

INSTALLATION

1 POWER SOURCE CAUTION

Operate only from a power source indicated on the unit or in this manual.

If necessary, have your Electric Utility Service Company or Video Products Dealer verify the power source in your

2 POLARIZED OR GROUNDING PLUG

As a safety feature, this Video product comes with either a polarized power cord plug (one blade is wider than the other), or a three-wire grounding type plug.

ARIZED PLUG CAUTION:

This plug will only fit into an outlet one way. If you cannot fully insert the plug, try reversing it. If it still will not fit, have an electrician install the proper wall outlet. Do not defeat the safety feature by tampering with the plug.

GROUNDING PLUG CAUTION: This plug will only fit into a three-hole grounding outlet. If necessary, have an electrician install the proper outlet. Do not defeat the safety feature by tampering with the plug.

3 POWER CORD

Make sure power cords are routed so that they are not likely to have anything rest on them, roll over them, or be in the way of walking traffic.

If an extension cord is used, make sure it also has either a polarized or grounded plug and that the cords can be securely connected.

Frayed cords, damaged plugs, and damaged or cracked wire insulation are hazardous and should be replaced by a qualified service technician.

Overloaded outlets and extension cords are fire hazards and should be avoided.

4 DO NOT BLOCK VENTILATION HOLES

Ventilation openings in the cabinet release heat generated during operation. If they are blocked, heat build-up inside the unit can cause failures that may result in a fire hazard or heat damage to cassettes. For protection follow these rules:

- a. Never cover ventilation slots or the unit while in use, or operate the unit when placed on a bed, sofa, rug, or other soft surface.
- Avoid built-in installation, such as a book case or rack, unless proper ventilation is provided.

5 AVOID EXTREMELY HOT LOCATIONS OR SUDDEN TEMPERATURE CHANGES

Do not place the unit over or near any kind of heater or regulator, in direct sunlight, inside a closed vehicle, etc... Do not move the unit suddenly between areas of extreme temperature variation. If the unit is suddenly moved from a cold place to a warm place, moisture may condense in the unit and on the tape.

6 TO AVOID PERSONAL INJURY

- Do not place unsecured equipment on a sloping
- Support for the unit should be firm, level, and adequately strong
- An appliance and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the appliance and cart combination to overturn.



OUTDOOR ANTENNA INSTALLATION

1 SAFE ANTENNA AND CABLE CONNECTION

If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the equipment, be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded so as to provide some protection against built up static charges and voltage surges. Section 810 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA 70 (in Canada, part 1 of the Canadian Electrical Code) provides



information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes and requirements for the grounding electrode.

2 KEEP ANTENNA CLEAR OF HIGH VOLTAGE POWER LINES OR CIRCUITS

An outside antenna system should be located well away from power lines, electric light or power circuits and where it will never come into contact with these power sources if it should happen to fall. When installing an outside antenna, extreme care should be taken to avoid touching power lines, circuits or other power sources as this could be fatal. Because of the hazards involved, antenna installation should be left to a professional.

USING THE VIDEO UNIT

If the unit has been in storage or moved to a new location, refer first to the INSTALLATION section of these safeguards.

KEEP THIS VIDEO UNIT AWAY FROM WATER OR MOISTURE OF ANY KIND.

2 IF EQUIPMENT IS EXPOSED TO RAIN, MOISTURE, OR STRONG IMPACT, unplug the unit and have it inspected by a qualified service technician before use.

3 DURING AN ELECTRICAL STORM

During a lightning storm, whether indoors or outdoors, or before leaving the unit unused for extended periods of time, disconnect all equipment from the power source as well as the antenna and cable system.

4 WHEN THE UNIT IS PLUGGED IN

- Never expose the unit to rain or water. DO NOT OPERATE if liquid has been spilled into the unit. Immediately unplug the unit, and have it inspected by a service technician. Fire and shock hazards can result from electrical shorts caused by liquid contact inside.
- Never drop or push any object through openings in the unit. Some internal parts carry hazardous voltages and contact can cause electric shock or fire hazard.
- Avoid placing the unit directly above or below your TV set as this may cause electrical interference. Keep all magnets away from electronic equipment.

5 USING ACCESSORIES

Use only accessories recommended by the manufacturer to avoid risk of fire, shock, or other hazards.

6 CLEANING THE UNIT

Unplug the unit. Then, use a clean, dry, chemically untreated cloth to gently remove dust or debris. DO NOT USE cleaning fluids, aerosols, or forced air that could over-spray, or seep into the unit and cause electrical shock. Any substance such as wax, adhesive tape, etc. may mar the cabinet surface. Exposure to greasy, humid, or dusty areas may adversely affect internal parts.







Erase Protection (Record Tab)





SELF-DEMO MODE

In Power ON condition, hold down PLAY/REPEAT on the Combination VCR, with no tape inserted, for 5 seconds. The demo screen appears.

To cancel: Repeat the above operation. The demo screen disappears.

Reset all Combination VCR Memory Functions

Use when moving the Combination VCR to a new location, or if a mistake was made in the One Time Setup section.

- Make sure a tape is not inserted in the Combination VCR.
- 1) Push POWER to turn the Combination VCR on.
- 2) Hold down both the PLAY and REW buttons on the Combination VCR for more than 5 seconds.
 - The power will shut off.
- 3) Turn the power back on and perform the One Time Setup section on page 10.

Head Cleaning

Your Combination VCR will not normally require head cleaning, however the heads may become clogged when playing an old or damaged tape.

Video Heads Sensor System

If head cleaning becomes necessary, the Combination VCR will display the screen at right while playing back a recorded signal. To exit this screen, push PLAY on the remote control or Combination VCR.



Antenna or Cable Connections

Outdoor Antenna Connection

Unhook the antenna from your previous TV or VCR and connect it to the back of the Combination VCR as shown in the diagram. If your antenna system has separate UHF and VHF lead-ins, you need a UHF/VHF Band Mixer (not supplied).



Indoor Antenna Connection

Insert the Indoor antenna (supplied) into the receptacle on the back of the Combination VCR.

Then, connect the two wires to the 300 ohm-75 ohm transformer (supplied).

Next, connect the transformer to the back of the Combination VCR as shown.

Now, extend the antenna and adjust its length, direction and angle for the clearest picture.


Cable Connections


(A) Without a Converter/Descrambler Box With this connection, you can: use your Combination VCR remote control to select channels for viewing and select unscrambled channels for timer recording. Scrambled channels may not be viewed or recorded with this connection.

(B) With a Converter/Descrambler Box With this connection, you may record and view any channel including scrambled channels. Please note, however that channel selection must be made at the cable company converter box. Timer recording is limited to one channel at a time, and you can only view the channel you are recording.

To Watch and Record Scrambled/ Unscrambled Channels

Set the Combination VCR to the output channel of the cable converter box (e.g. CH3). Now, select channels to be viewed or recorded at the cable converter box.



Connecting to a Power Source

Your Combination VCR goes where you go with two different ways to supply power. You may connect the supplied AC (alternate current) cord for use with any AC outlet. Or when travelling, connect the supplied DC (direct current) Car Battery cord which can be inserted in your vehicle's cigarette lighter. For your safety and to avoid damage to the Combination VCR, please follow instructions and connections carefully.

Connecting the (supplied) AC Cord

- 1.Connect the supplied AC cord to the AC input jack on the back of the Combination VCR as
- 2. Plug the AC cord into an AC wall outlet.




Connecting the (supplied) DC Car Battery Cord

- Connect the DC Car Battery cord to the DC input on the back of the Combination VCR as shown.
- 2. Start the engine of your vehicle.
- <u>DO NOT</u> insert the cord into the cigarette lighter until the engine is running.
- 3. Remove the cigarette lighter from it's socket and insert the Car Battery plug in it's place.

IMPORTANT NOTES

- This cord can only be used in vehicles equipped with DC 12V (negative ground) batteries. Check your car's owner's manual.
- Use the only the Car Battery cord packed with your Combination VCR.
- To avoid a loss voltage, do not attach an extension to the Car Battery cord.
- When unit is not in use, disconnect the Car Battery cord from the cigarette lighter socket to save car battery.




Replacing the DC Car Cord Fuse

If the safety fuse in the car cord plug blows out, replace it as follows.


- 1. Unscrew the cap (counterclockwise).





Rear View of the Combination VCR






Dew Detection System

To prevent damage to your tapes, this unit is equipped with a dew detection system. When moisture condensation is detected inside the Combination VCR, "DEW" will appear on-screen for a few seconds. If a tape is inserted, it will be ejected. Also, VCR functions will be non-operational until dew condition passes. Push DISPLAY to see if dew condition still exists. In order to avoid this condition, try not to move the unit directly from a cold place to a warm place. TV functions are not affected.



In Playback mode, when a Video signal is not detected for 5 minutes, the Combination VCR will automatically power off and the tape will be rewound.

This feature is deactivated when any button on the Combination VCR or remote control is pushed even if there is no signal present.

Auto Playback

When a tape is inserted, the power turns on (Auto). If the record tab* is removed, playback begins (Auto).

This feature cannot be activated when the POWER button on the Combination VCR is turned OFF (POWER indicator is not lit).

Auto Rewind

When a tape reaches its end during playback or fast forward the Combination VCR will rewind and go into Stop mode.

- When POWER on the Combination VCR is OFF (DC power source), it's the same as if the Combination VCR were unplugged. Therefore, all memory data, i.e. clock data, etc. is erased in approximately one minute.
- If there is a loss in battery voltage of more than 30 seconds, the Combination VCR automatically shuts off. When normal voltage is restored, pushed POWER on the Combination VCR OFF and then ON.
