Basic Operation

TAPE PLAYBACK

You can use normal type tapes only. This unit will not be able to do full justice to characteristics of high and metal position tapes even if they are played back.

Function	Operation	
To stop	During playback, press [■].	
To fast forward or rewind	[DIR] switched to [FWD]: In the stop mode, press [▶▶] (fast forward) or [◄◄] (rewind).	
	[DIR] switched to [REV]: In the stop mode, press [◄◄] (fast forward) or [▶▶] (rewind).	
Reverse tape direction	In the stop mode or during playback, set [DIR] to [REV] or [FWD].	

RADIO RECEPTION

Function	Operation
Off	During reception, press [RADIO ON/OFF].

NOTE:

Press [] to stop the tape before operating the radio. While playing a tape, the radio will not turn on even if you press [RADIO ON/OFF].
