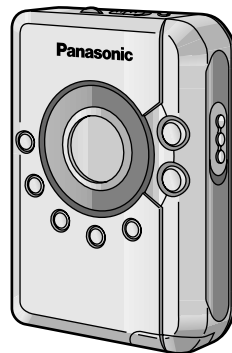

You can operate the unit with one dry cell battery (included).

**1. Open the battery lid.**

**2. Insert the battery.**  
One R03/LR03, AAA, UM-4 battery (included)

**3. Close the battery lid.**

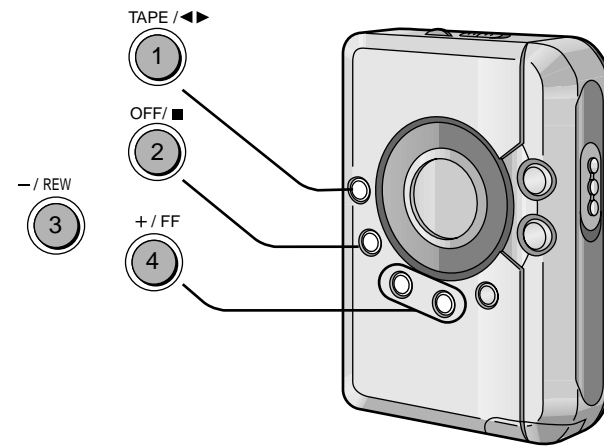

## TAPE PLAYBACK

You can use normal position type tapes only.

Function	Operation
Stop	During playback  Press.
Reverse tape direction	During playback  Press.
Fast forward (FF) or rewind (REW)*	Press.

\*To switch to playback during FF, REW: Press [TAPE/◀▶].

## RADIO RECEPTION

Function	Operation
Off	During reception  Press.

## Troubleshooting Guide

### BEFORE CALLING

Before requesting service, make the below checks. PROBLEM	CHECKPOINT
Radio operates but tape doesn't.	Is the battery worn?
No operations.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Is the unit in the hold state?</li> <li>Has the battery been installed with its polarities (+, -) reversed?</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>No radio reception.</li> <li>The FM frequency range is different.</li> </ul>	Has the frequency step been set for your area?
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>No sounds.</li> <li>A gritty noise is heard.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Is the headphone plug firmly connected to the <math>\phi</math> jack?</li> <li>Is the plug dirty? (Wipe away the dirt from the plug.)</li> </ul>
Cannot hear music - too noisy.	Separate the unit from mobile phones.

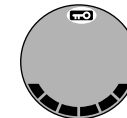
## HOLD



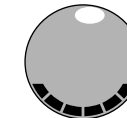
### Hold function

This function prevents the unit from operating in error. Use this function to prevent the following situations:  
 A: While not in use, playback or radio reception starts inadvertently and the battery runs out.  
 B: Playback or radio reception is interrupted while the unit is in use.

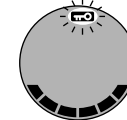

## TAPE



### When the cassette cover is closed

Tapeslack is wound automatically and playback will be ready to start from the forward side.

### Auto-reverse

Unless manually stopped, the unit plays 3 sides of the tape and then automatically stops.

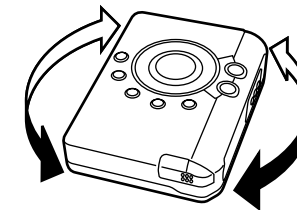
## RADIO



### To obtain better reception

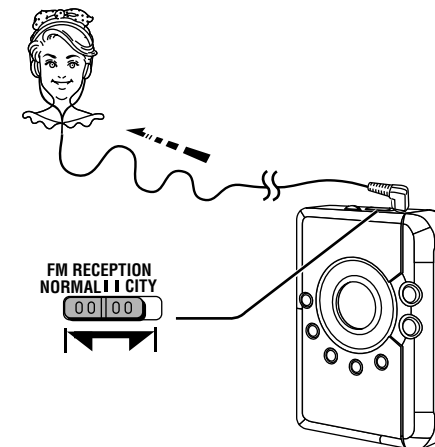
#### AM:

Try various directions to obtain optimum reception.



#### FM:

As the cord of the headphones acts as the FM antenna, extend it as far as possible rather than leaving it coiled.

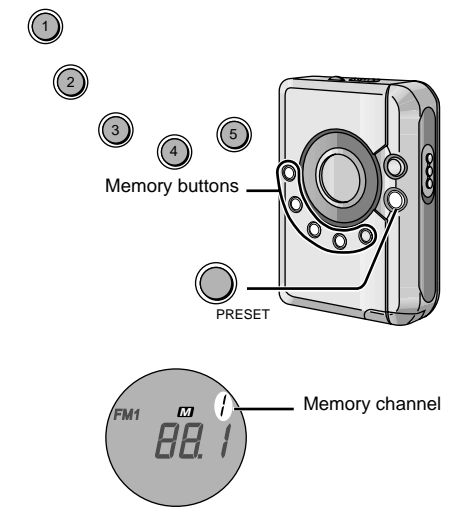


### How to receive an FM broadcast clearly

Set [FM RECEPTION] to [NORMAL].

When FM reception is impaired or there is interference from a powerful station, set it to [CITY].

## RADIO



### Preset tuning

Frequencies of up to 30 radio stations (10 each for AM, FM1 and FM2) can be stored in the memory.

### Memory presetting

Preparation: ●Release hold.

- Connect the headphones (the cord of the headphones acts as an FM antenna) when storing frequencies of FM stations in the memory.

#### Channel 1 - 5

- Tune in a station to be stored.
- Press [PRESET].  
"M" starts flashing.
- Press and hold one of the memory buttons ([1] [2] [3] [4] [5]) for 2 seconds while "M" is flashing.  
3 beeps can be heard.

#### Channel 6 - 10

- Tune in a station to be stored.
- Press [PRESET] twice.  
"M" and "5" start flashing.
- Press and hold one of the memory buttons for 2 seconds while "M" and "5" are flashing.  
3 beeps can be heard.

### To recall a preset station

#### Channel 1 - 5

- Press [PRESET].
- Press one of the memory buttons while "M" is flashing.

#### Channel 6 - 10

- Press [PRESET] twice.
- Press one of the memory buttons while "M" and "5" are flashing.

### Note

Release the memory button within 2 seconds.

### When using overseas

The allocation settings according to the area are needed.

Every time the following procedure is performed, the allocation setting changes as follows:

FM 0.2 MHz, AM 10 kHz ← (original setting)

FM 0.1 MHz, AM 10 kHz

FM 0.05 MHz, AM 9 kHz

### How to adjust the allocation settings

#### While playing the radio

Press and hold [PRESET] for about 3 seconds.

- The changed allocation settings (FM and then AM) are displayed.

### Note

Changing allocation settings erases the stations stored in memory.
