


Battery Charge

The cordless handset is powered by a rechargeable Nickel-Metal Hydride (Ni-MH) battery. Charge the battery for **6 hours** before initial use (p. 12).



Base Unit Location/Noise

Calls are transmitted between the base unit and the cordless handset using wireless radio waves. **For maximum distance and noise-free operation**, the recommended base unit location is:



Note:

- If you use the cordless handset near a microwave oven which is being used, noise
 may be heard from the receiver or the speaker. Move away from the microwave
 oven and closer to the base unit.
- If you use the cordless handset near another cordless phone's base unit, noise may be heard. Move away from the other cordless phone's base unit and closer to your base unit.

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Important

Throughout these Operating Instructions, Base Unit and Handset are used to indicate with which unit an operation can be performed.

Base Unit: Perform with the base unit.

Answering System

Handset: Perform with the cordless handset.


Base Unit Handset: Perform with the base unit and cordless handset separately.





How to use the navigator keys/soft keys

Navigator keys

These keys have four active areas that are indicated by the arrows.

| Base unit | A | Scrolls up the function menu, Caller List and the phone book. Increases the volume. |
|------------------|----------|--|
| Cordless handset | • | Scrolls down the function menu, Caller List and the phone book. Decreases the volume. |
| | • | Selects your menu choices, enters the phone book or moves the cursor forward. |
| SEARCH • | • | Enters the phone book, returns to the previous display or moves the cursor backward. |





- ④ (The display shows the dialed number, call status, programming options, phone book items, Caller ID information etc. The time and date are displayed on the base unit. "■" (extension icon) is displayed with the extension numbers (ex. base unit="0", cordless handset 1= "1") during an intercom call (p. 46) or a conference call (p. 50).
- MESSAGES " will flash if there is at least one new message (p. 56). If there are only old messages, "MESSAGES " will not flash but remain lit. If there are no messages, "MESSAGES " will not be displayed.
 - 6 "SP" is shown when you are using the cordless handset speaker a) during an intercom call (p. 46) or a conference call (p. 50); b) while listening to messages (p. 57).
 - The battery icon indicates the battery strength (p. 12).
 - (a) The extension number of your cordless handset is displayed if it has been registered to the base unit (p. 27, 69).
 - (9) The prompts on the bottom line will show corresponding functions of the soft keys which are located directly below the display (p. 8).
 Ex. The soft key below "PLAY" will function as PLAY key.

Backlit LCD displays

The display of the cordless handset will light for a few seconds after pressing a button or lifting the cordless handset off the charger.



Installation

Connections


Base unit

Connect the handset cord to the handset and the base unit, place the handset on the cradle, and then connect the AC adaptor and the telephone line cord.



- Base unit: USE ONLY WITH Panasonic AC ADAPTOR PQLV10 (Order No. PQLV10Z).
- Use Only a Panasonic Handset for the KX-TG2970.
- The AC adaptor must remain connected at all times. (It is normal for the adaptor to feel warm during use.)
- The AC adaptor should be connected to a vertically oriented or floor-mounted AC outlet. Do not connect the AC adaptor to a ceiling-mounted AC outlet, as the weight of the adaptor may cause it to become disconnected.
- If your unit is connected to a PBX which does not support Caller ID, you cannot access Caller ID services.
- This unit will not function during a power failure, unless it is connected to the ADT Security System.
- If the unit is connected to a telephone line with DSL service, you may hear noise during conversations or the unit may not display caller's name and/or phone number properly. We recommend connecting a noise filter (contact your DSL service provider) to the telephone line between the base unit and the telephone line jack.


Charger unit



- Charger unit: USE ONLY WITH Panasonic AC ADAPTOR KX-TCA1 (Order No. KX-TCA1-G).
- The AC adaptor must remain connected at all times. (It is normal for the adaptor to feel warm during use.)
- The AC adaptor should be connected to a vertically oriented or floor-mounted AC outlet. Do not connect the AC adaptor to a ceiling-mounted AC outlet, as the weight of the adaptor may cause it to become disconnected.

Installing the Battery in the Cordless Handset

Insert the battery (①), and press it down until it snaps into the compartment (②). Close the cover.



To replace the battery:

Press the notch on the cover firmly and slide it as indicated by the arrow. Replace the old battery with a new one (p. 13). Close the cover and charge the cordless handset for 6 hours.




Installation

Battery Charge

Place the cordless handset on the charger and charge for **6 hours** before initial use.

- The unit beeps once, the CHARGE indicator lights and "Charging" is displayed.
- When the battery is fully charged, "charge completed" is displayed if there are no new calls in the Caller List.



Battery strength

You can confirm the battery strength on the cordless handset display. Battery strength is indicated by the icons shown in the chart below.

Recharge

Recharge the battery when:

- "Recharge battery" is displayed on the cordless handset,
- Recharge battery

- " " flashes, or
- the cordless handset beeps intermittently while it is in use.
- The display will continually indicate "Recharge battery" and/or " will flash when the battery is charged for less than 15 minutes and the cordless handset is lifted off the charger.
- If the battery has been discharged, the cordless handset will display "Charge for 6 HRS" and "——" when you place the cordless handset on the charger. The cordless handset will not work unless the battery is charged. Continue charging.

Battery replacement:

If you cleaned the charge contacts and fully charged the battery, but after a few telephone calls, "Recharge battery" is displayed and/or " continues to flash, or "Charge for 6 HRS" and " are displayed, the battery may need to be replaced. Please order a new Panasonic HHR-P402 battery at the telephone number shown on page 2. To replace the battery, see page 11.

A nickel metal hydride battery that is recyclable powers the product you have purchased. Please call 1-800-8-BATTERY for information on how to recycle this battery.



Battery information


After your Panasonic battery is fully charged, you can expect the following performance:

| Operation | Operating time |
|---|----------------|
| While in use (TALK) | Up to 6 hours |
| While not in use (Standby) | Up to 14 days |
| While using the Clarity Booster feature (p. 31) | Up to 4 hours |

- A fully charged battery will give you up to 6 hours of continuous talk time, or keep your cordless handset in Standby mode to receive incoming calls for up to 14 days (if no phone calls are made). Battery power is consumed whenever the cordless handset is off of the charger, even when the cordless handset is not in use. The longer you leave the cordless handset off of the charger, the time you can actually talk on the cordless handset will be shortened. Actual battery performance depends on a combination of how often the cordless handset is in TALK mode and how often it is in Standby mode.
- Clean the charge contacts of the cordless handset and the charger with a soft, dry cloth once a month. Clean more often if the unit is subject to grease, dust or high humidity. Otherwise the battery may not charge properly.
- If the battery is fully charged, you do not have to place the cordless handset on the charger until "Recharge battery" is displayed and/or " | " | " flashes. This will maximize the battery life.
- If you want to keep the battery fully charged at all times, place the cordless handset on the charger when the cordless handset is not used. The battery cannot be overcharged.
- When the Clarity Booster feature is turned on (p. 31), battery operating time may be shortened.

Programming Guidelines Base Unit Handset

The base unit and the cordless handset have programmable functions. They are selected from the function menu on the display (p. 16, 17).




How to select a function item from the menu

Make sure the base unit and the cordless handset are not being used. The cordless handset must be operated near the base unit and while off the charger.

4 If the item has a sub-menu, select the menu item (p. 16, 17). Repeat step 3 until your desired item is displayed. If the item has no sub-menu, go to step 5 on page 15.

- 5 Base unit: Select the desired setting by pressing [▼] or [▲], then press [▶] (Save). (For "Date and time", p. 18, press [▼] (Save) instead of [▶].)
 - Cordless handset: Select the desired setting by pressing $[\[\]]$ or $[\[\]]$, then press the soft key (**SAVE**).
 - The unit beeps 3 times and the setting is saved.



6 Base unit: Press [STOP] to exit programming mode. Cordless handset: Press [OFF] to exit programming mode.


Useful information

- "-----" indicates the beginning or end of the function menu.
- You can go back to the previous display by pressing [◄] except when entering characters or numbers. To return to the main menu from the sub-menu, press [◄].
- After programming is complete, the display will return to the main menu or the sub-menu depending on which menu the selected item is located. (See the menu tables on pages 16 and 17.)
- To exit the programming mode:
 For the base unit, press [STOP]. For the cordless handset, press [OFF].
- If you do not press any buttons for 60 seconds, the unit will exit programming mode.
- If the unit detects a problem, an error message will be displayed (p. 70–72).
- If a long beep is heard when you tried to save the setting, programming fails. You need to try again.



Date and Time Base Unit

We recommend you set the date and time so that the unit will announce the day and time each message was recorded when you play back messages.

1 Press [FUNCTION/EDIT].

2 Press [▶] at "Telephone".

3 Scroll to "Date and time" by pressing [▼] or [▲], then press [▶].

- 4 (1) Enter 2 digits each for the month, day and year. (Ex. To set May 15, 2004, enter "05 15 04".)

 - If you enter a wrong number, press [◄] or [▶] to move the cursor to the incorrect number. Enter the correct number

5 Select "AM" or "PM" by pressing [*].

- 6 Press [▼] (Save).
 - If a long beep sounds, the setting is not correct. Start again from step 4.
 - The clock starts working.

7 Press [STOP].

 When entering the time, you cannot enter numbers greater than 12. Do not use military time. (To set 13:00 hours, enter "0100", and select "PM".)

The date and time may be incorrect after a power failure. When "O" flashes on the base unit display, set the date and time again.

For Caller ID service users (p. 33)

- When a call is received, Caller ID information adjusts the date and time if the time is incorrect.
- Caller ID information will automatically adjust the date and time for daylight saving time.
- If the date and time have not been previously set, Caller ID information will not adjust the date and time.



Ringer Volume Base Unit Handset

You can select the ringer volume to HIGH, MEDIUM, LOW or OFF on the base unit and the cordless handset separately. The factory preset is HIGH. If set to OFF, the unit will not ring for outside calls and will ring at the LOW level for intercom calls.

 Cordless handset: Press the soft key (SAVE).
- If set to OFF, the base unit displays "Ringer off" while not in use and no new calls are in the Caller List. The cordless handset displays "Ringer off" while not in use.
- You can also select the ringer volume while an outside call is being received.
 Press [▼] or [▲] while the unit is just ringing.

Ringer Tone Handset

You can select one of 6 ringer tones for outside calls on the cordless handset. The factory preset is "1".

Auto Talk Handset

The Auto Talk feature allows you to answer calls by simply lifting the cordless handset off the charger without pressing [→] or [♣]. To use this feature, turn the feature ON. The factory preset is OFF.

1 Press [CONF/FUNCTION].

Preparing the Answering System

Greeting Message Base Unit

You can record a personal greeting message of **up to 2 minutes**. If you do not record your own message, one of 2 pre-recorded greetings will be played for callers (p. 25).

The total recording time of all messages (greeting and incoming) is **about 12 minutes**. We recommend you record **a brief greeting message** in order to leave more time for recording new messages.

To record a greeting message

Greeting message sample

"Hello, this is (your name and/or number). Sorry I cannot take your call. Please leave a message after the beep. Thank you."

- 1 Press and hold [GREETING] until "Record greeting after the beep" is heard.
- **2** After the long beep, talk clearly, about 20 cm (8 inches) away from the **MIC** (microphone).
 - The elapsed recording time is displayed.
 - If you record for over 2 minutes, the unit will stop recording.
- **3** When finished, press [GREETING] or [STOP].
 - To change the greeting, start again from step 1.
- If "Recording error" is displayed, 6 beeps sound and "Your greeting was not recorded. Record your greeting again." is announced, start again from step1.

To adjust the speaker volume, press [▼] or [▲].

- 9 levels (0–8) are available while using the Answering System.
- The number of steps shown on the display indicates the volume level.


To review the greeting

Press [GREETING].

To erase the greeting

Press [GREETING], then press [ERASE] while the recorded message is being played.

• The unit will answer calls with a pre-recorded greeting (p. 25).



Preparing the Answering System

Pre-recorded greeting

If you do not record a greeting (p. 24), one of 2 greetings will be played when a call is received, depending on the caller's recording time (see below).

To review the pre-recorded greeting, press [GREETING].

- A pre-recorded greeting will be played as follows:
- When the recording time is set to "1 minute", "2 minutes" or "3 minutes": "Hello, we are not available now. Please leave your name and phone number after the beep. We will return your call."
- If recording time runs out, the unit will automatically switch to the "Greeting only" mode (see below), and no new messages will be recorded.
- When the recording time is set to "Greeting only": "Hello, we are not available now. Please call again. Thank you for your call."

Flash Memory Message Backup (Message storage)

Messages stored in memory will not be affected by power failures. All messages are saved until you erase them.

Caller's Recording Time Base Unit

You can select "1 minute", "2 minutes", "3 minutes" or "Greeting only" for the caller's recording time. The factory preset is "3 minutes".

If you select "Greeting only", the unit will answer a call with the greeting message, and then hang up. The unit will not record any incoming messages.

Preparing the Answering System

Number of Rings Base Unit

You can select the number of times the unit rings before the Answering System answers a call, from "2" to "7" or "Toll saver"*. The factory preset is "4".

*Toll saver

When you call the unit from a remote location, the number of rings will tell you if there are any new messages. If the unit answers on the 2nd ring, there is at least one new message. If the unit answers on the 4th ring, there are no new messages. To save the toll charges for the call, hang up immediately when you hear the 3rd ring. The 3rd ring indicates that there are no new messages.

Registration for Additional Handsets Base Unit & Handset

KX-TG2970 includes a base unit and one cordless handset. You can expand the system by adding up to 2 additional cordless handsets, sold separately. A maximum of 3 cordless handsets can be registered to the base unit.

Generally a maximum of 3 extensions excluding or including the base unit can operate at a time. If 3 other extensions are in use, such as conducting a call, you may not be able to use your unit. "System is busy. Please try again later." will be displayed when you try to operate your unit. The maximum operating number may decrease, depending on the state of usage, such as using the Clarity Booster feature (p. 31), or when the Answering System is taking a call.





The included cordless handset is pre-registered at the factory and assigned the extension number 1. You do not need to register this handset which has "[1]" on the display. If you purchase accessory cordless handsets, you must register each to the base unit. Only one cordless handset can be registered at a time. A cordless handset will be assigned the extension number at registration. The model number of the accessory cordless handset is KX-TGA290. To order, contact your dealer or call 1-800-211-PANA(7262) to locate a dealer.

Charge the battery fully. Make sure the base unit and the other cordless handsets are not being used.

The cordless handset display shows the instructions as shown on the right.


Press MUTE on base unit, then OK on handset to register handset

1 Base unit: Press [MUTE].

• The MUTE indicator flashes. After the MUTE indicator starts flashing, the rest of the procedure must be completed within 1 minute.

2 Cordless handset:

- (1) Press the soft key (OK).
- (2) Wait until 3 beeps sound and the display shows the new extension number.
 - · Registration is complete.



- The registered number "[1]" to "[3]" is shown on the top right of the display.
- You can stop registration by pressing [OFF] on the cordless handset and pressing [MUTE] on the base unit.
- To re-register a cordless handset to a different base unit of the same model, see pages 68 and 69.



You can make a call by simply lifting the handset off the cradle and dialing a phone number. To hang up, place the handset on the cradle.

• "Talk" is displayed while using the handset.

To have a hands-free phone conversation

- 1 Press [DIGITAL SP-PHONE].
 - The indicator lights and "SP-phone" is displayed.
- 2 Dial a phone number.
 - The dialed number is displayed.
 - After a few seconds, the display will show the length of the call.
 - If you misdial, press [DIGITAL SP-PHONE] and start again from step 1.
- **3** When the other party answers, talk into the **MIC** (microphone).
- 4 To hang up, press [DIGITAL SP-PHONE].
 - The indicator goes out.



Hands-free Digital Duplex Speakerphone

For best performance, please note the following:

- Talk alternately with the other party in a guiet room.
- If you or the other party has difficulty hearing, press [▼] to decrease the speaker volume.
- You can switch to the handset by lifting it up. To switch back to the speakerphone, press [DIGITAL SP-PHONE].

To adjust the handset/speaker volume during a conversation

3 levels (High, Medium and Low) are available for the handset and 8 levels for the speaker.

To increase, press [▲]. To decrease, press [▼].

- The number of steps indicates the volume level.
- If you try to increase/decrease volume when it is at the maximum/minimum level, the base unit will beep 3 times.



- While talking using [♠], you can switch to a hands-free phone conversation by pressing [♣]. To switch back to the receiver, press [♠].

To adjust the receiver/speaker volume while talking

3 levels (High, Medium and Low) are available for the receiver and 6 levels for the speaker.

To increase, press $[\blacktriangle]$. To decrease, press $[\blacktriangledown]$.

- The number of steps indicates the volume level.
- If you try to increase/decrease volume when it is at the maximum/minimum level, the cordless handset will beep 3 times.

To redial using the redial list (Memory Redial)

The last 5 phone numbers dialed with the cordless handset are stored in the redial list.

 - The last number dialed is displayed with number 1.

 - You can also scroll down through the list by pressing [PAUSE/REDIAL].

Clarity Booster feature

This feature can improve sound clarity when the cordless handset is used in an area where there may be interference.

- The feature will be off after hanging up or when putting a call on hold.
- Battery operating time will be shortened using this feature (p. 13).
- During a conference call (p. 50), only one cordless handset can use this feature.

 - "Press extension# to transfer" is displayed.
 - To transfer the call to another extension, see page 48; to transfer to the Answering System to allow the outside party to leave a message, see page 60.

- The base unit user can also release the hold by lifting its handset or pressing [DIGITAL SP-PHONE].

Answering Calls

When a call is received, the unit rings and "Incoming call" is displayed.

Base Unit

Auto Talk

If you set the Auto Talk feature to ON (p. 23), you can answer a call by simply lifting the cordless handset off the charger without pressing [] or [4].

- To transfer the call to another person, see page 48.
- To transfer the call to the Answering System to allow the caller to leave a message, see page 60.
- When the ringer volume is set to OFF, the unit will not ring (p. 21).

Caller ID Service

This unit is compatible with Caller ID services offered by your telephone company. If you subscribe to Caller ID, caller names and phone numbers will be displayed and recorded in the Caller List.

How Caller ID information is displayed when a call is received

The base unit and the cordless handset display the caller's name and number after the first ring. In order to view the Caller ID information, please wait until the second ring to answer.

- After you answer the call, the display will show the length of the call.
- If the unit does not receive Caller ID information, one of the following will be displayed:

- Depending on radio communications with the base unit, the cordless handset may not display Caller ID information immediately after the first ring.
- If your unit is connected to a PBX which does not support Caller ID, you cannot access Caller ID service.
- Name display service may not be available in some areas. For further information, please contact your telephone company.
- If you subscribe to both Caller ID and Call Waiting with Caller ID service (CWID), when a second call is received while talking, a call waiting tone will be heard and the second caller's information will be displayed (p. 51).

Contact your telephone company for details about availability in your area, and to verify that CWID service is activated on your telephone line.


Using the Caller List

The base unit and the cordless handset can record Caller ID information from up to 50 different callers and store this information in each unit's Caller List. Caller List information is sorted by the most recent call to the oldest. When the 51st call is received, the information from the 1st call is deleted.

Viewing the Caller List Base Unit Handset

If you have received new calls, "Received calls" will be displayed.

1 Press [▼] or [▲] to enter the Caller List.



- 2 To search from the most recent call, press [▼].
 To search from the oldest call, press [▲].
 - The caller's name, number and the time and date of the call are displayed.

- If you do not press any buttons for 60 seconds, the unit will exit the Caller List.

What "√" means

" $\sqrt{}$ " indicates you have already viewed this calling information, or answered the call. If you play back a caller's message, " $\sqrt{}$ " will be added to the information in the base unit Caller List.

If a caller calls more than once

The number of times the same caller called is displayed (" \times 2" to " \times 9"). The date and time of the most recent call will be recorded. After viewing a caller's information, " \times 2" to " \times 9" will be replaced with " $\sqrt{}$ ".

Calling Back from the Caller List Base Unit Handset

- In some cases, you may have to edit the number before dialing (p. 36). (Ex. You may have to delete "1" and the area code.)
- If a phone number is not displayed in the caller information, you cannot call back that caller from the Caller List.

Using the Caller List

Editing the Caller's Phone Number Base Unit Handset

You can edit a phone number in the Caller List by removing its area code and/or the long distance code "1".

Once you call back an edited number, this unit can automatically edit incoming phone numbers from the same area code in the Caller List and each time you receive a call (Caller ID Number Auto Edit, p. 37).



Caller ID Number Auto Edit Base Unit Handset

Once you call back an edited number (p. 36), this unit can automatically edit incoming phone numbers from the same area code in the Caller List and each time you receive a call. For example, it can ignore the area code of calls originating from your area code, so that you can call these numbers from the Caller List without dialing the area code.

To activate this feature, you must edit a caller's phone number in the Caller List (p. 36) by selecting pattern (a), (b), or (c), then make a call to that number. Calls from numbers in that area code will be edited automatically. The unit can remember up to 4 area codes to be edited according to patterns (a) and (b).

When the 5th area code is edited, the oldest area code is reset to pattern (c). Phone numbers from the 4 most recently edited area codes will be automatically edited.

You can turn on or off the feature on the base unit and the cordless handset separately. The factory preset is ON.

To turn on or off Caller ID Number Auto Edit feature





During an intercom call:

- If you have difficulty hearing while using the speakerphone on the base unit or cordless handset, decrease the speaker volume by pressing [▼].
- If an incoming call is being received, you will hear 2 tones (incoming call tone, p. 52).

To answer the call:

- if using the base unit handset, place it on the cradle then lift it up.
- if using the base unit speakerphone, press [DIGITAL SP-PHONE] 2 times.
- if using the cordless handset, press [OFF] and press [→] or [♣].

Answering Intercom Calls

Base Unit

When an intercom call is being received, the base unit rings and the LOCATOR/INTERCOM/TRANSFER indicator flashes. The display shows the calling extension number.

- 1 Lift the handset off the cradle, or press [LOCATOR/ INTERCOM/TRANSFER] or [DIGITAL SP-PHONE].
- 2 To disconnect the intercom, place the handset on the cradle, or if using the speakerphone press [DIGITAL SP-PHONE] or [LOCATOR/INTERCOM/TRANSFER].

Handset

When an intercom call is being received, the cordless handset rings and the display shows the calling extension number.

- 1 Press [♠], [♣] or [HOLD] (INTERCOM).
 - You can also answer the call by pressing any button except
 [▲], [▼], [◄], [▶], [OFF] or the soft key (PANIC).
- **2** To disconnect the intercom, press **[OFF]** or place the cordless handset on the charger.

Auto Talk

If you set the Auto Talk feature to ON (p. 23), you can answer a call by lifting the cordless handset off the charger without pressing [,], [] or [HOLD] (INTERCOM).

- When the ringer volume is off (p. 21), the base unit and the cordless handset will ring at the LOW level for intercom calls.
- You cannot change the cordless handset ringer tone for intercom calls.
- When the base unit user pages all cordless handsets, only the cordless handset user who answers first can talk with the base unit user.

Transferring a Call Base Unit Handset

You can transfer an outside call between the base unit and the cordless handset, or between 2 cordless handsets (when the system has one or more additional cordless handsets, p. 27).

From the base unit to the cordless handset

- 1 Base unit:
 - (1) During a call, press ILOCATOR/INTERCOM/TRANSFERI.
 - If the line is on hold, release the hold (p. 29) before pressing [LOCATOR/INTERCOM/ TRANSFER].

Press extension# to transfer 0-3=Extension 9=Answering

- (2) To page a cordless handset, press its extension number ([1] to [3]). To page all cordless handsets, press [0].
- (3) Wait for the cordless handset user to answer, then you can announce the transfer.
 - If the paged party does not answer, press [LOCATOR/INTERCOM/TRANSFER] to return to the outside call.
- 2 Cordless handset: Press [¬], [♣] or [HOLD] (INTERCOM) to answer the page.
 - You can also answer the call by pressing any button [▲], [▼], [◄], [►], [OFF] or the soft key (PANIC).
- **3** Base unit: To complete the transfer, place the handset on the cradle, or if using the speakerphone press [DIGITAL SP-PHONE].
- When the base unit user calls all cordless handsets, only the cordless handset user who answers first can take the transferred call.

From the cordless handset to the base unit

- 1 Cordless handset:
 - (1) During a call, press [HOLD] (TRANSFER).
 - · The call is put on hold.

Press extension# to transfer 0-3=Extension 9=Answering

- (2) To page the base unit, press [0].
- (3) Wait for the paged party to answer, then you can announce the transfer.
 - If the paged party does not answer, press [→] or [□] to return to the outside call.
- 2 Base unit: Lift the handset or press [DIGITAL SP-PHONE] or [LOCATOR/INTERCOM/TRANSFER] to answer the page.
- 3 Cordless handset: To complete the transfer, press [OFF].

From a cordless handset to another cordless handset (when the system has one or more additional cordless handsets)

1. During a call, press [HOLD] (TRANSFER), then page another cordless handset by pressing its extension number ([1] to [3]).

- 2. Wait for the paged party to answer, then you can announce the transfer.
 - The paged handset user can answer by pressing [一], [吨] or [HOLD] (INTERCOM).
- 3. To complete the transfer, press [OFF].
- Any user can take a transferred call by pressing [¬], [□] or [DIGITAL SP-PHONE], or by lifting the base unit handset.
- If the called extension is in use in step 1, the display will show "Busy" then "Hold". Press [DIGITAL SP-PHONE], [→] or [□←] to return to the outside call. To transfer the call to another extension, repeat from step 1. OR

To transfer the call to the Answering System to allow the caller to leave a message, press [LOCATOR/INTERCOM/TRANSFER] or [HOLD] (INTERCOM), then press [9] to transfer the caller to the Answering System (p. 60). (The caller will hear the greeting and can leave a message after the beep.)

Quick call transfer

You can transfer a call without waiting for the paged party to answer.

Base unit: During a call, press [LOCATOR/INTERCOM/TRANSFER], and press the extension number ([1] to [3]) or press [0] to page all extensions, then place the handset on the cradle or press [DIGITAL SP-PHONE] to hang up.

Cordless handset: During a call, press [HOLD] (TRANSFER) and press the extension number ([0] for the base unit, [1] to [3] for the cordless handset), then press [OFF] to hang up.

- The call will be transferred directly.
- The paged party can take the transferred call by pressing [►], [♣] or [DIGITAL SP-PHONE], or by lifting the base unit handset.
- After the paged party answers, the transfer is complete.
- If the paged party does not answer:
 - -for the base unit, lift the handset or press [DIGITAL SP-PHONE] to return to the outside call.
 - -for the cordless handset, press [→] or [←] to return to the outside call.

If you do not answer the call within 4 minutes, the call will be disconnected. After speaking to the caller, you may also transfer the caller to the Answering System by performing the following steps:

- (1) Press [LOCATOR/INTERCOM/TRANSFER] on the base unit or [HOLD] (TRANSFER) on the cordless handset.
- (2) Press [9] to transfer the caller to the Answering System (p. 60). (The caller will hear the greeting and can leave a message after the beep.)

Conference Calls

While you are talking with an outside caller, you can call the base unit or the cordless handset to make a conference call. When the system has one or more additional cordless handsets (p. 27), you can make a conference call with your cordless handset and another cordless handset.

Base Unit

- 1 During a call, press [LOCATOR/INTERCOM/TRANSFER].
 - The call is put on hold.
- 2 To page the cordless handset, press the extension number ([1] to [3]).
- When the paged party answers, press [CONF] on your unit to make a conference call.

(Handset)

- 1 During a call, press [HOLD] (INTERCOM).
 - The call is put on hold.
- 2 To page the base unit, press [0].
 To page another cordless handset, press the extension number ([1] to [3]).
- 3 When the paged party answers, press [CONF/FUNCTION] on your unit to make a conference call.
- To leave the conference, place the base unit handset, or press [DIGITAL SP-PHONE] on the base unit or press [OFF] on the cordless handset. The 2 other parties can continue the conversation.
- During a conference, the outside call can be placed on hold by pressing [HOLD] on the base unit or [HOLD] (INTERCOM) on the cordless handset.
 Internal communications between extensions are not suspended. Only the person who placed the call on hold can resume the full conference; press [CONF] on the base unit or [CONF/FUNCTION] on the cordless handset.
- One more extension can join the conference call if another extension is not being used. To join the conference call, press [¬], [๘] or [DIGITAL SP-PHONE] or lift the base unit handset.

Call Share

This feature allows the base unit or the cordless handset to join the existing outside call.

To join a conversation (Call Share) Base Unit Handset

Base unit: Lift the handset off the cradle or press [DIGITAL SP-PHONE].

Cordless handset: Press [~] or [₼].

• "Conference" is displayed.

Special Features

Muting Your Conversation Base Unit Handset

During a call, you can mute your phone so the other party cannot listen to you. When muting your conversation, you can hear the other party.

Base unit: Press [MUTE].

- The MUTE indicator lights.
- "Mute" will be displayed for a few seconds.
- To release the mute, press [MUTE] again.
- If you press [DIGITAL SP-PHONE] or lift the handset to switch between the speaker and handset, the mute will be released.

Cordless handset: Press the soft key (MUTE).

- "Mute" will be displayed for a few seconds and "MUTE" will flash.
- To release the mute, press the soft key (MUTE) again.
- If you press [→] or [➪] to switch between the receiver and speaker, the mute will be released

Temporary Tone Dialing (For Rotary or Pulse Service Users) Base Unit Handset

Press [*] (TONE) before entering access numbers which require tone dialing.

 The dialing mode changes to tone. You can enter numbers to access an answering service, electronic banking service, etc. When you hang up, the dialing mode will return to pulse.

For Call Waiting Service Users Base Unit Handset

Press [FLASH/CALL WAIT] if you hear a call-waiting tone while talking.

- The first call is put on hold and you can answer the second call.
- To return to the first caller, press [FLASH/CALL WAIT] again.
- Call Waiting service cannot be used when the first call is put on hold or the Answering System is responding to a call.
- If this function does not operate properly, consult your telephone company for details.

Call Waiting Caller ID display Base Unit Handset

If you subscribe to both Caller ID and Call Waiting with Caller ID services (CWID), when a second call is received while talking, the second caller's information will be displayed. After you hear a call waiting tone while talking, the display shows the caller's name with the phone number and "Waiting".

- Contact your telephone company for details about availability in your area, and to verify that CWID service is activated on your telephone line.
- The caller's information will only be shown on the display of the unit which is on the outside call.

Special Features

Using the PAUSE Button (For PBX Line/Long Distance Calls) [Base Unit] [Handset]

We recommend you press [REDIAL/PAUSE] on the base unit or [PAUSE/REDIAL] on the cordless handset if a pause is required for dialing with a PBX or to make a long distance call.

Ex. Line access number [9] (PBX)

- [9] → [REDIAL/PAUSE] or [PAUSE/REDIAL] → Phone number
- Pressing [REDIAL/PAUSE] or [PAUSE/REDIAL] once creates a 3.5 second pause. This prevents misdialing when you dial after confirming the entered number (p. 29, 31) or dial a stored number (p. 42).
- Pressing [REDIAL/PAUSE] or [PAUSE/REDIAL] more than once increases the length of the pause between numbers.

Incoming Call Tone Base Unit Handset

During an intercom call, you can be informed of incoming calls by 2 tones. If you set incoming call tone to ON, this incoming call tone will be heard for as long as the line is ringing. To bypass the incoming call tone, set it to OFF. To set the incoming call tone to sound 2 times, set to "2". The factory preset is "2". You can set the incoming call tone on the base unit or the cordless handset separately.

1 Base unit: Press [FUNCTION/EDIT].

Cordless handset: Press [CONF/FUNCTION].

FLASH Button Base Unit Handset

Pressing [FLASH/CALL WAIT] also allows you to use special features of your host PBX such as transferring an extension call or accessing optional telephone services such as call waiting.

 Pressing [FLASH/CALL WAIT] cancels the Temporary Tone Dialing mode or the mute (p. 51).

Selecting the flash time (use either Base Unit or Handset)

The flash time depends on your telephone exchange or host PBX. You can select the following flash times: "700, 600, 400, 300, 250, 110, 100 or 90 ms (milliseconds)". The factory preset is "700 ms".

- The setting should stay at 700 ms unless pressing [FLASH/CALL WAIT] fails to pick up the Call Waiting call.
- If the unit is connected via a PBX, PBX functions (transferring a call etc.) might not work correctly. Consult your PBX supplier for the correct settings.



Press [CONF/FUNCTION], and follow steps 2 to 6 above, using the cordless handset. Press the soft key (SAVE), then press [OFF].

Automatic Answering Operation

The Answering System allows the unit to answer calls with a greeting message. Callers can then leave a message. While recording, "Answering" and "INUSE" will flash on the base unit




- The total recording time of all messages (greeting and incoming) is about 12
 minutes. If messages are recorded in noisy rooms, the time may be shortened
 by up to 3 minutes.
- To select the caller's recording time, see page 25.
- A maximum of 64 messages (including the greeting message) can be recorded.

Setting the Unit to Answer Calls Base Unit

Press [ANSWER ON] to turn on the Answering System.

- The indicator lights and the unit announces "Answer set" and the current day and time.
- The unit will announce the remaining recording time if it is less than 5 minutes.



- When no recording time is available, you will need to erase any unnecessary messages before new messages can be recorded (p. 59). The unit can indicate that memory is full in the following ways:
 - "MESSAGE FULL" will flash on the base unit and the ANSWER ON indicator will flash rapidly.
 - The unit will announce "Memory full" when you press [ANSWER ON] or press and hold [GREETING], and after playing back messages or recording a message.
- If you do not want the unit to answer calls, press [ANSWER ON] again to turn off the Answering System. The indicator light goes out and "Answer off" is heard.
- You can also turn on the Answering System remotely from the cordless handset (p. 57) or an outside phone (p. 64).
- If you subscribe to Caller ID (p. 33), Caller ID information automatically adjusts the date and time when a call is received, provided you have already set the date and time manually (p. 18).

Automatic Answering Operation

Monitoring incoming calls

While a caller is leaving a message, you can monitor it through the base unit speaker.

To increase the speaker volume, press [▲]. To decrease, press [▼].

To answer the call with the base unit, lift the handset off the cradle or press **[DIGITAL SP-PHONE]**. For the cordless handset, press $[\]$ or $[\]$. The unit will stop recording.

To turn the Call Monitoring feature off on the base unit

If this feature is not required, turn it off.

- 1. Press [FUNCTION/EDIT].
- Press [▶] at "Telephone".
- 3. Scroll to "Initial setting" by pressing [▼] or [▲], then press [▶].
- 4. Scroll to "Set answering" by pressing [▼] or [▲], then press [▶].
- 5. Scroll to "Call monitoring" by pressing [▼] or [▲], then press [▶].
- 6. Select "off" by pressing [▼] or [▲].
- 7. Press [▶] (Save), then press [STOP].
- To turn this feature on, select "on" in step 6.

Listening to Messages

Voice Day/Time Stamp: During playback, the unit will announce the day and time when each message was recorded (p. 18).

Using the Base Unit Base Unit

If the ANSWER ON indicator and "MESSAGES" flash, new messages have been recorded.

• If there are only old messages, "MESSAGES" will be displayed but will not flash. If there are no messages, "MESSAGES" will not be displayed.



To play back messages

Press [PLAYBACK].

- The display shows the total number of recorded messages.
- The unit announces the number of new messages and only new messages are played back.
- When you have no new messages, the unit announces "No new messages. All message playback" and plays back all messages.
- During playback, the display shows the message number.
- At the end of the last message, "End of final message" is heard. The unit will announce the remaining recording time if it is less than 5 minutes.
- When there are no messages, the unit announces "No messages".
- If a call is being received during playback, the unit rings and playback stops. To answer the call, lift the handset or press [DIGITAL SP-PHONE]. For playback, start again from the beginning after hanging up.

If "PLAY" flashes, there are new messages. If there are only old messages or no messages, "PLAY" will be displayed but will not flash.

To play back messages

 - To switch to the receiver, press [~]. To switch back to the speaker, press [ዺ].
 - When you have no new messages, the unit announces "No new messages. All message playback" and plays back all messages.

For Caller ID service users (p. 33)

Cordless handset: Press the soft key (DIAL) while the number is displayed.

- The unit stops playback and dials the phone number.
- If you need to edit the phone number to call back, see page 36.
- After listening to new incoming messages, " $\sqrt{}$ " will be added to the call entries in the base unit Caller List, but those of the cordless handset Caller List will still remain NEW (p. 34).

Erasing Messages

The unit will announce the remaining recording time after playback, if it is less than 5 minutes. New messages cannot be recorded when:

- "Memory full" is heard.
- "MESSAGE FULL" is displayed on the base unit.
- ANSWER ON indicator flashes rapidly (only when the Answering System is on). Erase unnecessary messages. We recommend you erase unnecessary messages after each playback.

Erasing a specific message

Base Unit

Press [ERASE] while the message you want to erase is being played.

- A beep will sound and the unit will continue to play the next message.
- To end playback, press [STOP] 2 times.

Handset

Press [*][4] while the message you want to erase is being played.

- A beep will sound and the unit will continue to play the next message.
- To end remote operation, press [OFF].



Transferring a Call to the Answering System

Tell the outside caller you will transfer him or her to the Answering System.

Press [LOCATOR/INTERCOM/TRANSFER]. Cordless handset:

Press [HOLD] (TRANSFER).

• The call is put on hold.

After you press [9]:

The caller will hear the greeting (p. 24), then he or she can leave a message after the beep.

 Even if you subscribe to Caller ID service (p. 33), Caller ID information will not be displayed while the caller is recording a message or the message is being played. The Caller ID information will be recorded in the Caller List (p. 34) if the transferred call is an incoming call.

Interrupting remote operation

If another user is calling the unit from a remote location to operate the Answering System, and you mistakenly answer the call, you do not have to hang up the call. Go to steps 1 and 2 above.

• The user can then operate the Answering System, by entering the remote code (see "Remote Operation from a Touch Tone Phone" on page 61).

While outside, you can operate the Answering System from any touch tone phone. A synthesized voice menu will guide you through the Answering System (p. 63).

 To skip the voice menu and operate the unit directly, see page 64.



Summary of remote operation

Call your unit from a touch tone phone.



Enter your remote code (p. 62) during or after the greeting.

• The number of new messages is heard, and new messages will be played.*





Voice Menu

The shaded parts are voice prompts.

- If you hear "Memory full" after playback, erase unnecessary messages (p. 64).

Turning on the Answering System

Call your unit and wait for 12 rings.

- The unit will answer and the greeting will be played.
- The Answering System will turn on. Hang up or enter the remote code for other options.
- When turning on the Answering System using a rotary or pulse service telephone, you cannot enter the remote code for other options.

Skipping the greeting


















Wall Template for the Charger unit





