ambient temperature
- —Clean the charge contacts with a soft cloth once a month, or the battery may not charge properly
- —Once the battery is fully charged, you do not have to place the handset on the base unit until the BATT LOW indicator flashes
- -The battery cannot be overcharged


Wall Mounting

This unit can be mounted on a wall phone plate

- Reverse the handset hook in the cradle so the tab holds the handset
 - (1) Push to remove
 - ② Rotate 180°
 - ③ Replace it with the tab facing upwards




- Connect the AC adaptor Tuck the telephone line cord inside the wall mounting adaptor, then push it in the direction of the arrow
 - -- The word "UP" should face upward




To Power Outlet

- Connect the telephone line cord Mount the unit, then slide down
 - -Extend the antenna fully



- To charge the battery: Place the handset on the handset hook as shown




Preparation for Handset

Setting the LCD Contrast

You can select the LCD contrast among 3 levels (DARK, NORMAL and LIGHT) NORMAL is the factory setting

- 1 Press PROGRAM
- Press F3 (NEXT key)
- 3 Press F1 (YES key)
 - The current setting flashes on the display
- Select the desired level by pressing one of the function keys
 To select DARK, press F1 (DARK key)
 To select NORMAL, press F2 (NORM key)
 To select LIGHT, press F3 (LIGHT key)
 - The selected setting flashes on the display
 - —After a few seconds, the handset returns to the stand-by mode


—To cancel the programming halfway, press (PROGRAM) Then restart from step 1

Setting the AUTO TALK Feature to ON

If you set the AUTO TALK feature to ON, you can answer a call by lifting the handset on the base unit without pressing **TALK** If you want to use this feature, program as follows OFF is the factory setting

- Press PROGRAM
- Press (F3) (NEXT key) twice until "TALK SWITCHING?" is displayed
- Press F1 (CHNG key)






Press **CH** to select a clear channel or move closer to the base unit —The selected channel number is displayed






To select the ringer volume

You can select the ringer volume among 3 levels (HIGH, LOW, and OFF) while the handset is in the battery saver or stand-by mode. HIGH is the factory setting.

- Press VOLUME/RINGER
 - —The current setting flashes on the display
- Select the desired level by pressing one of the function keys
 To select HIGH, press F1 (HIGH key)
 To select LOW, press F2 (LOW key)
 To select OFF, press F3 (OFF key), then
 F1 (YES key)
 - —The selected setting flashes on the display
 - —If you select ringer OFF, the display shows "RINGER OFF" before the handset goes into the battery saver mode



Special Features



Handset Locator

You can locate the handset or page a person at the handset with beep tones

Press (HANDSET LOCATOR)

- —The handset beeps for 1 minute
- -The IN USE/CHARGE indicator flashes

To stop paging, press (HANDSET LOCATOR) again or press (TALK) on the handset twice

For Call Waiting Service Users

If you hear a call-waiting tone during a call, press CALL WAIT.

- -The first call is put on hold and you can answer the second call.
- —To return to the first caller, press (CALL WAIT) again.

Temporary Tone Dialing (For Rotary Service Users)

Press **TONE** before dialing.

—The dialing mode changes to tone. You can enter numbers to access answering systems, electronic banking services, etc. When you hang up, the mode returns to pulse.

If Your Unit is Connected to a PBX

We recommend you press **REDIAL/PAUSE** between the access number for an outside line and the phone number.

—Pressing (REDIAL/PAUSE) once makes a 3.5-second pause. This prevents misdialing when you redial or dial a stored number.

Automatic Security Code Setting

Whenever you place the handset on the base unit, the unit automatically selects one of 65,000 security codes. These codes help avoid unauthorized use of your telephone line by another cordless telephone.


Caller ID Service

This unit is compatible with the Caller ID service offered by your local telephone company.

Once you subscribe to the Caller ID service, the information of the party calling you will be displayed after the first ring. You can decide whether to answer it or not after confirming who is calling you.

The unit records information from up to 30 callers, including time and date when these were received, in the Caller List. The Caller List information is sorted from the latest to the oldest call received and when memory is full the unit will automatically erase the oldest call so that the next call is recorded.

Using the list, you can quickly respond to your caller without checking their phone number. Also, you can store the caller's name and number from the Caller List to the directory, to save time dialing or even checking the number in the future.



How caller information is displayed when a call is received

When a call is received, the display shows the caller's name and number after the first ring.

- —When the unit is connected to a PBX system, you may not receive caller information. Please consult your equipment supplier.
- —In some calling areas, the name display service is not executed. For further information, please contact your local telephone company.
- —The Caller ID service is currently provided in calling areas by caller identification technology. In some cases, caller information cannot be delivered. In this case, the display will show as follows.



Using the Caller List

Viewing the Caller List

If new calls are received, the CALLER ID indicator flashes slowly on the base unit and the number of new calls with "NEW CALLS" are displayed on the handset. When you get home, confirm the CALLER ID indicator on the base unit or press one of the function keys to check the handset display. You can confirm who has called you as follows.

- Press SEARCH (v or ^) once to enter the list
 - —The newest caller information is displayed
- Press SEARCH (v or ^) to move up and down between callers
 Press F3 to move between name, number and time date information
- To exit the list, press (F3) (EXIT key) or wait 10 seconds
 - —The handset returns to the stand-by mode




Notes:

- —When you answer a call, the caller information is listed, but is not considered NEW
- —Once NEW calls have been checked, they are no longer NEW. The next calls will be listed as NEW.
- —If more than one call is received from the same caller, the date and time of the last call will be stored
- During a power failure the unit will retain the recorded calls for approximately 1 day



Ex. When you have received a new call:



You have finished scrolling down the Caller List once. If you press \land , the display returns to the newest caller information.

To exit the Caller List, press **F3** (EXIT key) or wait 10 seconds. —The handset returns to the stand-by mode.

Definition of the special marks


- •: You have viewed the caller more than once.
- /: It means the caller you called back.
- $\times 2 \times 9$: The unit counts the number of called times (up to 9).

Using the Caller List

Calling Back from the Caller List

- Press SEARCH (v or A) once to enter the list
- Press SEARCH (v or A) repeatedly to search for the desired caller
- Press F1 (DIAL key)

 —The unit obtains a dial tone and automatically dials the displayed phone number



Note

—Sometimes you must edit a number before it can be dialed (for example, you may have to add "1" to dial long distance) Changes are not saved in the Caller List (p. 27)




Editing the Caller's Phone Number

The unit edits a phone number into one of 4 patterns by pressing (E2) (EDIT key)

- Press SEARCH (∨ or ∧) once to enter the list
- Press SEARCH (v or A) repeatedly to search for the desired caller
- Press F3 (NO key) to display the caller's phone number
- Press F2 (EDIT key) to select an edit pattern
 Each time you press F2 (EDIT key), the phone number is rearranged into a different edit pattern. There are 4 patterns to choose from
 - —The underlined part of the area code will flash. You can change the area code by pressing the correct number using the dialing buttons.
- Once the edit procedure is completed, continue with storing or call back procedure steps

 To call back, press F1 (DIAL key) (p 26)

 To store information in the directory, press PROGRAM, then follow the instructions on the display (p 28)



Storing the Caller List Information in the **Directory**

You can store the caller's name and number from the Caller List to the directory.

- Press (SEARCH) (v or A) once to enter the list
- Press (SEARCH) (v or A) repeatedly to search for the caller you want to store in the directory.
 - -If the phone number requires editing, make the required changes (p. 27).




- Press (PROGRAM).
- Press (F1) (YES key). -Programming is complete and the display shows "SAVED OK".



If the caller information you want to store does not have name information, just follow the instructions on the display.

- a) If you do not enter a name, press (F3) (NO key).
- b) If you enter a name, press F1 (YES key). Then enter the name (p. 34). -When finished, press (F3) (SAVE key).



Notes:

- —If the display shows "MEMORY IS FULL" in step 3, press [F1] (CLEAR key) to erase other stored items from the directory (p. 39).
- -If the display shows "SAVE ERROR", move closer to the base unit and try again. If "SAVE ERROR" still remains, place the handset on the base unit. Then reprogram from step 1.




Erasing the Caller List Information

After you check the Caller List information, you can erase some or all of them.


To erase a specific Caller List information

- Press SEARCH (∨ or ∧) once to enter the Caller List.
- Press SEARCH (v or ^) repeatedly to search for the desired caller.
- **?** Press **F2** (CLEAR key).
- Press F1 (YES key).
 - —The information is erased and the display shows "CLEAR".
 - After a few seconds, the display shows the previous caller information.



To erase all of the Caller List information

- Press SEARCH (v or ^) once to enter the Caller List.
- Press F2 (CLEAR key).
- Press F3 (ALL key).
- Press F1 (YES key).
 - —All of the information is erased and the display shows "ALL CLEAR".
 - —After a few seconds, the handset returns to the stand-by mode.



Storing the Area Code


You can store your area code so that incoming local calls are recorded in the Caller List without it. You do not have to remove the area code before storing or call back procedure steps. To program this feature, follow the steps below

- Press (PROGRAM)
- Press F3 (NEXT key) three times until "SAVE AREA CODE?" is displayed
- Press F1 (YES key)

 —To cancel, press F3 (EXIT key)
- Enter your area code

 —If you enter a wrong number, press

 [F1] (CANCEL key), then enter the
- When finished, press (F3) (SAVE key)
 - —The number is saved and the display shows "SAVED OK"



To erase the saved area code

- 1 Press PROGRAM
- Press F3 (NEXT key) three times until "SAVE AREA CODE?" is displayed



Using the Directory

You can store up to 30 names and phone numbers in the directory. All directory items are sorted by the first word in alphabetical order. You can enter a first or last name. Using the directory, you can make a call by selecting a name on the display. If you don't enter a name, the item is sorted by number.

Storing Names and Numbers in the Directory


You can store a name and number while the handset is in the battery saver or stand-by mode






- Press F1 (STORE key)
 - —The display shows the number of stored items in the directory

 - See the Steps for entering names and symbols (p 34)
- When finished, press F3 (NO key)
- Enter a phone number up to 16 digits
 - —If you enter a wrong number, press F1 (CANCEL key), then enter the correct number
 - You can enter a hyphen by pressingF2 A hyphen counts as one digit
- When finished, press F3 (SAVE key)
 - —The item is saved and the display shows "SAVED OK"

- —To cancel the programming halfway, press PROGRAM Then restart from step 1
- —If the display shows "MEMORY IS FULL" in step 2, press F1 (CLEAR key) to erase other stored items from the directory (p 39)
- —If you want to store only a phone number, skip over step 3, then continue with step 4
- —If the display shows "SAVE ERROR", move closer to the base unit and try again If "SAVE ERROR" still remains, place the handset on the base unit. Then reprogram from step 1
- During a power failure the unit will retain the information for approximately 1 day
