


Full duplex digital speakerphone lets both parties speak simultaneously without cutoffs or interruptions. You can also use the remote control to operate the unit.



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
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Location of Controls



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



Installing the Battery in the Remote Control

While pressing down notch (A), pull out the battery tray by inserting your fingernail in notch (B).



2 Install the battery with the plus side up, then insert the tray until it locks.



- Please refer to page 21 for correct battery usage.
- Install the battery properly.
- Keep the battery away from children.

Battery Replacement:


- Replace the battery with a Panasonic CR2025 lithium battery only. Use of another battery may present a risk of fire or explosion.
- The battery life is about a year when a new Panasonic battery is used at room temperature. (It may vary depending on usage conditions and ambient temperature.)
- If the remote control only works when in close vicinity to the unit's remote sensor, replace the battery.




Plug in the AC adaptor cord and the telephone line cord to the bottom of the unit.

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
Bottom of the unit





- USE ONLY Panasonic AC ADAPTOR KX-TCA6.
- The AC adaptor must remain connected at all times. (It may feel warm during use. This is normal.)
- If you connect a reserve telephone on the same line, see page 17.
- This product can be used with a PBX that can support an analog port. Please contact your PBX dealer for more information.

When using the remote control, point the infrared transmitter towards the remote sensor within the unit's maximum operating range.






Making Calls

- 1 Press (**DIGITAL SP-PHONE**) on the remote control.
 - The DIGITAL SP-PHONE indicator on the unit lights.
- 2
- Dial a telephone number.
- If you misdial, press
 (FLASH) firmly then dial again.
- 3 To hang up, press DIGITAL SP-PHONE.
 - The indicator light goes out.



• You can also use (DIGITAL SP-PHONE) on the unit in steps 1 and 3.



To adjust the speaker volume (12 levels)

To increase, press \checkmark . To decrease, press \checkmark .

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Full Duplex Digital Speakerphone

For best performance, please note the following:

- At the beginning of a call, both parties should speak alternately. This enables the unit to adapt to its environment and let both parties speak simultaneously.
- If the other party's voice from the speaker cuts in/out during a conversation, press V to decrease the speaker volume.
- Use the speakerphone in a quiet room.

To redial the last number

Press DIGITAL SP-PHONE) → (REDIAL).

To put a call on hold

Press (HOLD).

- The DIGITAL SP-PHONE indicator on the unit flashes.
- If you put a call on hold for 6 minutes, a warning tone will sound. The call will be disconnected after a total of 10 minutes.

To release the hold

Press DIGITAL SP-PHONE.


• If another phone is connected on the same line (p. 17), you can also release the hold by lifting its handset.

About the DIGITAL SP-PHONE button on the unit


The (**DIGITAL SP-PHONE**) button on the unit uses non-radioactive luminescent material which can absorb light energy of sunlight or lamps (incandescent, fluorescent, halogen, etc.) and release this absorbed light for darkened room operation.

Notice:

- As the absorbed energy in the **DIGITAL SP-PHONE** button material decreases, the button brightness will fade naturally.
- Button brightness and duration depends on the amount of room lighting and exposure time.




• When set to OFF, the unit will not ring.



Storing Phone Numbers in Memory

You can store up to 10 numbers in the unit using the remote control. The dialing buttons (0 to 9) function as memory stations. **The DIGITAL SP-PHONE indicator light must be off. Point the infrared transmitter towards the remote sensor while storing.**

- Press (PROGRAM).
- The MUTE/PROGRAM indicator on the unit flashes.
- 2 Enter a phone number up to 16 digits.
 - If you misdial, press
 (PROGRAM) to end storing, then restart from step 1.




Press (AUTO).

Press a memory station number (0 to 9).

- A confirmation tone sounds. (See next page.)
- To store other numbers, repeat steps 1 through 4.



MUTE/PROGRAM Indicator

• If the AC adaptor is disconnected for more than 3 days, the stored numbers should be confirmed again before dialing.

What the confirmation tone means

1 beep: The new number is stored.

2 beeps: The number is the same as a previously stored one.

To erase a stored number


Press **PROGRAM** \rightarrow **AUTO** \rightarrow the memory station number (0 to 9) for the phone number to be erased.

Memory sticker


Use the included memory sticker as a name or phone number index for automatic dialing. Attach the sticker to the unit or in a convenient place.

Special Features



Indicator

For Call Waiting Service Users

Press FLASH lightly if you hear a call-waiting tone while talking.

- The first call is put on hold and you can answer the second call.
- To return to the first caller, press (FLASH) again.

Temporary Tone Dialing (For Rotary Service Users)

Press (TONE) before entering access numbers which require tone dialing.

• The dialing mode changes to tone. You can enter numbers to access answering systems, electronic banking services, etc. When you hang up, the mode returns to pulse.

If Your Unit is Connected to a PBX

We recommend you press **PAUSE** between the access number for an outside line and the phone number.

• Pressing (PAUSE) once creates a 3.5 second pause. This prevents misdialing when you redial or dial a stored number. (PAUSE) counts as one digit.)


Muting Your Conversation

Press (MUTE) while talking. (The MUTE/PROGRAM indicator lights.)

- The other party cannot hear your voice but you can hear theirs.
- To resume the conversation, press (MUTE) again.

Adding Another Phone


If you lose or cannot use the remote control, you can connect a standard telephone to dial a number as shown below. Once the call is made, turn on the unit's speakerphone. Then hang up the standard telephone.



• During a power failure, the unit will not function. Use the standard telephone.

If you connect the unit to a cassette tape recorder, you can record a conversation on a standard audio tape.

Connect the unit to a cassette tape recorder.
 (Use a mini audio plug to connect the unit and refer to the tape recorder operating manual for the type and size of plug to be used.)



- 2 Press the recording button on the cassette tape recorder during a conversation.
- If you press (VOLUME) (\land or \checkmark) to change the speaker volume while recording a conversation, the recording volume will change accordingly.

Many states have imposed regulations on the manner in which 2-way telephone conversations may be recorded, so you should inform the other party that the conversation is being recorded. Consult your local telephone company for further information.

Before Requesting Help

Problem	Remedy
The unit does not work.	Check the settings (p. 7-9).
The unit stops working during operation.	 Unplug the AC adaptor to reset. Plug in, then try again. Re-insert the remote control battery and try again.
The unit does not ring.	 The RINGER selector is set to OFF. Set to HIGH or LOW.

Before Requesting Help

Problem	Remedy
Short silences, echoes, or speech cuts occur during conversations.	 Do not move the unit while it is in use. Keep your hands away from the unit during calls. Keep files, cups, coffee pots, etc., away from the unit. At the beginning of a call, both parties should speak alternately. This enables the unit to adapt to its environment and let both parties speak simultaneously. The other party's phone might not be full duplex. For best sound quality, the other party should use a handset phone or full duplex speakerphone.
While storing a phone number, the unit starts to ring.	• To answer the call, press (DIGITAL SP-PHONE). The program will be canceled. Store the number again.
You cannot store a phone number in memory.	 You cannot store a number during a conversation. Do not pause for over 30 seconds while programming. Point the infrared transmitter towards the remote sensor while storing.
The remote control does not work.	 Move closer or in range of the unit (p. 10). Move the unit's remote sensor away from strong light, such as direct sunlight. The battery power is low. Replace with a new one (p. 7). Install the battery correctly (p. 7). Clean the remote sensor and the infrared transmitter with a soft, dry cloth.
The POWER indicator light never goes out while the AC adaptor is connected.	• This is normal.

Important Safety Instructions

Ringer Equivalence No. (REN):

The REN is useful in determining the quantity of devices you may connect to your telephone line and still have all of those devices ring when your telephone number is called. In most, but not all areas, the sum of the REN's of all devices connected to one line should not exceed five (5.0). To be certain of the number of devices you may connect to your line, as determined by the REN, you should contact your local telephone company to determine the maximum REN for your calling area.

In the event terminal equipment causes harm to the telephone network, the telephone company should notify the customer, if possible, that service may be stopped.

However, where prior notice is impractical, the company may temporarily cease service providing that they:

- (a) Promptly notify the customer.
- (b) Give the customer an opportunity to correct the problem with their equipment.
