


## **Battery Charge**

Calls are transmitted between the base unit and the handset using wireless radio waves. For maximum distance and noise free operation, the recommended base unit location is:






## **Base Unit Battery Installation**


Install the included 9V (6F22) size battery in the base unit.

The new battery in the base unit provides approximately 1 day of retention time for recorded messages and clock (p. 17) during a power failure.


Open the cover by pushing the tab and raising it.




Install the battery in the battery compartment.



When finished, close the cover.





- USE ONLY Panasonic AC ADAPTOR KX-A11.
- The AC adaptor must remain connected at all times. (It may feel warm during use. This is normal.)


## **Battery Charge**


- Battery life may vary depending on usage conditions and ambient temperature
- Clean the charge contacts with a soft cloth once a month, or the battery may not charge properly
- Once the battery is fully charged, you do not have to place the handset on the base unit until the BATT LOW/PROG indicator flashes
- The battery cannot be overcharged



## **Pre-Recorded Common Greeting Message**

Two pre-recorded greeting messages are prepared in common memory. If you do not record a greeting message for yourself (p. 14), one of two messages will be played when a call is received. Which message will be played depends on the caller's recording time (p. 18).

#### To check the pre-recorded greeting message




- When the recording time is set to "1 minute" or "up to 18 minutes"; "Hello, we are not available now. Please leave your name and phone number after the beep. We will return your call."
- When the recording time is set to "greeting only"; "Hello, we are not available now. Please call again. Thank you for your call."



## Recording Common Greeting Message

You can prepare a personal greeting message for the common memory.

All messages (greeting, incoming, memo, etc.) are stored in the digital memory. **Total recording time is about 23 minutes.** We recommend you record a brief greeting message leaving more time in memory.




#### Samples of greeting message

- ☐ When the recording time is set to "1 minute" or "up to 18 minutes" (p. 18): "Hello, this is (your name and/or number). Sorry, I cannot take your call. Please leave a message after the long beep. Thank you."
- □ When the recording time is set to "greeting only" (p. 18):
   "Hello, this is (your name and/or number). Sorry, I cannot take your call.
   If you call back tomorrow, I'll be happy to talk to you. Thank you."
- □ When you use the mailbox feature (p. 31): "Hello, if you would like to leave a message for John, press # and 1. For Alice, press # and 2. For Nancy, press # and 3. For Tom, press # and 4. Please leave a message after the long beep. Thank you."



Press **GREETING RECORD** to start the recording mode.


 "Press RECORD again to record greeting" is heard.



Within 5 seconds, press


[GREETING RECORD] again to record greeting.

A long beep sounds.



After the long beep, speak clearly 20 cm (8") away from MIC (microphone).

 The display shows the elapsed recording time.



When finished, press **STOP**.

• To change the greeting message, repeat from step 1.

#### To check the greeting message

Press GREETING CHECK).

• The recorded greeting is played.

#### To erase the recorded greeting message

- 1. Press GREETING CHECK.
- Press ERASE while the message is being played.
  - The unit will answer a call with the pre-recorded greeting (p. 13) hereafter.

## Programmable Preparations

#### Summary of programming procedures

You can program the following functions by using the handset near the base unit.

See the bracketed pages for detailed procedures.

#### Be sure that the TALK and/or SP-PHONE indicator light is off.

Lift the handset, then press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).

Press (SCREEN/PLAYBACK).

 If alarm tone sounds, move toward the base unit, then try again.

When finished, press PROGRAM/2WAY REC.

The confirmation tone sounds.\*

(page 42)

- To cancel the programming halfway, press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC), then restart from the beginning.
- If 6 beeps sound while programming, it means you pressed an invalid key.
   Enter the correct number again.

#### \*What the confirmation tone means

- 1 beep: The programmed number is newly stored.
- 2 beeps: The number is the same as a previously stored one.
- 6 beeps: The number is not correct. Try again from the beginning.




## Time and Day Adjustment

Voice Time/Day Stamp: During playback a synthesized voice will announce the time and day when each message is recorded.

- Press PROGRAM/2WAY REC.
  - The BATT LOW/PROG indicator lights.
- Press SCREEN/PLAYBACK).
  - The indicator lights.
  - "P" is displayed on the base unit to show the unit is in programming mode.
- **Q** Press 0.
  - "①" is displayed and the current time/day is heard.
- Enter the current time (hour and minute) by using a 4-digit number. (Ex.: To set "9:30", enter "0930".)
  - The entered number is displayed.
- Press \* to select "AM" or "PM".

  Press # repeatedly to set the day.
- When finished, press
  PROGRAM/2WAY REC).
  - The unit announces the time/day.
     The clock starts working.
- In step 4, you cannot enter the numbers greater than 12.
   (To set "13:00", enter "0100" and select "PM" by pressing ★.)
- To check the time/day, follow steps 1 to 3. The current time/day is heard. When finished, press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).
- ullet The accuracy of the clock is approximately  $\pm 45$  seconds a month at room temperature.





## Selecting the Caller's Recording Time

You may select the caller's recording time of "1 minute", "up to 18 minutes" or "greeting only". The factory preset is "up to 18 minutes".

#### Press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).

The BATT LOW/PROG indicator lights.


## **9** Press SCREEN/PLAYBACK).

- The indicator lights.
- "P" is displayed on the base unit.

## Press 5.

- · The current setting is displayed.
  - 1: 1 minute
  - 2: up to 18 minutes
  - 3: greeting only
- Press 1, 2 or 3 to select the recording time.
  - The setting is displayed.
- When finished, press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).

• The indicator lights go out.




- If you select "greeting only", the unit answers a call with the greeting message, then hangs up. The unit will not record any caller's message.
- "Greeting only" works only for common memory. Callers can leave messages in mailboxes even though you have set "greeting only".



## **Selecting the Number of Rings**

You can select the number of rings before your answering system answers a call, "1" to "7" or "AUTO (for Toll Saver)". The factory preset is "AUTO".

- Press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).
  - The BATT LOW/PROG indicator lights.
- Press SCREEN/PLAYBACK).
  - The indicator lights.
  - "P" is displayed on the base unit.
- Press 2.
  - The current setting is displayed.
- Press a dialing button (1) to (7) to set the number of rings.
  - **0**: Selects "AUTO". "A" is displayed.
  - 1-7: The unit will answer on the selected number of rings.
- When finished, press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).
  - The indicator lights go out.



#### Toll Saver (When set to "AUTO")

When you call the unit from a touch tone telephone:

If the unit answers on the 2nd ring; there is at least one new message. If the unit answers on the 4th ring; there are no new messages.

Hang up soon when you hear the 3rd ring. This saves you the toll charge for the call.

"Toll Saver" does not work for mailboxes.



## Setting the CPC (Calling Party Control) Function

The CPC function is preset to "A". If you use a call waiting service, set to "b", or the call waiting tone will disconnect someone leaving a message.

- 1. Press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).
- 2. Press SCREEN/PLAYBACK.
- 3. Press (3).
  - The current setting "A" or "b" is displayed on the base unit.
- 4. To select "b", press 2.

OR

To select "A", press [1].

- The setting is displayed.
- 5. When finished, press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).

## Setting the Greeting Monitor Function

When your greeting message is being played to the caller, you can also listen to it through the speaker. To listen, set to "2 (ON)". The factory preset is "1 (OFF)".

- 1. Press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).
- 2. Press SCREEN/PLAYBACK).
- 3. Press 4.
  - The current setting "1" or "2" is displayed on the base unit.
- 4. To set to "2 (ON)", press 2.

OR

To set to "1 (OFF)", press 1.


- The setting is displayed.
- 5. When finished, press PROGRAM/2WAY REC).

## Wall Mounting

This unit can be mounted on a wall phone plate.


Be sure to reverse the handset hook in the cradle so the tab holds the handset.

- 3 Replace it with the tab upward.



## Making Calls

- Press TALK.
  - The indicator lights.
- Dial a telephone number.
  - If you misdial, press FLASH firmly then dial again.
- To hang up, press TALK or place the handset on the base unit.
  - The indicator light goes out.



 If alarm tone sounds on step 1, move toward the base unit or place the handset on the base unit. Then try again.

#### To redial the last number

Press (TALK) ⇒ (REDIAL/PAUSE).

#### To select the receiver volume HIGH or NORMAL (preset)

Press **VOLUME/RINGER** while speaking.

· Each time you press, the volume level will change.

#### If noise interferes with the conversation

Press (CH) to select a clear channel or move closer to the base unit.

## **Answering Calls**



#### With the Handset


If the handset is off the base unit, press (TALK).

 You can also answer a call by pressing a dialing button 0 to 9, or \*



#### OR

If on the base unit, just lift it.




#### Adjusting the ringer volume

Be sure the TALK and/or INTERCOM indicator light is off.

- To select HIGH (preset) or LOW, press (VOLUME/RINGER). (Each time you press, the ringer volume will change.)
- To turn the ringer OFF, while pressing VOLUME/RINGER, press (1) until 2 beeps sound.
- To turn the ringer ON, press VOLUME/RINGER. The ringer sounds at the HIGH level.





• While using the speakerphone, if the handset is on the base unit, you may switch to it by lifting up.

#### Hands-Free Digital Speakerphone

Digital speakerphone provides a more natural sounding conversation. For best performance, please note the followings:

- · Use the speakerphone in a quiet room.
- · Speak alternately with the caller.
- If the caller complains that your voice is hard to hear, press  $\checkmark$  to decrease the speaker volume.

#### To adjust the speaker volume (8 levels)

To increase, press . To decrease, press .

#### To put a call on hold

Press (HOLD). The SP-PHONE indicator flashes.

If you put a call on hold for 6 minutes, warning ringing tone will sound.
 The call will be disconnected after total 10 minutes.

#### To release the hold


Press SP-PHONE or lift the handset off the base unit.

 If another phone is connected on the same line, you can also release hold by lifting its handset.

#### To select the ringer volume

Set the RINGER selector to HIGH, LOW, or OFF.

When set to OFF, the base unit will not ring.



#### Note:


The SP-PHONE button is designed only for answering calls.
 If you press it to make a call, a dial tone may not be heard. This is normal.

## Automatic Dialing

## Storing Phone Numbers in Memory

The dialing buttons (0 to 9) function as memory stations. The TALK indicator light must be off.

- Press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).
  - The BATT LOW/PROG indicator lights.
- 2 Enter a phone number up to 16 digits.
  - If you misdial, press
     (PROGRAM/2WAY REC) to end storing, then restart from step 1.
- Press AUTO.
- Press a memory station number (0 to 9).
  - Confirmation tone sounds. (See below.)
  - To store other numbers, repeat steps 1 through 4.



#### What the confirmation tone means

1 beep: The number is newly stored.

2 beeps: The number is the same as a previously stored one.

#### To erase a stored number

Press PROGRAM/2WAY REC → AUTO → the memory station number (for the phone number to be erased).

#### Memory sticker


You may use an included memory sticker as memorandum for automatic dialing. Write down the names or phone numbers, then attach it to the unit or at a convenient place.

## **Dialing a Stored Number**

Press TALK.

Press AUTO.


- Press the memory station number (0 to 9).
  - The stored number is dialed.



2-way intercom is available between the handset and the base unit.

#### Paging the base unit from the handset

- Handset:
  Press (INTERCOM), then speak.
- Base unit: When the other party's voice is heard, answer through MIC.
- Handset:
  To end the intercom, press (INTERCOM).




#### Paging the handset from the base unit (Handset Locator)

Using this feature, you can locate the handset if you misplace it.

Base unit:

Press (LOCATOR/INTERCOM).

- The handset beeps for 1 minute.
- To stop paging, press it again.
- Press (INTERCOM) to answer.
- Base unit: Speak into MIC.
- Handset:
  To end the intercom, press (INTERCOM).



#### **During the intercom:**

- · Intercom calls can only be ended with the handset.
- If the handset user has difficulty hearing the base unit user, press to decrease the speaker volume of the base unit.
- If two tones sound, it means a call is received. To answer, press **TALK** or **(SP-PHONE)**. The intercom is ended.

## Transferring a Call Using Intercom

The intercom can be used during a call. This feature enables you to transfer the call between the handset and the base unit.


## From the handset to the base unit

- Handset:
  During a call, press
  INTERCOM.
  - The call is put on hold.
- Base unit: When the paging party's voice is heard, answer through MIC.
- Base unit:
  To answer the call, press
  SP-PHONE.
  - The transfer is completed.
  - Handset user can join the conversation by pressing (TALK).

## From the base unit to the handset

- Base unit:
  During a call, press HOLD to put it on hold.
  - The SP-PHONE indicator flashes.
- Base unit:
  Press (LOCATOR/INTERCOM).
- Handset:
  Press INTERCOM to answer the page.
- Handset:
  To answer the call, press
  (TALK).
  - The transfer is completed.
  - Base unit user can join the conversation by pressing SP-PHONE.

## Special Features



### **Automatic Security Code Setting**

Whenever you place the handset on the base unit, the unit automatically selects one of 65,000 security codes. These codes help to avoid unauthorized use of your telephone line by another cordless telephone.

## For Call Waiting Service Users

Press **FLASH** lightly if you hear a call-waiting tone while speaking

- The first call is put on hold and you can answer the second call
- To return to the first caller, press (FLASH) again

## Temporary Tone Dialing (For Rotary Service Users)

Press **TONE** before dialing

 The dialing mode changes to tone You can enter numbers to access answering systems or electronic banking services, etc. When you hang up, the mode returns to pulse


#### If Your Unit is Connected to a PBX

We recommend you press **REDIAL/PAUSE** between the access number for an outside line and the phone number

 Pressing (REDIAL/PAUSE) once makes a 3 5-second pause. This prevents misdialing when you redial or dial a stored number.

Conscience Systems


The unit has 5 memory locations—common memory and 4 personal mailboxes. A caller can leave a message in a specified mailbox, and only the person who knows the password can retrieve it from the mailbox. This feature allows you to keep your messages confidential when you share the unit with other people.



Messages are recorded in common memory unless a specified mailbox is selected.

#### To use the mailbox feature

- 1. Record your common greeting message (p. 14).
- 2. Record a mailbox greeting message in each mailbox (p. 32).
- 3. Program each mailbox password (p. 34).
- In order to leave a message in a mailbox, each mailbox owner must inform their callers of their mailbox number in advance.






## Recording a Mailbox Greeting Message


You can record a personal greeting message for each mailbox. The message is played back to the caller who selected the mailbox.

We recommend you record a brief greeting message leaving more time for incoming messages.




#### Sample of a mailbox greeting

"Hello, this is John. Sorry, I cannot take your call. Please leave your message after the beep. Thank you."




Press a mailbox button (1, 2, 3, or 4).

• The mailbox number is displayed.




Press **GREETING RECORD** to start the recording mode. Within 5 seconds, press **GREETING RECORD** again to record greeting.

A long beep sounds.



After the long beep, speak clearly into **MIC** (microphone).

 The display shows the elapsed recording time.



When finished, press (STOP).

 To change the greeting message, repeat from step 1.

## To check your mailbox greeting

Press the desired mailbox button ⇒ GREETING CHECK).

#### To erase a mailbox greeting

Press the desired mailbox button ⇒ GREETING CHECK ⇒ ERASE (while the message is being played).




## Programming the Mailbox Password

Program your own password for your mailbox to prevent messages from being retrieved by other person. Choose any **2-digit number (00-99)**. The mailbox password must be different from the remote code (p. 45).

Once you have programmed the password, you cannot confirm it. If you forget the number, reprogram a new one.

- Make sure the TALK indicator light is off, then press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).
  - The BATT LOW/PROG indicator lights.
- Press SCREEN/PLAYBACK).
  - The indicator lights.
  - "P" is displayed on the base unit to show the unit is in programming mode.
- Press 6.
- Press # and your mailbox number (1, 2, 3, or 4).
  - "\_\_ \_" is displayed.
- 5 Enter a password by using a 2-digit number.
  - The entered number is displayed.
- When finished, press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).
  - The indicator lights go out.



#### To erase the password

Press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC) → SCREEN/PLAYBACK → 6 → # and the mailbox number → \* PROGRAM/2WAY REC.

# How Incoming Messages are Recorded in Each Mailbox

To allow callers to leave a message in your mailbox, inform them of your mailbox number in advance. Callers must use a touch tone phone.



A caller calls your unit.

Common greeting message is heard.

2



The caller presses #, then enters the desired mailbox number (1, 2, 3, or 4).

 The mailbox greeting is heard, followed by a long beep.

3



The caller's message is recorded in the mailbox.

 If the caller does not select a mailbox in step 2, the message will be recorded in common memory.

#### Retrieving messages from your mailbox

When there is a new message in the mailbox, the mailbox number flashes on the display. To retrieve the message, see pages 37-39.

## Automatic Answering Operation


When a call is received, the unit plays back your greeting message and records the caller's message.

- The total recording time (including the greeting messages) is about 23 minutes. If messages are recorded in noisy rooms, the time may be shortened by 1 to 7 minutes.
- · A maximum of 64 messages can be recorded.

## Setting the Unit to Answer Calls

Press **ANSWER ON** to turn on the answering system.

- The indicator lights.
- The unit will announce the remaining record time if the time is less than 5 minutes. If you hear "Memory full", new messages cannot be recorded. Erase some or all messages (p. 40).



- If you do not want the unit to answer calls, press (ANSWER ON) to turn off. The indicator light goes out.
- You can turn on the answering system by using a touch tone phone (p. 51).

#### Monitoring incoming calls

While a call is being recorded, you can monitor it through the speaker.

To answer the call, press (SP-PHONE) or (TALK). The unit stops recording.

To use this feature with the handset, see page 54.

# Listening to Messages




When new incoming messages have been recorded;

- The ANSWER ON indicator flashes while the answering system is on.
- The mailbox number which has new messages flashes on the display.

The unit will announce the remaining record time after playback if the time is less than 5 minutes. If you hear "Memory full", new messages cannot be recorded. Erase some or all messages (p. 40).

We recommend you erase unnecessary messages after each playback.



## Listening to New Messages Only

#### To listen to messages in common memory




Press **NEW MESSAGE** lightly.

 The unit announces the number of new messages and plays back them.

• If common memory has no new messages, but a mailbox does, the unit announces the mailbox number and its number of the messages.


#### To listen to messages in your mailbox



Press the desired mailbox button (1, 2, 3, or 4).

 The display shows the mailbox number and the total number of recorded messages in the mailbox.

Enter the mailbox password with the handset.

 This step is not necessary if you have not programmed a password.

Press (NEW MESSAGE) lightly.

 The unit announces the number of new messages and plays back them.

- In step 2, you can also enter a password on the base unit.
  - ① Press **VOLUME**) ( or ). "[[[]" is displayed.
  - ② Press (to increase the number) or (to decrease) until your password is displayed.

To <b>repeat</b> the message	Press (REPEAT) during playback. (If you press within 5 seconds of the playback, the previous message is played.)
To <b>skip</b> the message	Press <b>SKIP</b> during playback. The next message is played.
To <b>stop</b> the operation	Press (STOP).

# Listening to All the Recorded Messages

All of the recorded messages are saved until you erase them. To listen to the saved messages, follow the steps below.

#### To listen to messages in common memory

Press **NEW MESSAGE** firmly until the playback starts.


· The unit plays back all of the recorded messages.

## To listen to messages in your mailbox

- 1. Press the desired mailbox button (1, 2, 3, or 4).
  - The display shows the total number of messages in the mailbox.
- 2. Enter the mailbox password with the handset.
  - This step is not necessary if you have not programmed a password.
- 3. Press (NEW MESSAGE) firmly until the playback starts.
  - The unit plays back all of the recorded messages.
