Inside of product

#### Use of batteries

- Align the poles (+ and –) properly when inserting the batteries.
- Do not mix old and new batteries or different types of batteries.

## **Maintenance**


### Cleaning inside the deck

Clean the heads regularly to assure good quality playback and recording. Use a cleaning tape (not included).

#### Care of the CD lens

Clean the lens regularly to prevent malfunctions. Use a blower to remove dust and a cotton swab if it is extremely dirty.

Recommended product: Lens cleaner kit (part no. SZZP1038C).

### **Product Service**



## Power sources

The unit can be powered with household AC power or dry cell batteries (not included). Insert memory batteries (not included) to save the current time, stored timer settings and radio stations.

### Using a household AC outlet

Connect the AC power supply cord firmly to the unit and the outlet.




#### Note

The included AC power supply cord is for use with this unit only. Do not use it with other equipment.

#### Using batteries (not included)

The unit cannot be powered by batteries if the AC power supply cord is connected.



#### When to change the batteries

When the battery indicator begins flashing, replace all 6 of the batteries. It is also a good idea to replace all the batteries before recording.




#### Note

Before playing starts the battery indicator may flash although the batteries are not drained. It appears correctly once you start play.

### **Memory back-up**

Insert batteries (not included) to save the current time, timer settings and radio stations you have set. If memory batteries are not used, memory items are erased in the following situations:

- Power failures,
- The AC power supply cord is disconnected from the power outlet,
- The AC power supply cord is connected to the unit while the unit is being powered by batteries.
   These batteries do not power the unit.



#### When to change the batteries

The batteries last about a year.


Connect the unit to AC power before replacing the batteries.

Before connecting or disconnecting the AC power supply cord, press [TAPE/OFF] and stop the tape to turn the unit off. The memory batteries are worn out faster if the cord is disconnected with the power still on.

#### Removing the batteries

Open the battery cover and insert your finger in the hole on the bottom of the unit and push out. (Remove the power batteries first.)




## Concerning the remote control

### **Battery installation**

Insert the batteries (not included) observing the correct polarities  $(\oplus,\ominus)$ .



#### Correct method of use



#### Operation notes

- Do not place obstacles between the remote control signal sensor and the remote control unit.
- Do not expose the remote control signal sensor to direct sunlight or to the bright light of fluorescent light.
- Take care to keep the remote control signal sensor and end of the remote control unit free from dust.

#### To prevent damage

- Never place heavy items on it.
- Do not disassemble or reconstruct it.
- Do not spill water or other liquids into it.

## **Controls**

#### Main unit: Remote control: The functions of the buttons without descriptions are the Tape mode/standby switch (TAPE/OFF) same as on the main unit. Press [TAPE/OFF] and stop the tape to turn the unit off. The unit is in the standby condition when the AC power supply cord is connected. 



(Unit comes on.)

2 (Omit this step if using the remote control) If "PGM" is on the display, press [TUNE MODE] to clear it.



3 Press [- / ◄ ] or [ ▶ / +] to tune to the desired station.



#### **Automatic tuning**

Press and hold [-/I◀ ] or [▶▶/+] then release when the frequency display starts to change. A station with good reception is automatically selected and the process stops.

To stop automatic tuning, press [-/◄◄] or [▶►/+] again.

#### Note

Automatic tuning may stop on a frequency where there is no station if there is interference. Press [-/I◀] and [▶▶/+] to tune if this occurs.

4 Adjust the volume.

#### To improve reception

FM: Extend the whip antenna and adjust its direction.

AM: Adjust the position of the unit.

#### If noise is excessive in the FM stereo mode

Press [PLAY MODE] on the remote control. ("MONO" lights up.)




Sound will be produced in monaural, but this also reduces noise.

Press the button again to cancel. ("MONO" goes out.)

#### Preset tuning

Preset the stations (20 FM and 12 AM) to make tuning simpler.



### Automatic presetting

Do the following once each for FM and AM.

Preparations: Press [TUNER/BAND -AUTO PRESET] to select "FM" or

Press and hold [TUNER/BAND -AUTO PRESET] on the main unit until "AUTO" is displayed.

The tuner presets stations it can receive into the channels.

## **Manual Presetting**

#### Remote control only

Presets one station at a time.

Press [PGM/CLEAR].



While "PGM" is flashing (about 10 seconds)

Press the numbered buttons to select a channel.

To select channel 10 or higher

e.g.12:  $[\ge 10] \rightarrow [1] \rightarrow [2]$ 



## ▲ Adjust the volume.

#### To stop play

Press [■].

While stopped, the number of tracks on the CD is displayed.



To pause	Press [CD ► / ■] during playback. To resume, press [CD ► / ■].
To search forward/ backward	Hold down [-/I◄] (backward) or [►►I/+] (forward) during playback or when paused. You cannot search while playing MP3.
To skip forward/ backward	Press [-/ ◄◄] (backward) or [►► /+] (forward) during playback or when paused.

#### Display

"NO DISC" is displayed if there is no disc in the unit.


#### Note

- If interference occurs to radios or televisions, place the unit as far as possible from the equipment.
- Do not push [ ▲ CD OPEN/CLOSE] during play, pause or immediately
  after you inserted the CD and closed the CD lid. CD may be scratched.

This unit can play CD-DA (digital audio) format audio CD-R and CD-RW that have been finalized (a process that enables CD-R/CD-RW players to play audio CD-R and CD-RW) upon completion of recording. It may not be able to play some CD-R or CD-RW due to the condition of the recording.

### **Program play**

You can program up to 24 tracks.



#### **Remote control only**

Ensure CD is stopped before programming.

1 Press [PGM/CLEAR].





"P" appears in the display when play is stopped.

Press [-/ ◄ ] or [ ▶ /+] when "P" is displayed.

To check while programming press [DISPLAY] twice and after "P" appears, press [-/ |◄◄] or [ ▶►| /+].

#### Display

Program equals, or exceeds, 100 minutes but

## **CD** play modes

#### Remote control only

You can repeat one track ( 1- $\circlearrowright$  ), all tracks (  $\circlearrowright$  ) or play the tracks in random order ( RND ).

Press [PLAY MODE] before or during playback to select the desired mode.


These modes remain active until the indicators are cleared. You can use repeat mode with program play.

- Random and program play cannot be performed at the same time.

## Starting play from an album (album skip)

#### Remote control only

Select the album with  $[ \lor / \bowtie ALBUM ]$  or  $[ALBUM \bowtie / \land ]$ .

### Playing only an album

#### Remote control only

You can play ( ALBUM ) or repeat play ( ALBUM ) tracks only in the selected album.

Press [PLAY MODE] before or during playback to select the desired mode.




Title names and album names are not displayable on this unit.

#### **■** Limitation on MP3

- This unit is compatible with multi-session but if there are a lot of sessions it takes more time for play to start. Keep the number of sessions to a minimum to avoid this.
- This unit cannot play files recorded using packet write.
- If a CD-ROM format CD contains MP3 and files other than MP3, only the MP3 files will be playable.
- Depending on how you create MP3 files, they may not play in the order you numbered them or may not play at all.

## Listening to tapes

This unit is suitable for playing normal tapes, but high and metal position tapes will not be played to their full potential.



- 1 Press [TAPE/OFF].
- Press [ / ▲ STOP/EJECT ] to open the deck and load a cassette. Close deck by hand.

Exposed tape facing upward

Side to be played facing you

Press [ PLAY ] to start play. Unit comes on and play starts.

TAPE

Adjust the volume.

#### To stop play

Press [ ■ / ▲ STOP/EJECT]. (Unit is switched off.)

To pause	Press [ ■ PAUSE ] during playback. To resume, press [ ■ PAUSE ].
To rewind/ fast-forward	Press [► REW/REV] (to rewind) or [◀ FF/CUE] (to fast-forward) in the stop mode.
To find a particular spot	Press [►► REW/REV] (to search backward) or [◀ FF/CUE] (to search forward) during playback. Play is resumed when the button is released.

#### Note

- The unit is on in the pause mode. Stop tape to turn the unit off by pressing [■ / ≜ STOP/EJECT] when leaving the unit.
- Do not press [ ◄ PLAY] when rewinding or fast-forwarding, as this
  may jam the tape.
- Be sure to press [  $\blacksquare$  /  $\triangleq$  STOP/EJECT ] before the next operation.
- Tapes exceeding 100 minutes are thin and can break or get caught in the mechanism.
- Tape slack can get caught up in the mechanism and should be taken up before the tape is played.
- Endless tapes can get caught up in the deck's moving parts if used incorrectly.
- Sound quality may be effected and the cassette tape may become stuck if you do not adhere to the following.
