

Battery Charge

To power the handset, install the battery (p. 8) and charge it for about 15 hours before initial use (p. 13).


Place the handset on the base unit.

Be sure to set the Handset Rest on the cradle (p. 12) for proper charge when the optional headset is connected to the handset (p. 11).



Operating Distance/Noise

Calls are transmitted between the base unit and the handset using wireless radio waves. For maximum distance and noise free operation, the recommended base unit location is:



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
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
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


Installing the Battery in the Handset


Install the battery in the direction of the arrow on the battery. Then close the handset cover.

Close the cradle cover as shown.






Using the Handset Clip


You can hang the handset on your belt or pocket using the handset clip.



To install the handset clip


Lay the handset on a flat surface and **carefully** insert a flat-head screwdriver or similar object. Turn the driver **slowly** to remove the cover. Then insert the handset clip.





To remove the handset clip

Slide the handset clip with a flat-head screwdriver or similar object.




Using the Optional Headset

Plugging the optional headset into the handset provides hands-free phone conversation.

• The caller's voice is heard through the headset earpiece. When you talk, your voice is picked up by the headset microphone.

Please use only a panasonic KX-TCA80 headset.



Connecting the Optional Headset to the Handset


Connect the optional headset to the jack of the handset as shown.





Place the headset on your head and snap the clothing clip to a desired position.




• Place the microphone close to your mouth.



Setting the Handset Rest

Using the handset rest lets the optional headset to stay connected while the handset is on the base unit. This allows for proper charge.




• If the optional headset is installed, but the Handset Rest is not, the battery may not charge properly.


Battery Charge

Place the handset on the base unit for about 15 hours. (Set the Handset Rest on the cradle for proper charge when the optional headset is connected to the handset.)

• The IN USE/CHARGE indicator lights.

Recharge

When the TALK/BATT LOW/PROG indicator flashes slowly or beeps intermittently, recharge the handset battery.

If you do not want to wait until the battery is fully recharged, we recommend you purchase an optional spare battery (page 22).

Standard battery life


If your Panasonic battery is fully charged;

While in use (TALK)	Up to about 4 hours
While not in use (Stand-By)	Up to about 7 days

- Battery life may vary depending on usage conditions and ambient temperature.
- Clean the handset and the base unit charge contacts with a soft dry cloth once a month. Clean more often if the unit is subject to grease, dust or high humidity. If not, the battery may not charge properly.
- Once the battery is fully charged, you do not have to place the handset on the base unit until the TALK/BATT LOW/PROG indicator flashes slowly. This will maximize the battery life.
- The battery cannot be overcharged.

Making Calls

To have a hands-free conversation, connect the optional headset to the handset and wear it (p. 11, 12).



• If an alarm tone sounds in step 1, move closer to the base unit or place the handset on the base unit. Then try again.

If you misdial

To redial the last number

Press **TALK** \Rightarrow **REDIAL/PAUSE**.

Lighted keypad

The dialing buttons will light while you are dialing and will flash when a call comes in. The light will go out about 10 seconds after dialing or answering the call.

Make sure that the POWER/RINGER switch is set to ON, or the handset will not ring.


To have a hands-free conversation, connect the optional headset to the handset and wear it (p.11, 12).

If the handset is off the base unit, press **TALK**.



OR

If on the base unit, just lift it up.




If the optional headset is connected to the handset, be sure to wear the headset (p.12) in order to have a phone conversation. If you wish to have a normal cordless phone conversation, disconnect the headset.

Storing Phone Numbers in Memory

You can store up to 10 numbers in the handset. The dialing buttons (0 to 9) function as memory stations.

The TALK/BATT LOW/PROG indicator light must be off.

- Press (PROGRAM).
 - The TALK/BATT LOW/ PROG indicator flashes.
- 2 Enter a phone number up to 20 digits.
 - If you misdial, press (PROGRAM) to end storing, then restart from step 1.
- 3 Press AUTO.
- 4 Press a memory station number (0 to 9).
 - A confirmation tone sounds. (See below.)
 - To store other numbers, repeat steps 1 through 4.



What the confirmation tone means

- 1 beep: The new number is stored.
- 2 beeps: The number is the same as a previously stored one.

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Press **PROGRAM** \Rightarrow **AUTO** \Rightarrow the memory station number (for the phone number to be erased).

Memory Sticker

Use the included memory sticker as a name or phone number index for automatic dialing or one-touch dialing (p. 18). Attach the sticker to the unit or in a convenient place.



Dialing a Stored Number

Lift the handset and press **TALK**.

2 Press AUTO.


- **3** Press the memory station number (0 to 9).
 - The stored number is dialed.



A 20-digit phone number can be stored in each of the DIAL (A, B) buttons. The stored number is dialed with a one-touch operation.

Storing Phone Numbers in Memory

The TALK/BATT LOW/PROG indicator light must be off.



What the confirmation tone means

- 1 beep: The number is newly stored.
- 2 beeps: The number is the same as a previously stored one.

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Press **PROGRAM** \Rightarrow **A** or **B** (for the phone number to be erased).




Use the included memory sticker as a name or phone number index for one-touch dialing or automatic dialing (p. 16). Attach the sticker to the unit or in a convenient place.

Dialing a Stored Number

- Lift the handset and press **TALK**.
- 2 Press A or B.
 - The stored number is dialed.





Handset Locator

From the base unit you can locate the handset or page a person at the handset with beep tones.

- Press HANDSET LOCATOR.
 - The IN USE/CHARGE indicator flashes and the handset beeps.

2 To stop paging, press (HANDSET LOCATOR) again or press (TALK) twice on the handset.

Automatic Security Code Setting

Whenever you place the handset on the base unit, the unit automatically selects one of a million security codes. These codes help to avoid unauthorized use of your telephone line by another cordless telephone.

For Call Waiting Service Users

Press (FLASH) lightly if you hear a call-waiting tone while speaking.

- The first call is put on hold and you can answer the second call.
- To return to the first caller, press FLASH again.

Temporary Tone Dialing (For Rotary Service Users)

Press **TONE** before dialing.

• The dialing mode changes to tone. You can enter numbers to access answering systems, electronic banking services, etc. When you hang up, the mode returns to pulse.

If Your Unit is Connected to a PBX (Analog Only)

We recommend you press (**REDIAL/PAUSE**) between the access number for an outside line and the phone number.

 Pressing [REDIAL/PAUSE] once makes a 3.5 second pause. This prevents misdialing when you redial or dial a stored number.

Optional Spare Battery

When the handset battery needs charging, replace it with a fully charged optional spare battery. This eliminates having to wait for the handset battery to recharge. **Please purchase a Panasonic KX-A43 battery** and install it in the base unit to charge.

Installing the spare battery in the base unit

Open the cradle cover by pushing the tab and raising it. (If you have set the Handset Rest on the cradle, please remove it first.)

- 2 Install the spare battery in the direction of the arrow on the battery, then close the cradle cover. (Set the Handset Rest on the cradle.)
 - The SPARE CHARGE indicator lights.

The spare battery is always being charged in the base unit while the AC adaptor is connected. The battery cannot be overcharged.

Attention:

The product you have purchased is powered by a nickel cadmium battery which is recyclable. 



SPARE CHARGE Indicator

Replacing the handset battery with the spare battery


To prevent memory loss, replace within 5 minutes.

Set the POWER/RINGER switch to OFF to prevent memory loss. Remove the handset cover, then remove the battery.






- 2 Replace the handset battery with the spare battery in the base unit.
 - 1 Remove the spare battery.
 - ② Insert the handset battery in the base unit in the correct direction.



- 3 Install the spare battery in the handset in the correct direction.
 - When you finish, close the handset cover and set the POWER/RINGER switch to ON.



- If the TALK/BATT LOW/PROG indicator flashes slowly even when the handset battery has been fully charged, it is time to replace the battery with a new one. Remember to fully charge the new battery after battery replacement.
- Please use only a Panasonic KX-A43 battery. For accessory order, call 1-800-332-5368.

Before Requesting Help


Problem	Remedy
An alarm tone sounds when you press (TALK).	 You are too far from the base unit. Move closer and try again. Place the handset on the base unit and try again. Plug in the AC adaptor. Clean the charge contacts and charge again (p. 13).
An alarm tone sounds continuously while using the handset.	 Move closer to the base unit quickly, or the call will be terminated within 60 seconds. Make sure that the AC adaptor is connected.
The unit does not work.	 Check the settings (p. 8-13) Charge the battery fully (p. 13). The security codes in the handset and the base unit are not the same. Place the handset on the base unit. You cannot make a call if the handset is on the base unit. Be sure to lift up the handset to make a call. Unplug the AC adaptor and set the POWER/RINGER switch to OFF to reset. Reconnect the AC adaptor and set the switch to ON, then try again. Re-insert the handset battery within 5 minutes to avoid memory loss and try again.
Static, sound cuts in/out, fades. Interference from other electrical units.	 Set the handset and the base unit away from electrical appliances. Move closer to the base unit. Raise the base unit antenna.

Problem	Remedy
The handset does not operate or ring. You cannot have a conversation using the handset.	 The POWER/RINGER switch is set to OFF. Set to ON. When the optional headset is plugged into the handset, you must wear the headset (p.12) in order to have a phone conversation. To have a normal cordless phone conversation, disconnect the optional headset.
You cannot have a conversation using the optional headset.	 The POWER/RINGER switch is set to OFF. Set to ON. Make sure that the optional headset is plugged into the jack of the handset properly (p.11).
You cannot store a phone number in memory.	 You cannot store a number while the unit is in the talk mode. Do not pause for over 30 seconds while storing.
While storing a phone number, the unit starts to ring.	 To answer a call, press TALK. The program will be canceled. Store the number again.
(HANDSET LOCATOR) does not function.	 The handset is too far from the base unit or is engaged in an outside call.
The TALK/BATT LOW/PROG indicator flashes slowly or beeps intermittently.	 Charge the battery fully or replace with a fully charged optional spare battery (p. 13, 23).
You charged the battery fully, but the TALK/BATT LOW/ PROG indicator flashes slowly.	 Clean the charge contacts and charge again (p. 13). It is time to replace the battery. Please purchase a new battery (p. 23).

Problem	Remedy
You place the handset on the base unit to charge, but the IN USE/CHARGE indicator does not light.	 When the optional headset is connected to the handset, place the Handset Rest on the cradle and place the handset on it for proper battery charge.
The IN USE/CHARGE indicator and/or the SPARE CHARGE indicator light never goes out while charging.	• This is normal.

Adding Another Phone

This unit will not function during a power failure. To connect a standard telephone on the same line, use Panasonic T-adaptor KX-J66. (To order, call 1-800-332-5368.)
