
## **Battery Charge**

To power the handset, install the battery (p. 8) and charge it for about **15 hours** before initial use (p. 10).



## **Operating Distance/Noise**


## Installing the Battery in the Handset

Install the battery as shown observing the proper polarity. Then install the handset cover until it locks into place.




## Installing the Cradle Cover on the Base Unit

Close the cradle cover as shown.









## **Battery Charge**

Place the handset on the base unit for about **15 hours**.

• The IN USE/CHARGE indicator lights.

#### Recharge

When the unit beeps every minute during a conversation or the TALK/BATT LOW indicator flashes intermittently, recharge the battery.

If you do not want to wait until the battery is fully recharged, we recommend you purchase an optional spare battery (page 26).



#### Standard battery life


If your Panasonic battery is fully charged;

While in use (TALK)	Up to about 3 hours	
While not in use (Stand-By)	Up to about 10 days	

- Battery life may vary depending on usage conditions and ambient temperature.
- Clean the handset and the base unit charge contacts with a soft dry cloth once a month, or the battery may not charge properly.
- Once the battery is fully charged, you do not have to place the handset on the base unit until the TALK/BATT LOW indicator flashes intermittently.
- The battery cannot be overcharged.

### About the RESET Button


If the unit stops operating properly even after you set it up correctly, press [RESET] on the bottom of the unit with a pointed object, such as a pen, etc.



Pressing (RESET) does not erase any stored telephone numbers (p. 16, 18), but will erase only the last number dialed with the base unit (p. 15).

## **Adding Another Phone**


This unit will not function during a power failure. To connect a standard telephone on the same line, use Panasonic T-adaptor KX-J66.



## Making/Answering Calls

## Making Calls with the Handset

- 1 Open the flip.
  - The TALK/BATT LOW indicator lights.
  - If the indicator does not light, press (TALK).
- Dial a telephone number.
- To hang up, close the flip or press (TALK).
  - The indicator light goes out.



• If an alarm tone sounds in step 1, move toward the base unit or place the handset on the base unit. Then try again.

#### To redial the last number

Follow step 1, then press **REDIAL/PAUSE**.

### To select the receiver volume HIGH or LOW (preset)

Press (VOLUME/RINGER) while speaking.

• Each time you press, the volume level will change.

#### Lighted keypad

The dialing buttons will light while dialing and flash when a call is received. The lights will go out about 10 seconds after dialing or answering a call.




## **Answering Calls with the Handset**

## If the flip is closed

Open the flip.

 You can also answer a call by pressing <u>TALK</u> without opening the flip.



### Adjusting the ringer volume


Be sure the TALK/BATT LOW indicator light is off. If the light is on, press (TALK) to turn it off.

- To select HIGH (preset) or LOW, press VOLUME/RINGER lightly. (Each time you press, a bell sounds and the ringer volume will change.)
- To turn the ringer OFF, press and hold (VOLUME/RINGER) until a bell sounds followed by 2 beeps.
- To turn the ringer ON, press VOLUME/RINGER lightly. The ringer sounds at the HIGH level.

## Making Calls with the Base Unit

- Press (SP-PHONE).
  - · The indicator lights.
- Dial a telephone number.

- When the other party answers, speak into the MIC (microphone).
- To hang up, press (SP-PHONE).
  - The indicator light goes out.



- For best speakerphone performance, use in a quiet room and speak alternately with the caller.
- If the other party has difficulty hearing you, press 🕶 to decrease the speaker volume. Reducing the speakerphone volume will increase the microphone sensitivity.

## To adjust the speaker volume (8 levels)

To increase, press . To decrease, press .

#### To redial the last number

Press SP-PHONE → REDIAL/PAUSE.

### To switch to the handset (while using the speakerphone)


- 1. Handset: Open the flip. If the TALK/BATT LOW indicator does not light, press (TALK).
- 2. Base unit: Press **SP-PHONE** to turn off the speakerphone.
  - You can continue the conversation using the handset.

## **Answering Calls with the Base Unit**



#### To select the ringer volume



## Storing Phone Numbers in Memory

You can store up to 10 phone numbers in the handset. The dialing buttons (0 to 9) function as memory stations.

Be sure the TALK/BATT LOW indicator light is off. If the light is on, press [TALK] to turn it off.

- 4 Press (MEMORY).
  - The TALK/BATT LOW indicator flashes.
- Press a memory station number (0 to 9).
  - · A long beep sounds.
- Enter a phone number up to 20 digits.
  - If you misdial, press TALK twice to end storing, then restart from step 1.
- When finished, press MEMORY).
  - A confirmation tone sounds. (See below.)
  - To store other numbers, repeat steps 1 through 4.



#### What the confirmation tone means

1 beep: The new number is stored.

2 beeps: The number is the same as a previously stored one.

#### To erase a stored number

If the TALK/BATT LOW indicator light is on before erasing, press **TALK** to turn it off.

Press <u>MEMORY</u> → the memory station number (0 to 9) for the phone number to be erased → <u>MEMORY</u>.



## **Dialing a Stored Number**

- Open the flip.
  - If the TALK/BATT LOW indicator does not light, press TALK.
- Press MEMORY.
- Press the memory station number (0 to 9).
  - The stored number is dialed.





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



## Intercom

A 2-way intercom is available between the handset and the base unit.

## Paging the base unit from the handset


- Handset: Open the flip.
   The TALK/BATT LOW indicator lights.
- Handset: Press (INTERCOM) and speak.
  - The INTERCOM indicator lights.
  - The TALK/BATT LOW indicator light goes out.
- Base unit: When the other party's voice is heard, answer through the MIC.
- Handset: To end the intercom, close the flip or press (INTERCOM).



## Paging the handset from the base unit (Handset locator)

Using this feature, you can locate the handset if misplaced.

- Base unit: Press LOCATOR/INTERCOM).
  - The handset beeps for 1 minute.
  - To stop paging, press
     LOCATOR/INTERCOM
     again.
- Press (INTERCOM) to answer.
- **Q** Base unit: Speak into the MIC.
- Handset: To end the intercom, close the flip or press (INTERCOM).



#### During the intercom:

- Intercom calls can only be ended by the handset.
- If the handset user has difficulty hearing the base unit user, decrease
  the speaker volume by pressing 
   . Reducing the speakerphone
  volume will increase the microphone sensitivity.
- If two tones sound, an incoming call has been received. To answer, press <u>TALK</u> or <u>SP-PHONE</u>. The intercom is ended.
   (The tones will not sound when the ringer volume is set to OFF.)

## Transferring a Call Using the Intercom

The intercom can be used during a call. This feature enables you to transfer the call between the handset and the base unit.



# Special Features





## Placing a Call on Hold

Press (HOLD) during a conversation.

- The TALK/BATT LOW indicator and the SP-PHONE indicator flash simultaneously.
- When holding a call with the flip opened, the call will remain on hold even if you close the flip.
- If you put a call on hold for 6 minutes, warning rings will sound. The call
  will be disconnected after a total of 10 minutes.

#### To release the hold

With the handset, open the flip or press **TALK**. With the base unit, press **SP-PHONE**.

 If another phone is connected on the same line, you can also release the hold by lifting its handset.

## Selecting the Ringer Tone (4 Types)

You can select separate ringer tones for the handset and the base unit. The ringer volume must be set to HIGH or LOW (p. 13, 15).

#### When selecting the handset ringer tone


If the TALK/BATT LOW indicator light is on before programming, press **TALK** to turn it off.

## When selecting the base unit ringer tone

Be sure the SP-PHONE indicator and the TALK/BATT LOW indicator lights are off before programming.

- 1. Press MEMORY.
- 2. Press (TONE).
- 3. Press a dialing button, 1 to 4.
  - The selected ringer tone sounds.
  - If three beeps sound, the ringer volume is set to OFF.
     Press <u>MEMORY</u> to end selecting, then set the ringer volume to HIGH or LOW (p. 13, 15). Restart from step 1.
- 4. When finished, press [MEMORY].





## For Call Waiting Service Users

Press (FLASH) lightly if you hear a call-waiting tone while talking.

- The first call is put on hold and you can answer the second call.
- To return to the first caller, press FLASH again.

## **Automatic Security Code Setting**

Whenever you place the handset on the base unit, the unit automatically selects one of 1.6 million security codes. These codes help to avoid unauthorized use of your telephone line by another cordless telephone.

## **Temporary Tone Dialing** (For Rotary Service Users)

Press **TONE** before entering access numbers which require tone dialing.

• The dialing mode changes to tone. You can enter numbers to access answering systems, electronic banking services, etc. When you hang up, the mode returns to pulse.

### If Your Unit is Connected to a PBX

We recommend you press **REDIAL/PAUSE** between the access number for an outside line and the phone number.


Pressing <u>REDIAL/PAUSE</u> once creates a 3.5 second pause.
 This prevents misdialing when you redial or dial a stored number.
 (<u>REDIAL/PAUSE</u>) counts as one digit.)

## **Optional Spare Battery**

When the handset battery needs charging, replace it with a fully charged optional spare battery. This eliminates having to wait for the handset battery to recharge. Please purchase a Panasonic P-P592 (KX-A92) battery and install it in the base unit to charge.


#### Installing the spare battery in the base unit

Open the cradle cover by pushing the tab and lifting the cover.

The SPARE CHARGE indicator lights.



The spare battery is always being charged in the base unit while the AC adaptor is connected. The battery cannot be overcharged.



## FCC and Other Information

This unit must not be connected to a coin operated line. If you are on a party line, check with your local telephone company.

#### Ringer Equivalence No. (REN):

The REN is useful in determining the quantity of devices you may connect to your telephone line and still have all of those devices ring when your telephone number is called. In most, but not all areas, the sum of the REN's of all devices connected to one line should not exceed five (5.0). To be certain of the number of devices you may connect to your line, as determined by the REN, you should contact your local telephone company to determine the maximum REN for your calling area.

In the event terminal equipment causes harm to the telephone network, the telephone company should notify the customer, if possible, that service may be stopped.

However, where prior notice is impractical, the company may temporarily cease service providing that they:

- (a) Promptly notify the customer.
- (b) Give the customer an opportunity to correct the problem with their equipment.
