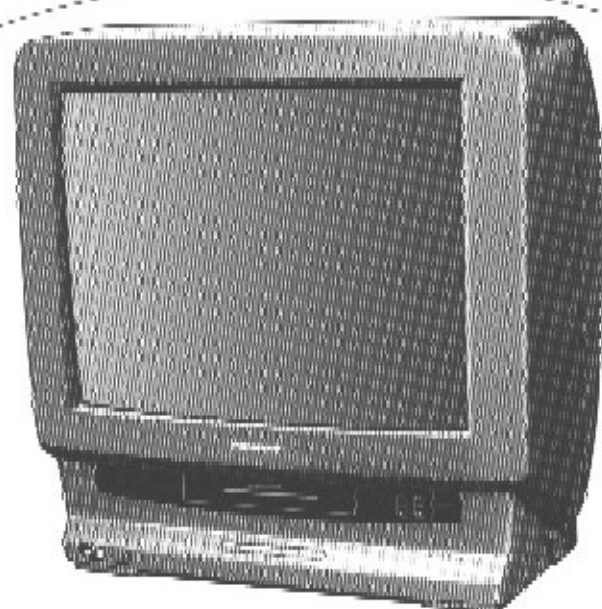

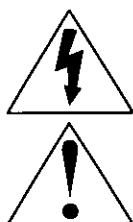
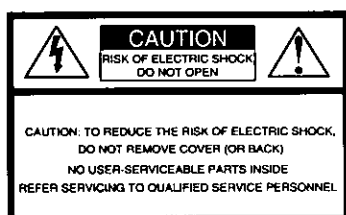

INTRODUCTION

Careful attention has been given to this Video product to assure a quality standard devoted to your safety and enjoyment. This quality standard together with your personal responsibility for the safety of yourself and others, will contribute to your enjoyment. This Video product uses electrical energy and requires proper handling at all times.

CAUTION

READ AND RETAIN THE SAFETY AND OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS
To make full use of the safeguards incorporated in this unit, read and follow this basic guide, adopted in part from Underwriter's Laboratories Standard 1409, Second Edition, before operating this Video product.

FOLLOW THE INSTRUCTIONS AND BE SURE TO HEED ALL WARNINGS on unit and in the manual, for easy maintenance, proper and trouble free operation of this Video product.

INSTALLATION

1. **OPERATE FROM A POWER SOURCE INDICATED** on this Video product, or in this Manual. Your Electric Utility Service Company or Video Products Dealer will be happy to verify the power source in your home.

2. **THE GROUNDED OR POLARIZED PLUG IS A SAFETY FEATURE**
This Video product may be equipped with either a polarized 2-wire AC line plug or a 3-wire grounding type plug. The two wire polarized plug (having one blade wider than the other) will fit into the power outlet only one way. If it is a three wire grounding type plug (having a third pin), it will fit into a grounding type outlet.

DO NOT DEFEAT THE SAFETY PURPOSE OF THE GROUNDED OR POLARIZED PLUG by tampering with it. If the plug does not fit fully into the socket, try reversing it. If you should still be unable to fully insert the plug into the socket, you may find that a proper outlet is needed to meet today's Electrical Standards. An electrician will replace your outlet safely.

3. **POWER SUPPLY CORDS SHOULD BE PROTECTED** and routed so that they are not likely to have anything rest on them, roll over them, or be subject to walking traffic or abuse: particularly at plug-ins, convenience receptacles, or cord exit points from the unit. Where an extension is needed, use a grounded or polarized cord.

HAZARDOUS FRAYED CORDS OR DAMAGED PLUGS SHOULD BE REPLACED BY A QUALIFIED SERVICE TECHNICIAN.

OVERLOADED WALL OUTLETS AND EXTENSION CORDS PRESENT DANGEROUS RISKS OF FIRE OR ELECTRICAL SHOCK.

4. **AVOID BLOCKING VENTILATION HOLES**

Your video unit has ventilation openings in its cabinet to release heat generated during operation. Blocking these opening can cause heat build-up inside the unit, causing failure that may result in a fire hazard or heat damage to cassettes. For protection:

a. Never cover the bottom ventilation slots or the unit with soft material, or operate the unit placed on a bed, sofa, rug, or soft accessory.

b. Avoid built-in installations, such as a bookcase or rack, unless proper ventilation is provided.

5. **AVOID EXTREMELY HOT LOCATIONS OR SUDDEN CHANGES IN TEMPERATURE** such as placing the unit near or over a radiator, in direct sunlight, closed vehicles, or transporting it suddenly between areas of extreme temperature variation.

If the unit is suddenly moved from a cold place to a warm place, moisture may form on the tape and inside the unit.

6. **TO AVOID INJURY TO A CHILD, ADULT; OR COSTLY DAMAGE:**

a. Do not place unsecured equipment on a sloping surface or any heavy object or unit.

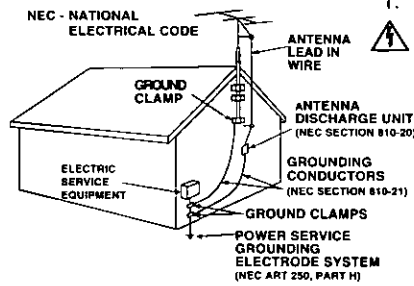
(Use the unit in a horizontal position and do not place anything heavy on it.)

b. Support for the unit should be adequately firm, level, and strong. Replace any unstable cart, table or support. An appliance and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the appliance and cart combination to overturn.

c. Carefully follow all operating instructions and use the manufacturer's recommended accessories when operating this unit or connecting it to any other equipment.



OUTSIDE ANTENNA, EQUIPMENT, AND POWERLINE EXPOSURE



1. **INSURE SAFE ANTENNA AND CABLE CONNECTIONS**
If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the equipment, be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded so as to provide some protection against built up static charges and voltage surges. Part 1 of the Canadian Electrical Code, in USA Section 810 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA

70, provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes and requirements for the grounding electrode.

2. **ELIMINATE ANTENNA PROXIMITY TO HIGH VOLTAGE POWER SOURCES, OR CHANCE OF ACCIDENTAL CONTACT BY INSTALLER**
An outside antenna system should be located where it will never be reached by power lines, electric light or power circuits and where it will never contact these power sources if it falls. Installer should use extreme care to avoid possible fatal contact by touching power lines, circuits or other power sources when installing an outside antenna.

USE

AFTER STORING OR WHEN MOVING THE UNIT, REFER TO THE INSTALLATION SECTION OF THE SAFEGUARDS.

1. **DO NOT USE THIS VIDEO UNIT NEAR WATER:** around bathtubs, sinks, laundry, wet basement, swimming pool or any water source.
2. **USE ACCESSORIES RECOMMENDED ONLY BY THE MANUFACTURER** to avoid risk of fire, shock or other hazards.
3. **UNPLUG ALL EQUIPMENT EXPOSED TO RAIN, MOISTURE, OR STRONG IMPACT AND GET A QUALIFIED INSPECTION**
If your unit has been exposed to rain, water, excessive moisture, or subjected to strong impact, unplug it and have it inspected by a service technician before use.
4. **UNPLUG UNUSED UNIT, AND ALL EQUIPMENT DURING A STORM**
During a lightning storm, when indoors or outdoors, or before leaving unit unused for extended periods of time, disconnect all equipment from power source, antenna and cable system.

Any substance such as wax, adhesive tape, etc. may affect the cabinet surface. Exposure to greasy, humid, or dusty areas may affect internal parts.
6. **WHEN PLUGGED-IN: KEEP WATER AWAY; NO FINGERS INSIDE NOR ANY OBJECTS INSIDE; AND NO MAGNETS OR ELECTRICAL INTERFERENCE NEARBY.**
 - a. Never operate the unit if liquid has been spilled into it. Immediately unplug the unit, and have it inspected by a service technician. Fire and shock hazards can result from electrical shorts caused by liquid contact inside.

Load the batteries in the Remote Control

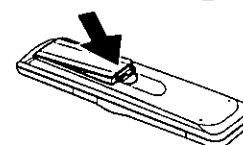
1 Lift off the lid after pressing in and up on the latch with your thumb nail or other narrow object.



2 Install two batteries as indicated inside the Battery Compartment.



3 Fit the lid's hinge piece into the indent on the case, and snap lid into place.

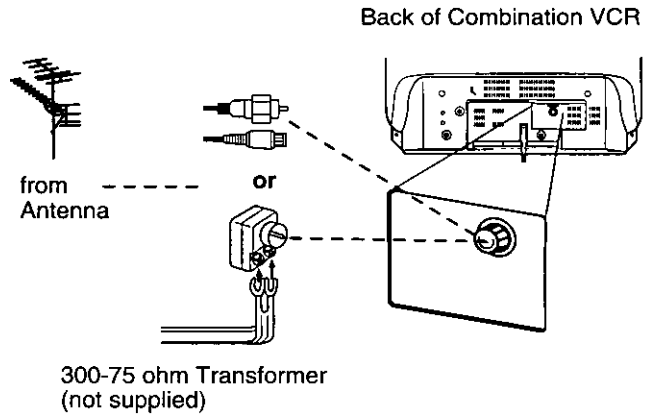

Basic and Cable Connections

Outdoor Antenna Connection

Unhook the antenna from your previous TV or VCR and connect it to the back of the Combination VCR as shown in the diagram. If your antenna system has separate UHF and VHF lead-ins, you need a UHF/VHF Band Mixer (not supplied).



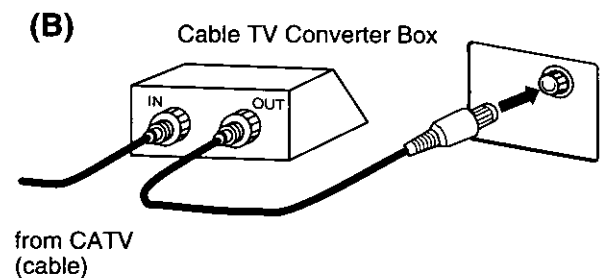
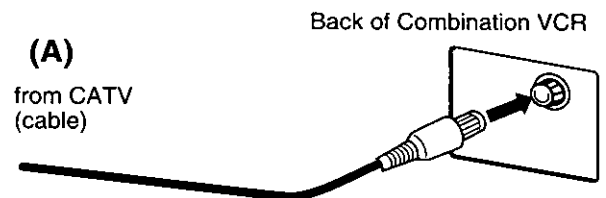
Cable Connections

(A) Without a Converter/Descrambler Box

With this connection, you can: use your Combination VCR remote control to select channels for viewing and select unscrambled channels for timer recording. Scrambled channels may not be viewed or recorded with this connection.

(B) With a Converter/Descrambler Box

With this connection, you may record and view any channel including scrambled channels. Please note, however that channel selection must be made at the cable company converter box. Timer recording is limited to one channel at a time, and you can only view the channel you are recording.



To Watch and Record Scrambled/Unscrambled Channels

Set the Combination VCR channel selector to the output channel of the cable converter box (e.g. CH3). Now, select channels to be viewed or recorded at the cable converter box.

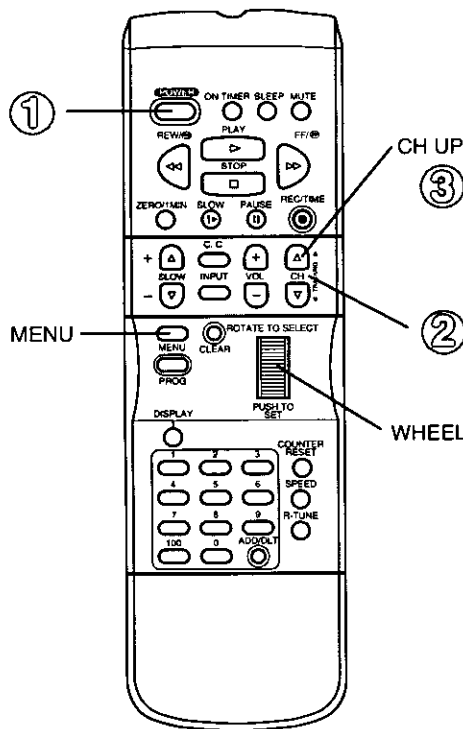
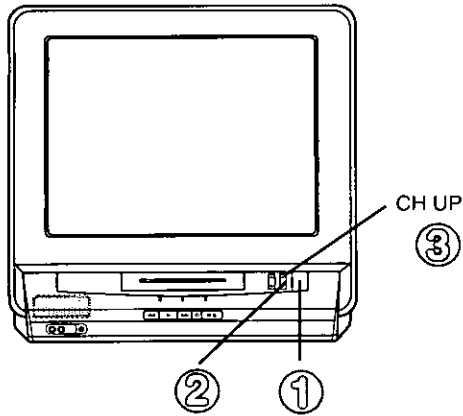

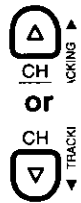

To Set Language, Channel and Clock

When the Combination VCR power is first turned on, the channel auto set and set clock screens appear automatically.

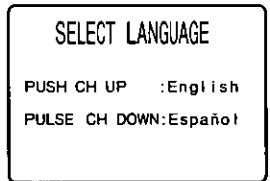

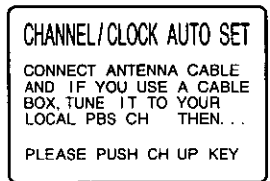

- If you use a cable box, the cable box must be left on for auto channel set.

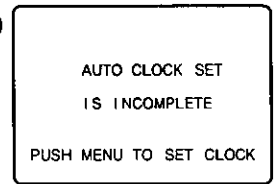
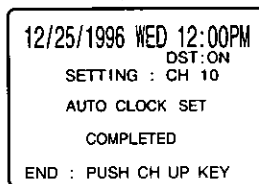


Important: If you use a cable box, turn it on and select PBS station in your time zone.

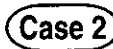
Confirm that displayed time is correct and push the CH UP button to exit.

If the displayed time and D.S.T. are incorrect, please proceed as follows:

In the rare event that you live close to two different time zones, the Combination VCR may recognize the wrong PBS station as the setting channel. In this case, please do the following:

- 1 Make a note of the SETTING:CH number shown on-screen and push the CH UP button to exit.
- 2 Delete the setting channel from the Combination VCR channel memory. (See the Add or Delete a Channel section on the next page.)
- 3 Push the MENU button to display the menu.
- 4 Use the WHEEL to select "CLOCK" and then to select "AUTO SET."

- If you use a cable box and have multiple PBS stations, tune the cable box to a different PBS station and try auto clock set again using the menu.



If the screen above appears, auto clock set is not available in your area. Please set the clock manually as described on the next page.

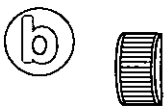
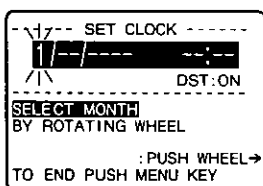


- To view the deleted channel, please select with the NUMBERED keys.
- If for any reason, the time is changed manually, automatic time correction will not occur.
- Auto clock set will be performed when the Combination VCR is turned off the first time each day. If you use a cable box and you want auto clock set to be performed, the cable box must be left on and the PBS channel is tuned at the Combination VCR power is turned off.

Manual Clock Set



Push MENU to display the set clock screen.



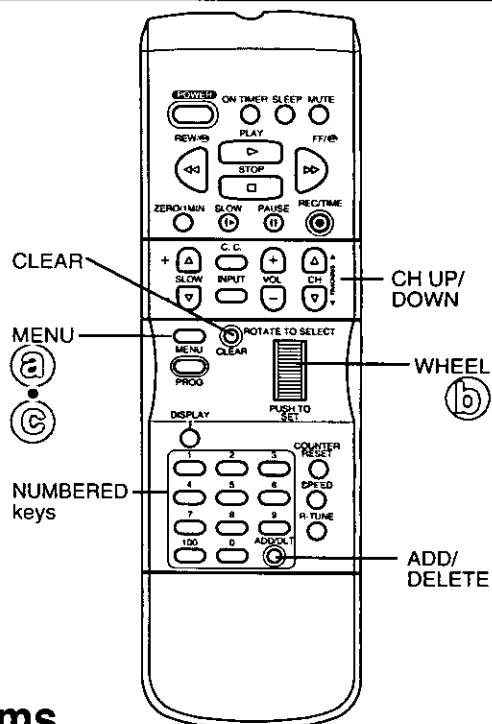
Rotate and push the WHEEL to select and enter the month, date, year, time, and D.S.T. (Daylight Saving Time).

• "DST:ON" automatically adjusts for daylight saving time. (See page 20.)

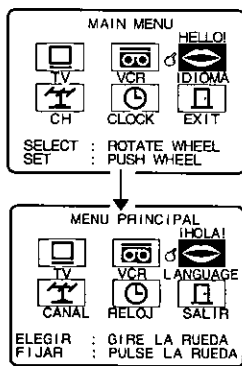

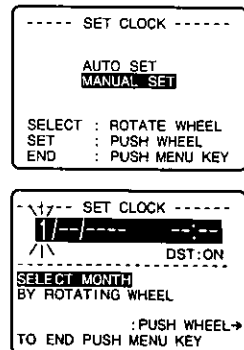

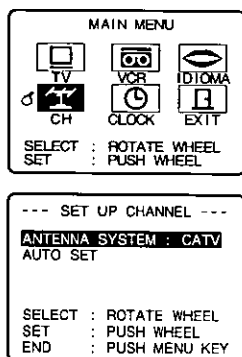

To Replace Channels in Memory

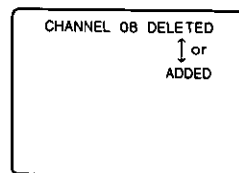

 - To exit this mode, push the MENU button twice.

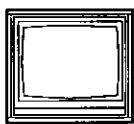


To Add or Delete a Channel

- 1 Push the CH UP/DOWN button or the NUMBERED keys to select a channel to add or delete.
 - The NUMBERED keys select all channels regardless of whether they have a signal or not.
 - The CH UP/DOWN button selects only those channels which are in the Combination VCR's channel memory.
- 2 Push the ADD/DEL button to add or delete the channel.
 - To select a deleted channel, use the NUMBERED keys.



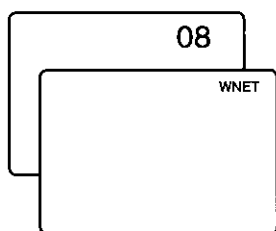

Channel & Function Display

Whenever the channel is changed, the Channel number will appear for a few seconds on-screen. (Some station names may also appear.)



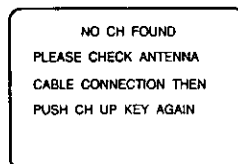
When a function button is pushed (PLAY, FF, etc.) the Combination VCR mode will be displayed.

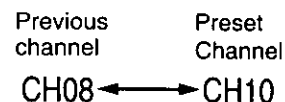


Using the 100 key

When selecting CATV channels 100 to 125 with the **NUMBERED** keys, first push the 100 key and then enter the remaining two digits.
For example, for channel 125:
Push the **NUMBERED** keys 100-2-5.

Rapid Tune

Push the **R-TUNE** button to display the last channel you were watching.



- When selecting channels with the **CH UP/DOWN** button, the channels must be displayed for at least 4 seconds in order for the Combination VCR to recognize them as a new selection.

Audio Mute

Push the **MUTE** button to instantly mute the sound. Push again, to restore the previous sound level.

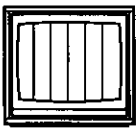

Set the On Timer

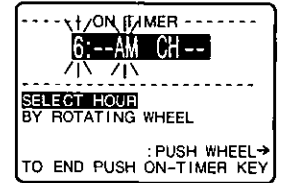
The Combination VCR can be set for auto power on.

① **ON TIMER** Push ON TIMER to display the ON TIMER.

②  Rotate and push the WHEEL to set the ON time.

③  Rotate and push the WHEEL to select either a channel number for TV mode or "PLAY" for VCR Playback mode when the Combination VCR comes on.

- Make sure a tape is inserted if VCR Playback mode is selected.

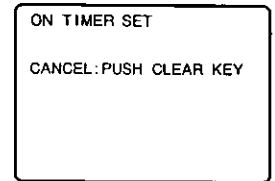


To Make Corrections,

push the Wheel or CLEAR button repeatedly to move back or forward to the desired item.

④ **ON TIMER** Push ON TIMER to set On Timer function. This screen will appear for about 5 seconds.

- The ON TIMER indicator lights on the front panel.



To Cancel,

push the CLEAR button while above screen is displayed. "ON TIMER END" will appear for about 5 seconds on-screen.



- 60 minutes after the Combination VCR turns itself on, it will turn itself back off unless any remote or Combination VCR button is pushed.

Set the Sleep Timer

The Combination VCR can be set for auto power off.

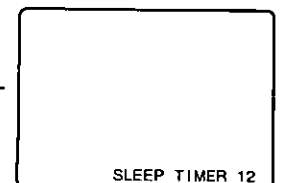

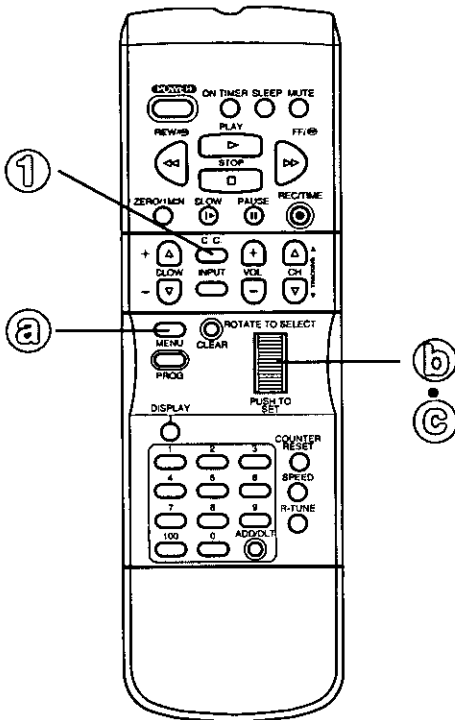
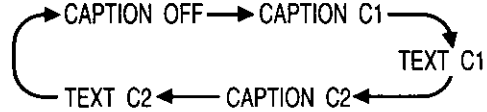

This system not only allows the hearing impaired to enjoy selected programs, but also makes valuable information from your TV stations available to you.



Push to select the desired caption mode (see below). Selected mode is displayed as an overlay on the screen.

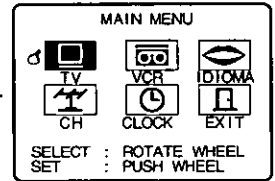
Each push of the CC button will change the caption mode as follows:



Caption On Mute Feature

This feature allows you to turn off the sound and, at the same time, display the closed caption narration. Perfect for when you need silence, but would like to continue enjoying the program.

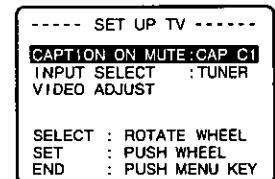
a Push MENU to display the menu.



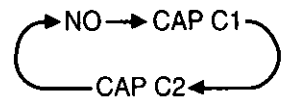
b Rotate and push the WHEEL to select "TV."

c Push the WHEEL to select the desired caption mode.

- Make sure "CAPTION OFF" using the C.C. button on the remote control.



Each push of the WHEEL will change the display as shown at right.



Recording and Play Back a Closed Caption/Text Program

Record: Your Combination VCR will automatically record the Closed Caption/Text signal. Just follow normal recording operation.

Playback: To display the Closed Caption narration or Text during playback, simply follow the steps listed above right.

Closed Caption Modes to Choose From

Caption Mode: CAP C1 or C2

A narration of selected TV programs will be displayed on the screen. Check your TV program listings for CC (Closed Captioned) broadcasts.

Caption Mode: TEXT C1 or C2

The lower half of the screen will be blocked out. When the TV station broadcasts text, such as program listings, special information, etc., it will appear in this space.

Caption Mode: OFF

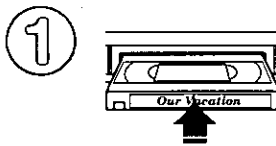
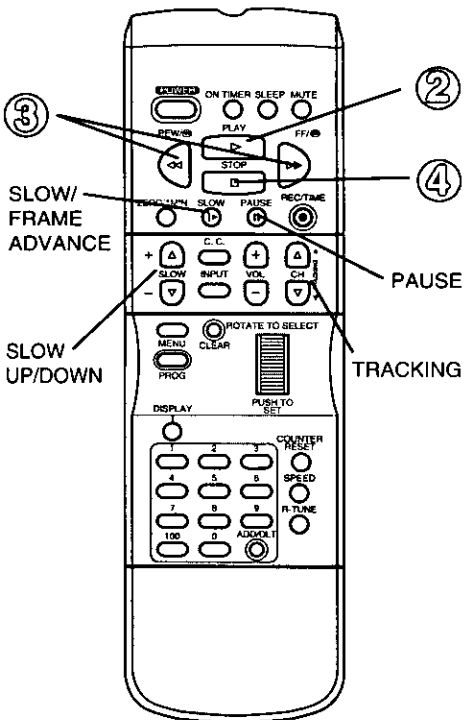
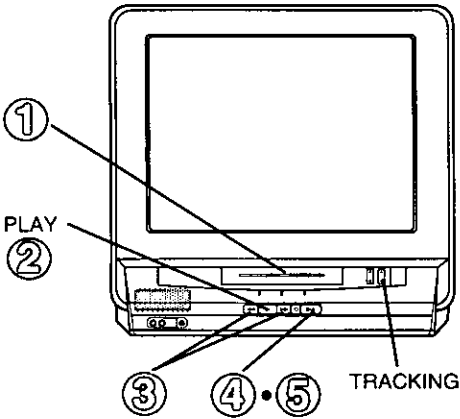
Narration will not appear on the screen even if a closed caption or text broadcast is received.

- The closed caption or text signal may be broadcast over C1, C2, or both. Also, text contents can vary so you may wish to try different settings.

Front View of the Combination VCR

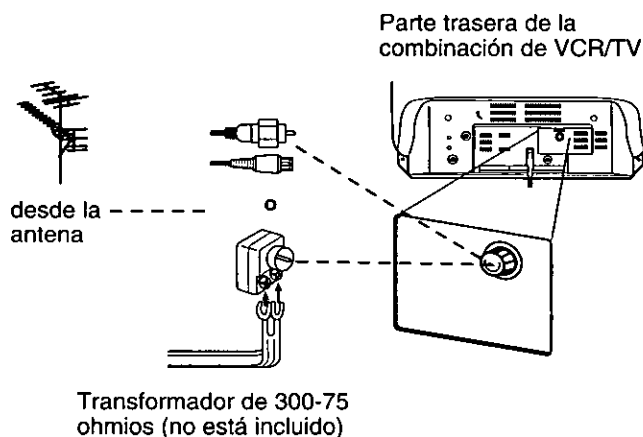


Rear View of the Combination VCR
