
## **Battery Charge**

#### To connect a two-line telephone jack






•With this connection, you can only use LINE 1. The LINE 2 indicator will not work properly. (It will continue to flash.) To correct the line indication, see page 40.

# **Battery Charge**

Place the handset on the base unit and charge for about **3 hours** before initial use.

•The IN USE/CHARGE indicator lights.




IN USE/CHARGE Indicator

#### Recharge

When the BATT LOW indicator flashes or the unit beeps intermittently, recharge the battery.

•The BATT LOW indicator will continue to flash for at least 30 minutes once you begin recharging. This time will increase the more you use the handset while recharging.

#### **Battery information**

If your Panasonic battery is fully charged:

Operation	Approx. battery life
While in use (TALK)	Up to about 8 hours
While not in use (Stand-By)	Up to about 30 days

- •Battery life may vary depending on usage conditions and ambient temperature.
- Clean the handset and the base unit charge contacts with a soft dry cloth once a month. Clean more often if the unit is subject to grease, dust or high humidity. If not, the battery may not charge properly.
- •A fully charged battery does not require the handset to be placed on the base unit until the BATT LOW indicator flashes. This will maximize the battery life.
- •The battery cannot be overcharged.

## **Selecting the Dialing Mode**

You can program the dialing mode **by using the handset near the base unit**. If you have touch tone service, set to TONE. If rotary or pulse service is used, set to PULSE. The factory preset is TONE.


The TALK and DIGITAL SP-PHONE indicator lights must be off before programming.

- Press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).
  - •The TALK indicator flashes.
- **9** Press **AUTO**.
- 3 To select PULSE, press # twice.

To select TONE, press 🛞 twice.

When finished, press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).

•A confirmation tone sounds.\*



- To cancel during programming, press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC), then start from step 1.
- •If 3 beeps sound during programming, a wrong key was pressed. Restart from step 1.
- ●If either line has rotary or pulse service, set to PULSE. When making a call using the line which has touch tone service, press 😿 first and then dial the number.

#### \*What the confirmation tone means

1 beep: The mode is different from the previously selected one.

2 beeps: The mode is the same as the previously selected one.

# Preparing the Answering System


## **Greeting Message**

You can record a common greeting message or personal greeting message for each line. If not, one of two pre-recorded greetings will be played when a call is received (p. 17).

All messages (greeting, incoming, etc.) are stored in digital memory (p. 17). The **total recording time is about 16 minutes**. We recommend you record **a brief greeting message** (see the sample on the next page) in order to leave more time in memory.

#### To record a greeting message

- a) To record a common greeting, press (SELECT) repeatedly until " LINE 1 LINE 2" is displayed.
  - b) To record a greeting for each line, press (SELECT) repeatedly until " LINE 1" or " LINE 2" is displayed.



#### Greeting message sample

"Hello, this is (your name and/or number). Sorry I cannot take your call. Please leave a message after the beep. Thank you."

#### To erase the recorded greeting message

Press **GREETING CHECK**) → press **(ERASE**) while the message is being played.

•The unit will answer a call with a pre-recorded greeting.

#### Pre-recorded greeting message

If you do not record a greeting message (p. 16), one of the following two messages will be played when a call is received depending on the caller's recording time (p. 20).

#### To check the pre-recorded greeting, press GREETING CHECK).

- •A pre-recorded greeting will be played as below.
- When the recording time is set to "1 minute" or "unlimited"; "Hello, we are not available now. Please leave your name and phone number after the beep. We will return your call."
- When the recording time is set to "greeting only"; "Hello, we are not available now. Please call again. Thank you for your call."

#### To check the greeting message(s)

Press **SELECT** repeatedly to select the desired line(s)  $\Rightarrow$  press **(GREETING CHECK)**.

- •The selected greeting(s) is (are) played back.
- •When the both lines are selected and there are recorded greetings for each line, the LINE 1 greeting will be played first.

#### Flash Memory Message Backup

Messages are stored indefinitely on a "flash memory" IC chip—even if a power failure occurs. All of the messages are saved until you erase them.

## Programming Summary for the Answering System

You can program the following functions by using the handset near the base unit. See the bracketed pages for details.

The TALK and DIGITAL SP-PHONE indicator lights must be off before programming.

Lift the handset, then press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).

- •To cancel during programming, press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC), then start from the beginning.
- If 6 beeps sound during programming, a wrong key was pressed. Enter the correct number again.

#### \*What the confirmation tone means

- 1 beep: The new programmed number is stored.
- 2 beeps: The number is the same as the previously stored one.
- 6 beeps: The number is not correct. Try again from the beginning.

## **Time and Day Adjustment**

Voice Time/Day Stamp: During playback, a synthesized voice will announce the time and day when each message was recorded.

Press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).

•The TALK indicator flashes.

#### Press SCREEN/PLAYBACK).


- The indicator lights.
  - •"P" is displayed on the base unit.
- **Q** Press **(0)**.
  - " () " is displayed.

• "Set time" is announced. The time/day will be heard if it was adjusted beforehand.

- 4 Enter the current time (hour and minute) by using a 4-digit number. (Ex. To set 9:30, enter "0930".)
  - •The unit announces the time.
  - The entered number is displayed.

5 Press ≠ to select "AM" or "PM". Press ≠ repeatedly to set the day.

- 6 When finished, press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).
  - •The unit announces the time/day. The clock starts working.



(SCREEN/PLAYBACK) and Indicator

- In step 4, you cannot enter numbers greater than 12. Do not use military time. (To set 13:00 hours, enter "0100" and select "PM" by pressing ★).)
- •The accuracy of the clock is approximately ±45 seconds a month at room temperature.

If a power failure occurs, the adjusted time/day may be erased.

#### To check the time/day

#### Press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC) → (SCREEN/PLAYBACK) → (0).

•The current time/day is heard. When finished, press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).

## Selecting the Caller's Recording Time

You may select the caller's recording time of each line as either "1 minute", "unlimited" or "greeting only". Both lines are preset to "unlimited".



If you select "greeting only", the unit will answer a call with the greeting message, and then hang up. The unit will not record any messages.

## Selecting the Number of Rings

You may select the number of rings before the answering system answers a call, from "1" to "7" or "AUTO (for Toll Saver)". The factory preset is "AUTO".



Press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).


- Press (SCREEN/PLAYBACK).
  - •The indicator lights.
  - •"P" is displayed on the base unit.
- ) Press 2.
  - •The current setting is displayed.

Press a dialing button (1) to (7) to set the number of rings.

- 0: Selects "AUTO". "A" is displayed.
- 1-7: The unit will answer after the selected number of rings.

# 5 When finished, press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).

•The indicator lights go out.



#### Toll Saver (When set to "AUTO")

When you call the unit from a touch tone telephone: If the unit answers on the 2nd ring, there is at least one new message.

If the unit answers on the 4th ring, there are no new messages. Hang up when you hear the 3rd ring. This will save you the toll charge for the call. Preparellon



### Setting the CPC (Calling Party Control) Function

The CPC function is preset to "A". If you use a call waiting service, set to "b", or the call waiting tone will disconnect someone leaving a message.

- 1. Press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).
- 2. Press (SCREEN/PLAYBACK).
- 3. Press 3.
  - •The current setting "A" or "b" is displayed on the base unit.
- 4. To select "b", press 2.
  OR
  To select "A", press 1.
  •The setting is displayed.
- 5. When finished, press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).

#### Setting the Greeting Monitor Function

When your greeting message is being played to the caller, you can also listen to it through the speaker. To listen to your greeting, set to "2 (ON)". The factory preset is "1 (OFF)".


- 1. Press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).
- 2. Press (SCREEN/PLAYBACK).
- 3. Press (4).

The current setting "1" or "2" is displayed on the base unit.

- 4. To select "2 (ON)", press 2.
  OR
  To select "1 (OFF)", press 1.
  •The setting is displayed.
- 5. When finished, press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC).

# **Making Calls**

The unit will automatically select an idle line when you press **TALK** to make a call. (To change the line selection, see page 39.)



- If an alarm tone sounds in step 1, move closer to the base unit or place the handset on the base unit. Then try again.
- •In step 1, you may select a line manually by pressing the line button instead of **TALK**.

#### To redial the last number dialed

Press (TALK) (or a line button) → (REDIAL/PAUSE).

#### To select the receiver volume

Press (LOUD/RINGER) while talking.

• Each time you press the button, the volume level will change from MEDIUM (preset) to HIGH to LOW.

#### If noise interferes with the conversation

Press CH to select a clearer channel or move closer to the base unit.

#### To put a call on hold

#### Press (HOLD/INTERCOM).

- •The TALK indicator light goes out and the line indicator flashes.
- •After 6 minutes, warning rings will sound every 10–15 seconds. After a total of 10 minutes, the call will be disconnected.

#### To release the hold

Press the line button.

• If another phone is connected on the same line (p. 69), you can also release the hold by lifting its handset.

Off	The line is free.
On	You are using the line on the handset or the base unit.
Flashing twice every 2 seconds	Someone else is using the line on the handset, base unit or parallel connected telephone.
Flashing	A call is on hold. The answering system is recording a message.
Flashing quickly	A call is being received.

#### What the line indicator means

#### Luminous Talk Key

The (TALK) button uses non-radioactive luminescent material which can absorb light energy of sunlight or lamps (incandescent, fluorescent, halogen, etc.), and release this absorbed light for darkened room operation.

- •As the absorbed energy in the **TALK** button decreases, the button brightness will fade naturally.
- •Button brightness and duration depend on the amount of room lighting and exposure time.

When a call is being received, the called line indicator flashes quickly. The line is automatically selected when you answer the call. (To change the line selection, see page 39.)

# With the Handset


If the handset is off the base unit, press (TALK).

- •The called line indicator lights.
- You can also answer a call by pressing any dialing button 0 to 9, \*, or # (—Any Key Talk).



If on the base unit, just lift up.

•The called line indicator lights.



#### Adjusting the handset ringer volume

The TALK indicator light must be off.


- •To select HIGH (preset) or LOW, press (LOUD/RINGER) briefly. (Each time you press the button briefly, the selected volume rings and the ringer volume will change.)
- •To turn the ringer OFF, press and hold (LOUD/RINGER) until 2 beeps sound.
- •To turn the ringer ON, press (LOUD/RINGER) briefly. The ringer sounds at the HIGH level.

#### Lighted keypad

The dialing buttons will light while dialing and flash when a call is received. The lights will go out about 10 seconds after dialing or answering a call.



### With the Base Unit (Digital Duplex Speakerphone)



- •While using the speakerphone, if the handset is on the base unit, you may switch to the handset by lifting it up.
- •You cannot answer a call using the speakerphone while the answering system is recording a message on the other line. To answer, press (TALK) or press the line button on the handset whose indicator is flashing quickly.

#### To adjust the speaker volume (8 levels) while talking

To increase, press VOLUME  $\bigodot$ . To decrease, press VOLUME  $\bigodot$ .

#### Hands-Free Digital Duplex Speakerphone

The digital duplex speakerphone enhances your telephone conversation.

For best performance, please note the following:

- •Use the speakerphone in a quiet room.
- •Speak alternately with the caller.
- ●If the other party's voice from the speaker cuts in/out during a conversation, press VOLUME 💟 to decrease the speaker volume.
- •The line indicator shows the line condition (p. 24).

#### To put a call on hold

Press HOLD.

- •The DIGITAL SP-PHONE indicator light goes out and the line indicator flashes.
- •After 6 minutes, warning rings will sound every 10–15 seconds. After a total of 10 minutes, the call will be disconnected.

#### To release the hold

Press the line button.

• If another phone is connected on the same line (p. 69), you can also release the hold by lifting its handset.

#### To select the base unit ringer volume

Set the RINGER selector for each line to HIGH, LOW, or OFF. •When set to OFF, the bell will not ring for that line.

# Storing Phone Numbers in Memory

You can store up to 10 numbers in the handset. The dialing buttons (0 to 9) function as memory stations.

The TALK indicator light must be off before programming.



#### means

- 1 beep: The new number is stored.
- 2 beeps: The number is the same as the previously stored one.

#### To erase a stored number

Press (PROGRAM/2WAY REC) → (AUTO) → the memory station number (0 to 9) for the phone number to be erased.






## While You are Using a Line

During a conversation, if **two tones** sound and the other line indicator flashes quickly, an incoming call is being received on the line. You can answer the second call while holding the first call. You can also make a call without terminating the first call using the handset.

You may delete the **two tones** (incoming call tone) by programming. See page 41.

#### With the handset


- **1** Ex: If you are using LINE 1 Press <u>HOLD/INTERCOM</u> to put the first call (LINE 1) on hold.
  - The LINE 1 indicator flashes.
- 2 Press the other line button (LINE 2) to make or answer the second call.
  - •The LINE 2 indicator lights.
- **3** To return to the first call (LINE 1), press the line button of the first call (LINE 1).
  - The second call is terminated.



•To hold the second call in step 3, press (HOLD/INTERCOM) before pressing the line button of the first call.

#### With the base unit

- Ex: If you are using LINE 1 Press (HOLD) to put the first call (LINE 1) on hold.
  - •The LINE 1 indicator flashes.
- 2 Press the other line button (LINE 2) to answer the second call.
  - •The LINE 2 indicator lights.



While having a conversation on one line, you can make or answer a second call on the other line and then combine both lines together to establish a conference call.

#### With the handset



- •The base unit user can join a conference call on the handset by pressing (LINE 1) or (LINE 2).

#### With the base unit



During a conference call:

- •To hang up both lines, press (DIGITAL SP-PHONE).
- •To hang up only one line, press the line button you want to continue talking with.
- •To put both lines on hold, press (HOLD). To talk with only one caller, press the corresponding line button. To resume both lines, press (CONF).
- •The handset user can join a conference call on the base unit by pressing (LINE 1) or (LINE 2).

# Intercom

A 2-way intercom is available between the handset and the base unit.

#### Paging the base unit from the handset

Handset:


Press (HOLD/INTERCOM), wait for the handset to stop beeping, then talk.

- The TALK indicator flashes.
- Base unit:

2 Base unit. When the other party's voice is heard, answer using the MIC.

Handset: 3 To end the intercom, press (HOLD/INTERCOM).


•The TALK indicator light goes out.



#### Paging the handset from the base unit (Handset locator)

Using this feature, you can locate the handset, if misplaced.

- Base unit:
  - Press LOCATOR/INTERCOM).
  - •The handset beeps for 1 minute.
  - •To stop paging, press (LOCATOR/INTERCOM) again.
- O Handset:
  - Press (HOLD/INTERCOM) to answer.
    - •The TALK indicator flashes.
- **Q** Base unit:
- **J** Talk into the **MIC**.
- Handset:
  - To end the intercom, press (HOLD/INTERCOM).
    - •The TALK indicator light goes out.



#### During the intercom:

- Intercom calls can only be ended by the handset.
- If two tones sound, an incoming call has been received. To answer, press the line button whose indicator is flashing quickly. The intercom is ended.

# **Transferring a Call Using the Intercom**

The intercom can be used during a call. This feature enables you to transfer the call between the handset and the base unit.

# From the handset to the base unit

Handset: During a call, press HOLD/INTERCOM.

The call is put on hold.

2 Handset:

Press (HOLD/INTERCOM) again, wait for the handset to stop beeping, then talk.

- If the base unit user does not answer, press the line button whose indicator is flashing.
- Base unit:

When the paging party's voice is heard, answer using the MIC.

Base unit:

To answer the call, press the line button whose indicator is flashing.

- •The transfer is completed.
- •The handset user can join the conversation by pressing the line button whose indicator light is flashing.

# From the base unit to the handset

Base unit:

During a call, press (LOCATOR/INTERCOM).


- •The call is put on hold.
- •If the handset user does not answer, press the line button whose indicator is flashing.
- Handset:

Press (HOLD/INTERCOM) to answer the page.

Andset:

To answer the call, press the line button whose indicator is flashing.

- •The transfer is completed.
- •The base unit user can join the conversation by pressing the line button whose indicator light is flashing.



## For Call Waiting Service Users

Press (FLASH) briefly if you hear a call-waiting tone while talking.

- •The first call is put on hold and you can answer the second call.
- •To return to the first caller, press (FLASH) again.

### **Automatic Security Code Setting**

Whenever you place the handset on the base unit, the unit automatically selects one of 65,000 security codes. These codes help prevent the unauthorized use of your telephone line by another cordless telephone.

### **Temporary Tone Dialing**

#### (For Rotary or Pulse Service Users)

Press (TONE) before entering access numbers which require tone dialing.

•The dialing mode changes to tone. You can enter numbers to access an answering service, electronic banking service, etc. When you hang up, the mode will return to pulse.

# If Your Unit is Connected to a PBX (Analog Only)


We recommend you press **(REDIAL/PAUSE)** between the access number for an outside line and the phone number.

•Pressing (REDIAL/PAUSE) once creates a 3.5 second pause. This prevents misdialing when you redial or dial a stored number. (REDIAL/PAUSE) counts as one digit.)


## **Convenient Desk Usage**
