

**Note to CATV System Installer:** This reminder is provided to call the CATV system installer's attention to Article 820–40 of the NEC that provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as practical

#### Safety Instructions for Television Receivers

- 1 Read and apply the operating instructions provided with your television receiver
- 2 Read all of the instructions given here and retain them for later use
- 3 Unplug this television receiver from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.
- 4 Do not use attachments not recommended by the television receiver manufacturer as they may cause hazards
- 5 Do not use this television receiver near water. For example, Avoid placing it near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool, etc.
- On not place this television receiver on an unstable cart, stand or table. The television receiver may fall, causing serious injury to a child or adult, and serious damage to the appliance. Use only with a cart or stand recommended by the manufacturer, or sold with the television receiver. Wall or shelf mounting should follow the manufacturer's instructions, and should use a mounting kit approved by the manufacturer.
- 6A An appliance and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the appliance and cart combination to overturn.
- 7 Slots and openings in the cabinet and the back or bottom are provided for ventilation, and to insure reliable operation of the television receiver and to protect it from overheating. These openings must not be blocked or covered. The openings should never be blocked by placing the television receiver on a bed, sofa, rug or other similar surface. This television receiver should never be placed near or over a radiator or heat register. This television receiver should not be placed in a built-in installation such as a bookcase unless proper ventilation is provided.
- 8 Operate only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supplied to your home consult your television dealer or local power company. For television receivers designed to operate from battery power, refer to the operating instructions.
- This television receiver is equipped with a polarized alternating-current line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other). This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug.
  - fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug
- 10 Do not allow anything to rest on the power cord. Do not locate this television receiver where the cord will be abused by persons walking on it
- 11 Follow all warnings and instructions marked on the television receiver
- 12 Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in fire or electric shock
- 13 Never push objects of any kind into this lelevision receiver through cabinet slots as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short out parts that could result in a fire or electric shock Never spill liquid of any kind on the television receiver



- 14 If an outside antenna is connected to the television equipment, be sure the antenna system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built up static charges. In the U.S. Section 810 of the National Electrical Code and in Canada Part 1 of the Canadian Electrical Code provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead—in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna—discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode See Figure.
- 15 For added protection for this television receiver during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna. This will prevent damage to the receiver due to lightning and power-line surges.
- 16 An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal
- 17 Unplug this television receiver from the wall outlet, and refer servicing to qualified service personnel under the following conditions
  - a When the power cord or plug is damaged or frayed
  - b If liquid has been spilled into the television receiver
  - c If the television receiver has been exposed to rain or water
  - d If the television receiver does not operate normally by following the operating instructions. Adjust only those controls that are covered by the operating instructions as improper adjustment of other controls may result in damage and will often require extensive work by a qualified technician to restore the television receiver to normal operation
  - e If the television receiver has been dropped or the cabinet has been damaged
  - When the television receiver exhibits a distinct change in performance this indicates a need for service
- 18 Do not attempt to service this television receiver yourself as opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous voltage or other hazards. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.
- 19 When replacement parts are required, be sure the service technician has used replacement parts specified by the manufacturer that have the same characteristics as the original part. Unauthorized substitutions may result in fire, electric shock, or other hazards.
- 20 Upon completion of any service or repairs to this television receiver, ask the service technician to perform routine safety checks to determine that the television is in safe operating condition

#### **Receiver Location**

#### Installation

This unit can be used as an entertainment center. Consult your dealer for available options. Locate for comfortable viewing. Avoid placing where sunlight or other bright light (including reflections) will fall on the screen.

Use of some types of fluorescent lighting can reduce remote control transmitter range

Adequate ventilation is essential to prevent internal component failure. Keep away from areas of excessive heat or moisture.

To insure optimum color purily do not position magnetic equipment (motors, fans, external speakers, etc.) nearby

#### **Optional External Equipment Connections**

The Video/Audio connections between components should be made with shielded video and audio cables. For best performance, video cables should utilize 75 ohm coaxial shielded wire. Cables are available from your dealer or electronic supply house.


Before you purchase any cables, be sure you know what type of input and output connectors your various components require. Also determine the length of cable you'll need.

#### Condensation

When the set is moved into a warm room from a cold area, the picture may become out of focus because of condensation on the lens surface due to the temperature change. Picture will become clear when the set reaches the same temperature of the surrounding area.

#### **AC Power Supply Cord**

**CAUTION:** To prevent electric shock, match wide blade of plug to wide slot of AC outlet and fully insert. DO NOT USE this (polarized) plug with a receptacle or other outlet unless the blade can be fully inserted to prevent blade exposure.



#### Remote Control Battery Installation \_\_\_\_\_\_

Batteries Use two "AA" batteries

- 1 Turn the Transmitter face down To remove top cover, press down on marking and slide cover off in the direction indicated
- 2 Install the batteries as shown in the battery compartment (Polarity (+) or (-) must be correct)
- 3 Replace the cover and slide in reverse until the lock snaps

#### Helpful Hints:

For frequent Remote Control users, replace old batteries with Alkaline batteries for longer life

Note: In order to maximize the life of the batteries, the lighted buttons on the Remote Control can be turned OFF and ON by pressing R-TUNE and RECALL at the same time.


**CAUTION:** Incorrect installation can cause battery leakage and corrosion that will damage the Remote Control Transmitter


#### Observe the Following Precautions:

- Batteries should be replaced as a pair Always use new batteries when replacing the old set
- 2 Do not combine a used battery with a new one
- 3 Do not mix battery types (Example "Zinc Carbon" with "Alkaline")
- 4 Do not attempt to charge, short-circuit, disassemble, heat or burn used hatteries
- 5 Battery replacement is necessary when Remote Control reacts sporadically or stops operating the Receiver

#### Helpful-Hints:

Whenever you remove the batteries to replace them, you may need to reset the Remote Control Infrared Codes. We recommend that you initially record the codes on page 51, prior to setting up the remote



#### Antenna/Cable Connections

Antenna Connection – For proper reception of VHF/UHF channels, an external antenna is required. For best reception an outdoor antenna is recommended Antenna Mode must be set to TV. (Refer to Antenna Mode section.)




Typical VHF/UHF Antenna

#### Incoming Cable From Home Antenna (75 Ohm)




#### Incoming Cable From Home Antenna (300 Ohm)



**Cable Connection** – For reception of cable channels, connect the cable supplied by your local cable company. Antenna Mode must be set to CABLE. (Refer to Antenna Mode section.)

NOTE: Certain cable systems offset some channels to reduce interference or have Premium (scrambled) channels. A cable converter box is required for proper reception. Check with your local Cable company for compatibility requirements.

#### Other Video Equipment

VCRs, Video Disc Players, Computers, TV games, and Teletext equipment can also be connected to the antenna input connection

#### Installing Your StarSight TV Set

- 1 Determine if a Cable Box or VCR is going to be connected to the TV
- 2 Connect the TV according to the following illustrations
- 3 Turn the equipment on (TV, Cable Box, VCR) and set up the TV mode and antenna input using the SET-UP FEATURES and INPUT SELECT sections of this manual
  - Antenna users, please select "TV" in the SET UP menu
  - Cable users, please select "CABLE" in the SET UP menu
  - If a Cable Box is used, select "ANT 2" in the INPUT SELECT menu and tune the TV to the appropriate channel for the Cable Box (usually channel 3 or 4)
  - If no Cable Box is used, select "ANT 1" in the INPUT SELECT menu.
- Follow the instructions in the StarSight Installation and Activation Guide located in the back of this manual to complete StarSight activation




#### StarSight Antenna Connection (No Cable Box or VCR)

#### StarSight Antenna Connection (VCR, no Cable Box)






#### StarSight Antenna Connection (Cable Box, no VCR)







**Adjustment** – When an audio amp is connected to "TO AUDIO AMP" terminals

- 1 Select SPEAKER "ON" Mode (Refer to the Audio Menu Speaker section)
- Set volume of audio amp to near minimum
- 3 Adjust volume of TV to desired listening level
- 4 Adjust volume of audio amp to match the volume of the TV
- 5 Select SPEAKER "OFF&VAO" (Variable Audio Output) Mode (Refer to the Audio Menu Speaker section )
- 6 Audio bass, treble, balance, volume, and mute can now be controlled by the TV Remote Control When "OFF&FAO" (Fix Audio Output) mode is selected in the Audio Menu, the external amplifier speakers are controlled by the Audio Amplifier



- S-Video is only available with VIDEO 1 and VIDEO 2
- Connection of optional S-Video automatically disconnects the 'normal INPUT 1 or 2 Video terminal
- 3 Operate optional equipment (VCR-VDP) as instructed in the manual that came with that equipment




#### Picture in Picture External Video and Antenna Connection

This Receiver has the "PICTURE IN PICTURE" feature that uses two tuners. This allows you to watch two (2) live broadcasts at the same time without an external video source. Press the PIP button to display the PIP frame. (See PIP Antenna Connection, Detail 1.) If you wish an external video source (VCR, Laser Disc Player, or Camcorder) may be monitored in the PIP Frame. (See PIP External Video Connection, Detail 2.)


Detail 1 - PIP Antenna 1 Connection



#### Detail 2 - PIP External Video Connection





#### **Quick Reference Control Operation**

- 1) Power Button Press to turn ON or OFF
- Volume Buttons Press to adjust Sound Level Press to adjust Audio Menus, Video Menus, and select operating features when menus are displayed
- 3 Channel Buttons Press to select programmed channels Press to highlight desired leatures when menus are displayed
- (4) Action Button Press to display Main Menu and access or exit On-Screen feature and Adjustment Menus
- TV/Video Button Press to select TV, or one of four Video Inputs for the Main Picture, or the PIP Irame (when the PIP Irame is displayed)

Note: In order to maximize the life of the batteries, the lights can be turned OFF and ON by pressing R-TUNE and RECALL at the same time.

#### Helpful Hints:

If the selected component does not respond to the remote control, ensure that the proper mode is selected **First**, press the **Mode Selection Button** that corresponds to that component For example, after first pressing the TV Mode Button, the remote will remain in the TV mode for any following commands. If another mode button is pressed while operating the television, the TV mode button must be pressed again to reset the TV mode condition.

#### Basic Remote Control Functions for Television Operation

The following is a basic overview of the remote control unit for television operation. Ensure the TV mode is selected by initially pressing.

- (1) Power Button Press to turn the TV ON or OFF
- 2 Volume Buttons Press to adjust TV sound level Use with Channel buttons to navigate in menus
- 3 Channel Buttons Press to select channels Use with Volume buttons to navigate in menus
- Action Button Press to display Main Menu and access or exit On-Screen feature and Adjustment Menus
- TV/Video Button Press to select TV or one of four (4)
  Video Inputs, for the Main Picture or the PIP frame when
  the PIP frame is displayed
- 6 Mute Button Press to mute sound A second press returns sound
- 7 Numeric Keypad (0 through 9 Buttons) Press desired channel number to access any channel
- B R-Tune (Rapid Tune) Button Press to switch to the previous channel
- Recall Button Press to display Time, status of Sleep Timer, Channel, Video Mode, Channel Caption (Station Identifier), and Audio Mode
- Size Button Press to select size of PIP frame when the PIP frame is displayed
- Move Button Press to position PIP frame to any corner of the Main Picture when PIP frame is displayed
- Freeze Button Press to stop action of the Main Picture or PIP frame when the PIP frame is displayed
- PIP (Picture in Picture) Button Press to display the PIP frame, press again to remove PIP frame
- Swap Button Press to interchange PIP frame with Main Picture when the PIP frame is displayed
- Search Button This button is used to select PIP Search to automatically scan channels within the PIP Frame
- Multi Button Programmable to operate up to six (6)
  Remote Function buttons simultaneously
- VCR Function Buttons Programmable to operate many brands of VCR's
- Mode Selection Buttons Selects the operation mode for the remote control
- VCR/DSS (PIP) Channel Buttons These buttons are used to select VCR or DSS channels UP or Down, or to move the channels within the PIP frame UP or DOWN
- StarSight Buttons These buttons are used to operate the StarSight On–Screen TV Program Guide A subscription is required to activate these functions

#### Care and Cleaning

#### **Plastic Cabinets**

Wipe the cabinet with a soft cloth dampened with water or a mild detergent solution and lwipe dry with a soft clean cloth Avoid excessive moisture. Do not use benzene, thinners or other petroleum based cleaners.

#### Wood Cabinets

When dusting or polishing the cabinet, use a clean soft cloth and stroke straight with the grain. An occasional coat of furniture polish will help preserve the finish. Do not use benzene, thinners or other petroleum based cleaners. Do not place objects made of plastic or rubber directly on top of the cabinet. A chemical reaction could result causing permanent marring of the finish.

#### **Remote Control Transmitter**

Do not use benzene, thinners or other petroleum based cleaners to clean the Remote Control Transmitter. To clean, wipe with a soft cloth slightly moistened with a mild detergent and then wipe dry with a soft clean cloth.

#### Screen Caution

Your Projection screen may be marred by accidental contacts or improper cleaning Avoid BUMPING or SCRAPING the screen BY ANY OBJECTS

#### Screen Cleaning

The projection screen has a protective shield which is fully washable by using these following precautions. Use a mild soap solution or window cleaner and a clean cloth. Do not use laundry detergent, automatic dishwasher soap, abrasive cleaners, products containing alcohol, ammonia or petroleum distillates. Avoid excessive moisture and wipe dry






