


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Listening caution

Now it's time to consider how you can maximize the fun and excitement your equipment offers. This manufacturer and the Electronic Industries Association's Consumer Electronics Group want you to get the most out of your equipment by playing it at a safe level. One that lets the sound come through loud and clear without annoying blaring or distortion—and, most importantly, without affecting your sensitive hearing.

We recommend you to avoid prolonged exposure to excessive noise.


Safety

- 1. Power Source-The unit should be connected to power supply only of the type described in the operating instructions or as marked on the unit.
- 2. Polarization-If the unit is equipped with a polarized AC power plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other), that plug will fit into the AC outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug.
- 3. Power Cord Protection-AC power supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them. Never take hold of the plug or cord if your hand is wet, and always grasp the plug body when connecting or disconnecting it.
- 4. Nonuse Periods—When the unit is not used, turn the power off. When left unused for a long period of time, the unit should be unplugged from the household AC outlet.

Installation

Environment

1. Outdoor Antenna Grounding-If an outside antenna is connected to the receiver, be sure the antenna system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Section 810 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA No. 70-1990, provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode. See figure below.

2. Water and Moisture-Do not use this unit near water-for example, near a bathtub, washbowl, swimming pool, or the like. Damp basements should also be avoided.

3. Heat-The unit should be situated away from heat sources such as radiators and the like.

It also should not be placed in temperatures less than 5°C (41°F) or greater than 35°C (95°F).

- 4. Condensation-Moisture may form on the lens in the following conditions...
 - •immediately after a heater has been turned on.
 - in a steamy or very humid room.
 - •when the unit is suddenly moved from a cold environment to a warm one.

If moisture forms inside this unit, it may not operate properly. To correct this problem, turn on the power and wait about one hour for the moisture to evaporate.

Placement

- 1. Ventilation-The unit should be situated so that its location or position does not interfere with its proper ventilation. Allow 10 cm (4") clearance from the rear of the unit.
- 2. Foreign Material—Care should be taken so that objects do not fall into and liquids are not spilled into the unit. Do not subject this unit to excessive smoke, dust, mechanical vibration, or shock.
- 3. Magnetism --- The unit should be situated away from equipment or devices that generate strong magnetic fields.
- 4. Stacking-Do not place heavy objects, other than system components, on top of the unit.
- 5. Surface—Place the unit on a flat, level surface.
- 6. Carts and Stands-The unit should be used only with a cart or stand that is recommended by the manufacturer. The unit and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the unit and cart combination to overturn.



7. Wall or Ceiling Mounting-The unit should not be mounted to a wall or ceiling, unless specified in this operating instructions.

Maintenance

(See back cover for details.)

Clean the cabinet, panel and controls with a soft cloth lightly moistened with mild detergent solution.

Do not use any type of abrasive pad, scouring powder or solvent such as alcohol or benzine.

Service

- 1. Damage Requiring Service-The unit should be serviced by qualified service personnel when:
 - (a) The AC power supply cord or the plug has been damaged; or
 - (b) Objects have fallen or liquid has been spilled into the unit; or
 - (c) The unit has been exposed to rain; or
 - (d) The unit does not appear to operate normally or exhibits a marked change in performance; or
 - (e) The unit has been dropped, or the enclosure damaged.



Before use



The remote control

A Batteries

Insert so the poles (+ and -) match those in the remote control.
Do not use rechargeable type batteries.

Do not;

- mix old and new batteries.
- •use different types at the same time.
- heat or expose to flame.
- •take apart or short circuit.
- attempt to recharge alkaline or manganese batteries.
- •use batteries if the covering has been peeled off.

•keep together with metallic objects such as necklaces. Mishandling of batteries can cause electrolyte leakage which can damage items the fluid contacts and may cause a fire.

If electrolyte leaks from the batteries, consult your dealer.

Wash thoroughly with water if electrolyte comes in contact with any part of your body.

Remove if the remote control is not going to be used for a long time. Store in a cool, dark place.

Replace if the unit does not respond to the remote control even when held close to the front panel.

B Use

Aim at the sensor, avoiding obstacles, at a maximum range of 7 meters directly in front of the unit.


- •Keep the transmission window and the unit's sensor free from dust.
- •Operation can be affected by strong light sources, such as direct sunlight, and the glass doors on cabinets.

Do not;

•put heavy objects on the remote control.

• take the remote control apart.

spill liquids onto the remote control.



Installation

Main unit

A Do not place anything on top of the unit or block the heat vents in any way.

Allow 10-cm clearance from the rear of the unit.

Note

The unit may become warm during operation, but this is normal.

B Position the speakers

The two big speakers are front speakers. (SB-PM08)

The small speaker with the short cord is the center speaker (SB-PC80, CENTER SPEAKER).

The small speakers with the long cords are surround speakers (SB-PS80, SURROUND SPEAKER).

The model numbers and speaker names are printed on the back of the speakers.

The front, center, and surround speakers should be placed at approximately the same distance from the listening position. The angles in the diagram are approximate.

(a) Front speakers

Place the speakers so that the superwoofers are on the outside.

Note

 Keep your speakers at least 10 mm (¹³/2["]) away from the system for proper ventilation.

- •The superwoofers are located on the sides of the speakers. Leave 10-cm clearance for the superwoofers to be effective.
- •To avoid damage to the speakers, do not touch the speaker cones if you take the nets off.


b Center speaker

Place the center speaker directly above the television.

© Surround speakers

Place the surround speakers either side of the listening position, or slightly to the rear, about 1 meter higher than ear level.

Place the speakers with the Panasonic logo facing toward the listening position. However, the position should be adjusted to your personal preference, because the effect varies to some degree depending upon the type of music and the music source.



Center/surround speakers

Attach the speaker feet to the speakers

These speakers can be set-up either standing or lying down, or they can be attached to a wall.

The speaker feet help to keep the speakers in position and prevent scratching of your furniture.

Attach the speaker feet to suit the set up you choose as shown in the illustrations.

Attach to the positions indicated with the shaded circles (O).

Ensure you do not cover the holes when attaching the speaker feet to the rear of the speaker.

B Attaching to a wall

The speakers can be attached vertically or horizontally. Screw the screws (not included) into the wall or pillar as shown in the

diagram. Screw; head diameter: 7.5 –9.5 mm (⁵/16["]-³/8") length: 30-35 mm (1³/16["]-1³/8")

Set speaker onto screws and slide through bracket to lock into position.

Note

The wall or pillar on which the speakers are to be attached should be capable of supporting 5 kg (11 lb.) per screw.

C Moving the brand plate

You can rotate the brand plate.

To prevent damage to the plate, wrap the end of a flat-head screwdriver with cloth, insert under the plate and lift it. Rotate to the required position.

Use only the supplied speakers.

The combination of the unit and the included speakers provides the best sound. Using other speakers can damage the unit and sound quality will be adversely affected.

Caution

Use the speakers only with the recommended system. Failure to do so may lead to damage to the amplifier and/or the speakers, and may result in the risk of fire. Consult a qualified service person if damage has occurred or if you experience a sudden change in performance.
Do not attempt to attach these speakers to walls using methods other than those described in this manual.

If irregular coloring occurs on your television

The front and center speakers are designed to be used close to a television, but the picture may be affected with some televisions and set-up combinations.


If this occurs, turn the television off for about 30 minutes.

The television's demagnetizing function should correct the problem. If it persists, move the speakers further away from the television.

Note

The surround speakers do not have magnetic shielding. Do not place them near televisions, personal computers or other devices easily influenced by magnetism.

Before connection

- Do not connect the AC power supply cord until all other connections are complete.
- •To prepare the AM loop antenna, speaker cords and FM antenna, twist the vinyl tip and pull off.

- •To prevent damage to circuitry, never short-circuit positive (+) and negative (-) speaker wires.
- Be sure to connect only positive (red or gray) wires to positive (+) terminals and negative (black, blue or gray with blue line) wires to negative (-) terminals.

4 TV (not included)

Connect the video connection cord from this unit to your TV. Alternatively, connect through the S-VIDEO OUT terminal if the TV has an S-VIDEO terminal (= page 36).


5 AC power supply cord.

The included AC power supply cord is for use with this unit only. Do not use it with other equipment.

For your reference


Information you enter into the unit's memory, except for time, remains intact for up to a month after the AC power supply cord is disconnected.

Use outdoor antennas if radio reception is poor.

- •The antenna should be installed by a competent technician.






Run a piece of vinyl wire horizontally across a window or other convenient location.

Disconnect the antenna when the unit is not in use. Do not use the antenna during an electrical storm.







Setting the time

This is a 12-hour clock. The example shows how to set the clock for 4:25 p.m.

1 Press [POWER 心/I] to turn the unit on.

2 Press [CLOCK/TIMER] to display "CLOCK".

Each time you press the button: CLOCK→@PLAY→Original display

3 (Within 7 seconds or so)

Press $[\vee/I \triangleleft / \triangleleft]$ or $[\vdash \vdash / \vdash \vdash I / \land]$ to set the time.

The time display can be changed in one minute units by tapping the buttons, and quickly by holding down the buttons.

4 Press [CLOCK/TIMER].

The time is set and the original display is restored.

Displaying the clock

Press [CLOCK/TIMER] to display "CLOCK". The clock is shown for about 5 seconds, then the previous display is restored.

A Auto power-off

Remote control only

When disc is selected as the source To save power, the unit turns off if it is left unused for 4 minutes.


This function does not work if the source is tuner or AUX or if a disc menu is being displayed.

- Press [▶] to select disc as the source. If play starts, press [■].
- Press [SHIFT] + [AUTO OFF]. "AUTO OFF" is displayed.

The setting is maintained even if the unit is turned off. If you select tuner or AUX as the source, "AUTO OFF" goes out. It comes on again when you select disc.

To cancel Press [SHIFT] + [AUTO OFF] again.

Television settings

Remote control only

The menu language has been factory preset to English. You can change the language by going to "3 Menu Language" of the initial settings screen (\Rightarrow page 38).

Set the screen size to suit your television. The initial setting is for a regular television with an aspect ratio of 4:3. You do not have to change the setting if you have this kind of television.

Preparation:

•Turn the television on.

• Switch the video input mode of the television to suit the type of connection you have made (e.g., VIDEO 1).

- 1 Press [▶] to select disc as the source. The unit comes on automatically. If play starts, press [■].
- 2 While the disc is stopped Press [SHIFT] + [ACTION] to display the initial settings screen on the television.
- 3 Press the cursor buttons, [▲] or [▼] to highlight "5 TV Aspect", and press [ENTER].
- 4 Press the cursor buttons, [▲] or [▼] to highlight the required size, and press [ENTER].

4:3 Regular television

16:9 Widescreen television The initial settings screen is shown after you make your selection.

5 Press [RETURN].

Steps 3 and 4 can also be done with the numbered buttons. Press the number next to the required item. For example, in step 3, press [5] to select "5 TV Aspect". The functions you can use depend on the type of disc you play. These marks are used to indicate which type of disc is available for use.



Region numbers

Region numbers are allocated to DVD players and software according to where they are sold.

DVDs can be played on this unit if their region number is the same or includes the same number, or if the DVD is marked "ALL".

Confirm the region number for this unit before choosing discs. The number for this unit is "1".





•use irregularly shaped discs (a).

attach extra labels and stickers.

- •use discs with labels and stickers that are coming off or with adhesive exuding from under labels and stickers ((5)).
- •attach scratch-proof covers or any other kind of accessory.
- write anything on the disc.
- •clean discs with liquids. (Wipe with a soft, dry cloth.)
- use discs printed with label printers available on the market.





Screens illustrated are examples.

Normal play

Preparation:

Turn the television on and switch the video input mode on the television to suit the type of connection you have made (e.g. VIDEO 1).

1 Press [▲, OPEN/CLOSE] to open the tray.

The unit comes on automatically. Set the disc on the tray and press [▲, OPEN/CLOSE] to close the tray. Some discs start playing automatically.

2 Press [▶] to start play.

A If a menu screen appears on the television

Remote control only

Use the cursor buttons $(\blacktriangleleft, \triangleright, \blacktriangle, \bigtriangledown)$ to highlight an item and press [ENTER].

You can also select the desired item by pressing the numbered buttons with some discs.

To select title No.10 or over, press [\geq 10] then the two digits. e.g. Title No. 12: [\geq 10] \rightarrow [1] \rightarrow [2]

3 Adjust the volume.

To stop the disc

Press [I] (- page 16).

Menu play

- •With some discs, play may start without showing the menu screen. To show the menu screen;
- DVD: Press [MENU], [TOP MENU] or [RETURN] on the remote control.

Video CD: Press [RETURN] on the remote control.

Note

The disc continues to rotate while the menu is displayed even after a particular item has finished. When no more items are to be selected, be sure to press [I] to clear the menu display.

" \odot " is displayed on the TV

When the operation is prohibited by the unit or the disc.

"NO DISC" is displayed on the unit's display

When there is no disc on the tray or the disc is set incorrectly.







Discs

Using the resume function to restart play

If you press [I] during play, the unit remembers the position.

This function does not work if the disc's play time is not displayed.

A To restart play from that position Press [>] while "RESUME" is lit.

To review the chapters up to the point where you stopped play (DVD only)

The message "Press PLAY to Chapter Preview" appears for a few seconds before the resume function is activated after pressing [>].

Press [▶] while the message is on the TV.

The beginning portions of each chapter up to the current one are played.

Full play resumes from the point where you stopped play.

B To cancel the resume function Press [■] while "RESUME" is lit.

Note

- The position is saved even if the unit is turned off.
- Resume is canceled if the disc tray is opened.
- Chapter preview is not possible with some DVDs.

Press [11] during play. Press [▶] to resume play.

D Skip

The radio: manual tuning

Radio stations can be tuned manually by selecting the station's frequency or they can be preset into channels to make it easy to tune (= page 29).

1 Press [TUNER/BAND] to select "FM" or "AM".

The unit comes on automatically. Each time you press the button: $FM \longleftrightarrow AM$

2 Press [TUNE MODE] to select "MANUAL".

Each time you press the button: MANUAL \longleftrightarrow PRESET

The names given to the television picture modes depend on the maker of your television. There may also be slight differences in how the pictures appear on the screen. Refer to your television's operating instructions for details.



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

Glossary

Chapter

This is the smallest division on DVD and is roughly equivalent to a track.

Title

This is the largest division on DVD.

Track

This is the smallest division on Video CD and Audio CD, and usually equates to a single song.

PBC (Playback control)

This method of controlling disc play is included on version 2.0 Video CDs. You are able to interact with the disc through menus.

Digital audio

Bitstream

This is the digital form of multiple channel audio data (e.g. 5.1 channel) before it is decoded into its various channels.

Decoder

A decoder restores the coded audio signals on DVDs to normal. This is called decoding.

DTS (Digital Theater Systems)

This method of coding digital signals was developed by Digital Theater Systems. The signals are compressed at a low ratio to maintain sound quality.

Linear PCM (Pulse code modulation)

PCM is the usual digital method used for Audio CDs. DVDs have a greater volume so they use linear PCM, which has a higher sampling rate.

Sampling rate

This is the number of samples of sound taken per second during conversion to a digital signal. Sampling frequency is expressed in kilohertz (kHz). A high sampling frequency results in a sound close to the original when played back.

Video

Frame

Frames are the still pictures that go together to make a moving picture. There are about thirty frames shown each second.

Field

One frame is made up of two fields. A regular television shows these fields one after the other to create frames.

Frame still and field still

A still is shown when you pause a moving picture. A frame still is made up of two alternating fields, so the picture may appear blurred, but overall quality is high. A field still is not blurred, but it has only half the information of a frame still so picture quality is lower.

I/P/B

MPEG 2, the video compression standard adapted for use with DVD, codes frames using these three picture types.

- Intra coded picture (I-picture)
 This is the standard picture and is a complete picture in itself. This means it has the best picture quality and is the best to use when adjusting the picture.
- P: Predictive coded picture (P-picture) This picture is calculated based on past I and P-pictures.
- B: Bidirectionally-predictive coded picture (B-picture) This picture is calculated by comparing past and future I and Ppictures so it has the lowest volume of information.
