#### Precautions

Before using this unit please read these operating instructions carefully. Take special care to follow the warnings indicated on the unit itself as well as the safety suggestions listed below. Afterwards keep them handy for future reference.


#### Safety

- 1. Power Source The unit should be connected to power supply only of the type described in the operating instructions or as marked on the unit.
- 2. Polarization If the unit is equipped with a polarized AC power plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other), that plug will fit into the AC outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug.
- 3. Power Cord Protection AC power supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them. Never take hold of the plug or cord if your hand is wet, and always grasp the plug body when connecting or disconnecting it.
- 4. Nonuse Periods When the unit is not used, turn the power off. When left unused for a long period of time, the unit should be unplugged from the household AC outlet.

#### Installation

#### Environment

1. Outdoor Antenna Grounding - If an outside antenna is connected to the receiver, be sure the antenna system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Section 810 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA No. 70-1990, provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antennadischarge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode. See figure below.





2. Water and Moisture -Do not use this unit near water-for example, near a bathtub, washbowl, swimming pool, or the like. Damp basements should also be avoided.

- 3. Heat -The unit should be situated away from heat sources such as radiators and the like.
  - It also should not be placed in temperatures less than 5°C (41°F) or greater than 35°C (95°F).
- 4. Condensation --- Moisture may form on the lens in the following conditions...
  - · immediately after a heater has been turned on.
  - in a steamy or very humid room.
  - · when the unit is suddenly moved from a cold environment to a warm one.

If moisture forms inside this unit, it may not operate properly. To correct this problem, turn on the power and wait about one hour for the moisture to evaporate.

#### Placement

- 1. Ventilation --- The unit should be situated so that its location or position does not interfere with its proper ventilation. Allow 10 cm (4") clearance from the rear of the unit.
- 2. Foreign Material -Care should be taken so that objects do not fall into and liquids are not spilled into the unit. Do not subject this unit to excessive smoke, dust, mechanical vibration, or shock.
- Magnetism The unit should be situated away from equipment 3. or devices that generate strong magnetic fields.
- 4. Stacking -Do not place heavy objects, other than system components, on top of the unit.
- 5. Surface --- Place the unit on a flat, level surface.
- 6. Carts and Stands --- The unit should be used only with a cart or stand that is recommended by the manufacturer. The unit and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the unit and cart combination to overturn.



7. Wall or Ceiling Mounting - The unit should not be mounted to a wall or ceiling, unless specified in this operating instructions.

#### Maintenance

(See page 51 for details.)

Clean the cabinet, panel and controls with a soft cloth lightly moistened with mild detergent solution.

Do not use any type of abrasive pad, scouring powder or solvent such as alcohol or benzine.


#### Service

- 1. Damage Requiring Service The unit should be serviced by qualified service personnel when:
  - (a) The AC power supply cord or the plug has been damaged; or (b) Objects have fallen or liquid has been spilled into the unit; or
  - (c) The unit has been exposed to rain; or

  - (d) The unit does not appear to operate normally or exhibits a marked change in performance; or
  - (e) The unit has been dropped, or the enclosure damaged.

2. Servicing - The user should not attempt to service the unit beyond that described in the operating instructions. All other servicing should be referred to an authorized service personnel. 

#### Concerning the remote control

#### **Battery installation**

#### Use of batteries

- Align the poles (+ and -) properly when inserting the batteries. Press in and down towards the minus end.
- · Do not mix old and new batteries, or batteries of different types.
- Do not recharge ordinary dry cell batteries.
- Do not heat or disassemble the batteries. Do not allow them to contact flame or water.
- Remove the batteries if the unit is not to be used for a long time.
- Do not keep together with metallic objects such as necklaces.
- Do not use batteries if the covering has been peeled off.
- Do not use rechargeable type batteries.

Mishandling of batteries can cause electrolyte leakage which can damage items the fluid contacts and may cause a fire.

If electrolyte leaks from the batteries, consult your dealer.

Wash thoroughly with water if electrolyte comes in contact with any part of your body.

#### Correct method of use

#### Operation notes

- Do not place obstacles between the remote control signal sensor and remote control unit.
- Do not expose the remote control signal sensor to direct sunlight or to the bright light of a fluorescent light.
- Take care to keep the remote control signal sensor and end of the remote control unit free from dust.
- If this system is installed in a rack with glass doors, the glass doors' thickness or color might make it necessary to use the remote control a shorter distance from the system.

#### To prevent damage

- · Never place heavy items on top of the unit.
- Do not disassemble or reconstruct the unit.
- Do not spill water or other liquids into the unit.





Attach the stickers to the speaker cords.

- (1) (4): Attach stickers 1 to 4 to the cords of the 4 small speakers (2 x front and 2 x surround: SB-AFC80).
- (5): Attach sticker 5 to the cord of the medium-sized speaker (center speaker: SB-AFC285).
- 6 : Attach sticker 6 to the cord of the large speaker (subwoofer: SB-W80).


#### Position the speakers



(1-6): Position the speakers as indicated in the diagram using the stickers as a guide.

#### Attach the rubber feet to the 2 speaker

The four small speakers and the medium speaker can be set-up either standing or lying down. Attach these rubber feet to prevent vibration causing the speakers to move or fall over.



- \* The front, center, and surround speakers should be placed at approximately the same distance from the listening position. The angles in the diagram are approximate.
- Place the front left and right speakers (①, ②) either side of the television.
- Place the center speaker (5) directly above the television.
- Place the surround speakers (3), (4) either side of the listening position, or slightly to the rear, about 1 meter (3 feet) higher than ear level.
- The subwoofer (6) can be placed anywhere as long as it is not too far from the television.

#### Note

If you are unable to position the surround speakers as recommended, you can put them near the front speakers and still achieve a surround-like effect (➡ "Virtual rear surround", page 33).


#### Connect the speakers to the unit


- Connect the cords so the numbers on the stickers match the numbers under the terminals.
- Connect the gray cords with the blue stripe 
   ⊖ to
   the blue terminals.

- Connect the subwoofer's red cord to the red terminal (+) and the black cord to the black terminal (-).
- Ensure the wires of the cords are fully inserted so they do not touch each other and short circuit.

After you have completed set-up and connection, wind the excess cord and keep together with string.



#### Attaching to a wall

#### To attach vertically To attach horizontally

Attach four rubber feet to each speaker, ensuring they do not cover the holes.

#### Note

The surface you attach the speakers to must be able to support over 10 kg (22 lb.).

#### C Attaching to speaker stands

#### Note

#### Ensure the following conditions are met when you purchase your speaker stands.


- Observe the diameter and length of the screws and the distance between screws as shown in the diagram.
- The stands must be able to support over 10 kg (22 lb.).
- The stands must be stable even if the speakers are in a high position.

#### D Moving the brand plate

You can rotate the brand plate if you choose to set up the small speakers horizontally.

### (Prevent damage to the plate by wrapping the end of the screwdriver with cloth.)

Insert the screwdriver under the plate and lift it. Rotate the plate to the required position.



#### If irregular coloring occurs on your television

These speakers are designed to be used close to a television, but the picture may be affected with some televisions and setup combinations.

If this occur, turn the television off for about 30 minutes. The television's demagnetizing function should correct the

problem.

If it persists, move the speakers further away from the television.


#### Note

- Set the speakers up on an even surface to prevent them from falling. Take proper precautions to prevent the speakers from falling if you cannot set them up on an even surface.
- The speaker nets cannot be removed.
- Keep your speakers at least 10 mm (13/32") away from the system for proper ventilation.


#### Caution

- Use the speakers only with the recommended system. Failure to do so may lead to damage to the amplifier and/or the speakers, and may result in the risk of fire. Consult a qualified service person if damage has occurred or if you experience a sudden change in performance.
- Do not attempt to attach these speakers to walls using methods other than those described in this manual.

#### Connecting the indoor antennas, television, and power



#### **Connecting other equipment**



These are examples of connection. You can connect other recording equipment instead of a cassette deck. A record player, laser disc player, etc. can be connected to the AUX terminals.

#### To connect a record player

Connect the record player to a phono equalizer to amplify the signal, then connect the phono equalizer to the AUX terminals.

#### Note

Audio output through LINE OUT is only from sources played in this unit (radio and discs), not from other sources connected to TV AUDIO IN, VCR AUDIO IN, and AUX.


#### Outdoor antenna connections

Use outdoor antennas if radio reception is poor.

#### FM outdoor antenna (Using a television antenna)

Disconnect the FM indoor antenna.

An outdoor antenna should be installed by a qualified technician only.




#### AM outdoor antenna (Using a vinyl wire)


Run a piece of vinyl wire horizontally across a window or other convenient location.

Leave the loop antenna connected.

When the unit is not in use, disconnect the outdoor antenna to prevent possible damage that may be caused by lightning. Never use an outdoor antenna during an electrical storm.





#### **Television settings**

The menu language has been factory preset to English. You can change the language by going to "3 Menu Language". (+ page 44)

Set the screen size to suit your television. The initial setting is for a regular television with an aspect ratio of 4:3. You do not have to change the setting if you have this kind of television.

#### Preparation


- Turn the television on.
- Switch the video input mode on the television to suit the type of connection you have made (e.g., VIDEO 1).
- **1** Press [POWER, 0/1] to turn the unit on.
- **2** Press [DVD/CD] to select "DVD/CD" as the source.
- **3** Press [ACTION] to display the initial settings screen on the television.
- 4 Press [UP/ON △] or [DOWN/OFF ▽] to highlight "5 TV Aspect", and press [SELECT].
- 5 Press [UP/ON △] or [DOWN/OFF ▽] to highlight the required size, and press [SELECT].

4:3: regular television 16:9: widescreen television The initial settings screen is shown after you make your selection.

6 While the Initial settings screen is on the television Press [DOWN/OFF ▽] to highlight "0 Exit", and press [SELECT].

Steps 4 to 6 can also be done with the numbered buttons.

Press the number next to the required item. For example, in step 4, press button number 5.


## Calculating delay time

The sound from speakers can reach the listening position at different times depending on placement. You can allow for this difference by changing the delay time of the center and surround speakers.




## How different kinds of software appear on your television

DVD software is recorded in a variety of picture formats, and how they appear on your TV depends on the software, the kind of TV you have, and the picture mode your TV is set to.

- Letterbox refers to pictures where black bands appear at the top and bottom.
- Pan & scan refers to pictures where part of the picture is cut off so it fills the whole screen.

# **Concerning discs**

With this system, you can only play discs having these marks. However, do not use irregular shaped discs. Discs of this sort can damage the unit.





Handling precautions

- . If you are taking the disc from a cold to a warm environment, moisture may form on the disc. Wipe with a soft, dry lintfree cloth before using the disc.
- Do not write on the label side with a ball-point or other writing instrument.
- · Do not use record cleaning sprays, benzine, thinner, static electricity prevention liquids or any other solvent.
- . Do not attach labels or stickers to discs. (Do not use discs with exposed adhesive from tape or left over peeled off stickers.)
- Do not use scratch-proof protectors or cover than those specified for use with this system.
- Do not use discs printed with label printers available on the market.

Storage precautions

Be sure to store discs in their cases to protect them from dust, scratches, and warping.

#### Do not place or store discs in the following places

- Locations exposed to direct sunlight
- Humid or dusty locations
- Locations directly exposed to a heat vent or heating appliance
- . In the glove compartment or on the rear deck of an automobile

В To prevent damage

Always observe the following points.

- Load only 1 disc per tray.
- Load discs as shown in figure.
- The adaptor is not needed with 8 cm discs (singles).
- Set the system on a flat, level surface. Do not set it on top of magazines, inclined surfaces, etc.
- Do not move the system while trays are opening/closing, or when loaded.
- Do not put anything except discs in trays.
- · Do not use cleaning discs or discs which are badly warped or cracked.
- Do not use discs with poorly attached labels or stickers. Adhesive protruding from underneath stickers or left over from peeled off stickers can cause your stereo to malfunction.
- Do not use irregular shaped discs.

## Video

#### Frame

Frames are the still pictures that go together to make a moving picture. There are about thirty frames shown each second.



#### Field

One frame is made up of two fields. A regular television shows these fields one after the other to create frames.

One field

#### Frame still and field still

A still is shown when you pause a moving picture. A frame still is made up of two alternating fields, so the picture may appear blurred, but overall quality is high. A field still is not blurred, but it has only half the information of a frame still so picture quality is lower.

#### I/P/B

MPEG 2, the video compression standard adapted for use with DVD, codes frames using these three picture types.

I: Intra coded picture (I-picture)

This is the standard picture and is a complete picture in itself. This means it has the best picture quality and is the best to use when adjusting the picture.

P: Predictive coded picture (P-picture)

This picture is calculated based on past I and P-pictures.

B: Bidirectionally-predictive coded picture (B-picture)

This picture is calculated by comparing past and future I and Ppictures so it has the lowest volume of information.

## **Digital audio**

#### Decoder

A decoder restores the coded audio signals on DVDs to normal. This is called decoding.

#### **Dolby Digital**

This method of coding digital signals was developed by Dolby Laboratories. The signals are highly compressed, enabling a large amount of information to be recorded on one disc.

#### **DTS (Digital Theater Systems)**

This method of coding digital signals was developed by Digital Theater Systems. The signals are compressed at a low ratio to maintain sound quality.

#### Sampling rate

This is the number of samples of sound taken per second during conversion to a digital signal. Sampling frequency is expressed in kilohertz (kHz). A high sampling frequency results in a sound close to the original when played back.

#### Linear PCM (pulse code modulation)

PCM is the usual digital method used for music CDs. DVDs have a greater volume so they use linear PCM, which has a higher sampling rate.

#### Bitstream

This is the digital form of multiple channel audio data (e.g., 5.1 channel) before it is decoded into its various channels.

### Other

#### Track

This is the smallest division on CD and video CD, and usually equates to a single song.

#### Chapter

This is the smallest division on DVD and is roughly equivalent to a track.

#### Title

This is the largest division on DVD.

#### Playback control (PBC)

This method of controlling disc play is included on version 2.0 video CDs. You are able to interact with the disc through menus.

## Maintenance

#### If the surfaces are dirty

#### To clean this unit, wipe with a soft, dry cloth.

If the surfaces are extremely dirty, use a soft cloth dipped in a soapand-water solution or a weak detergent solution.

- Never use alcohol, paint thinner or benzine to clean this unit.
