After subscribing to Voice Mail Service, this phone's messagewaiting indicator will flash when there are messages in the mail box.




Base Unit Location

Battery Charge

Place the handset on the base unit and charge for about 15 hours before initial use.

The IN USE/CHARGE/HOLD indicator lights.

Battery strength

You can check the battery strength on the display while the handset is on the base unit, while it is in use (making/answering a call etc.), or after viewing the Caller List or directory items, programming etc.

The battery strength will remain on the display for a few seconds after using the handset, then the display will return to the standby mode (see next page).

The battery strength is as shown in the chart below.



Recharge

Battery information

After your Panasonic battery is fully charged (p 14)

Operation	Approx. battery life
While in use (TALK)	Up to about 6 hours
While not in use (Standby)	Up to about 14 days

- Battery life may be shortened depending on usage conditions, such as viewing the Caller ID Caller List or directory list, and ambient temperature
- Clean the handset and the base unit charge contacts with a soft, dry cloth once a month Clean more often if the unit is subject to grease, dust or high humidity Otherwise the battery may not charge properly
- •If the battery is fully charged, you do not have to place the handset on the base unit until "Recharge" is displayed and/or " (■]" flashes This will maximize the battery life
- The battery cannot be overcharged

Standby Mode (While the handset is off the base unit)

The handset goes into the standby mode after you finish using the handset (making/answering a call, viewing the Caller List or directory list etc.) The display is blank, but the handset can receive calls. The battery life is conserved in this mode.

Answering Calls

When a call is received, the unit rings, "Incoming call" is displayed The called line status indication on the display and the CALLER ID indicator on the base unit flash quickly. The line is automatically selected when you answer the call. (To change the line selection, see page 52.) If you subscribe to a Caller ID service, the calling party information will be displayed after the first ring (p. 27). In order to view the Caller ID information, please wait until the second ring to answer a call.

If the handset is off the base unit, Press

CALLER ID Indicator

When an optional headset is connected (p 57), make sure to use the headset to talk with the caller. If you want to have a normal cordless phone conversation, disconnect the headset

Caller ID Service



This unit is compatible with a Caller ID service offered by your telephone company. If you subscribe to a Caller ID service, the calling party's information will be displayed on the handset after the first ring.

The unit can record information of up to 50 different callers for both lines combined, including the time and date received, the number of times called and the called line, in the Caller List. The Caller List information is sorted by the most recent to the oldest call. When the 51st call is received, the first call is deleted.

Using the list, you can automatically call back a caller. You can store the callers' numbers from the Caller List into the directory




Caller ID Service

- Caller information cannot be displayed in the following cases
 - —If the caller dialed from an area which does not provide a Caller ID service, the display will show "Out of area"
 - —If the caller has requested not to display his/her information, the display will show "Private caller"
- If your unit is connected to a PBX which does not support Caller ID services, you cannot access those services
- The name display service may not be available in some areas. For further information, please contact your telephone company.

To check the number of new calls

When new calls have been received, the CALLER ID indicator flashes slowly on the base unit








Editing the Caller's Phone Number


The unit can edit a phone number into one of 4 patterns. Make sure the unit is in the standby mode.
