IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Read these operating instructions carefully before using the unit. Follow the safety instructions on the unit and the safety precautions listed below. Keep these operating instruc-tions handy for future reference.

Safety

- 1. Power source—Connect the unit to a power source of the type described in these instructions or as marked on the unit.
- 2. Polarization—The unit is equipped with a polarized power plug where one blade is wider than the other. This safety feature ensures that the plug fits into your household AC outlet only one way. If the plug does-n't fit one way, try reversing it. If the plug still doesn't fit, contact an electrician to replace the obsolete out-let. Do not attempt to defeat the safety purpose of the plug. the plug.
- 3. Power cord protection—Route the AC power sup-ply cord so that it will not be walked on or pinched by items placed on or against it. Never take hold of the plug or cord with wet hands. Always grasp the plug body firmly when connecting and disconnecting it.
- 4. Overloading—When connecting the AC power sup ply cord, be careful not to overload the household AC outlet, extension cord, or outlet from any other device as this can result in fire or electric shock
- 5. Nonuse periods-Turn the unit off when it is not in use. Unplug the unit from the household AC outlet if it is not to be used for a long time. Unplug the unit during lightning storms. Leaving the unit connected to a household AC outlet for extended periods can cause battery fluid leakage.
- 6. Attachments and accessories-Use only the attachments and accessories recommended in these operating instructions.

Installation

Placement

- 1. Foreign material-Ensure objects and liquids do not get into the unit. Avoid exposing the unit to ex-cessive smoke, dust, mechanical vibration, and shock
- 2. Magnetism-Situate the unit away from equipment and devices that generate strong magnetic fields. **Stacking**—Do not place anything on top of this unit.
- Wall and ceiling mounting—Do not mount the unit on walls or ceilings unless specified in the instructions.

Environment

- 1. Water and moisture—Do not use the unit near water, such as near a bathtub or swimming pool.
- Avoid damp basements.
 2. Heat—Situate the unit away from heat sources, such as radiators. Do not leave it in an automobile exposed to direct sunlight with the doors and windows closed as this may deform the cabinet. Do not situate where temperatures fall below 5 $^{\circ}\mathrm{C}$

(41 °F) or rise above 35 °C (95 °F).

Maintenance

(See page 5 for details.) Unplug the unit from the household AC outlet before cleaning. Clean with a damp cloth.

Do not use abrasive pads, scouring powders, or sol-

Service

Conserving power

To save power when the unit is not to be used for a long time, unplug the AC adaptor from the household AC outlet.

Using the rechargeable batteries (not included)

Recharge the batteries before use. Use either "AA" batteries or, by inserting the supplied adaptor, "AAA" batteries. This unit cannot recharge batteries other than those especially designed for it. Obtain the optional rechargeable batteries: "AA" rechargeable Ni-Cd batteries: P-3GAVA/2B "AAA" nickel-metal hydride rechargeable batteries: HHR-4AHA/2B

This function causes the unit to ignore accidental button presses. (The disc lid can still be opened and closed.)

The HOLD function prevents the following: •The unit is powered on accidentally when not in use, causing the batteries to run down.

 A button is accidentally pressed during play, interrupting the operation.

To use the HOLD function Set [HOLD] to the HOLD position

The unit and wired remote control have HOLD functions, each of which works independently.


Charging procedure

- Insert the rechargeable batteries.
- (Refer to "Using the dry 2 Connect the AC adaptor.
- (Refer to "Using the AC adaptor".) Recharging starts and the "G" charging indicator flashes on the unit's display. The indicator goes out when charging is complete.
- 3 When charging is complete, unplug the AC adaptor from the household AC outlet and DC IN jack.
- Never mix dry cell and rechargeable batteries.
 Turn the unit off before replacing the rechargeable batteries.

Note

- Rechargeable batteries have a service life of approximately 300 charge-discharge cycles. The batteries have reached the end of their operational life if they last for a noticeably shorter time after recharging, or if they cannot be recharged at all. Replace the batteries. Recharging may only be performed when the unit is
- powered off. •The AC adaptor and rechargeable batteries may be-come warm while recharging is in progress. This is not
- a malfunction. • Leaving the AC adaptor connected can cause the batteries to go flat. After recharging the batteries and disconnecting the AC adaptor from the household AC outlet, ensure you disconnect the AC adaptor from the unit's [DC IN 4.5 V \Leftrightarrow \odot \Leftrightarrow] terminal.

When the battery indicator flashes



This indicator flashes when the batteries are almost out of power. Power is cut off completely a short while later. **Rechargeable batteries:** Recharge batteries. Dry-cell batteries: Replace batteries with new ones.

Note

- •The length of time the unit will continue to operate be-tween when the battery indicator starts flashing and when the power is cut off differs depending on the
- The batteries used.
 The battery indicator may not be displayed if recharge-able batteries other than those designated by Panasonic are used.

Using the car adaptor (not included)

Be sure to obtain the car adaptor (SH-CDC9), available as an optional accessory.

CAUTION:

Use only car adaptor, Model: SH-CDC9 manufactured by Matsushita Electric Industrial Co., Ltd.

The car adaptor can be used to recharge the unit's batteries while in the car.

If the unit malfunctions or freezes during use, disconnect the power source (the AC adaptor or batteries).

Re-connect the power source and continue operation.

When the main unit is in HOLD mode, pressing any button causes the indication " h_0 ; d" to appear on the display



Resume function notes



Removing discs

Press [■, OPR OFF] to stop play 1 and disc rotation.

- 2 Slide [OPEN►] to open the lid.
- 3 Press [PUSH] to release the disc.

Do not stop the disc by hand or try to remove it before it stops rotating. This can damage CDs.



Note

Never insert foreign objects into the unit.

Auto-off function

If you leave the unit in stop mode for about 10 minutes (30 seconds if disc is not loaded), it turns off to save the batteries

Note on CD-R and CD-RW

This unit can play CD-DA format audio CD-R and CD-RW that have been finalized* upon completion of recording. It may not be able to play some CD-R or CD-RW due to the condition of the recording. *Finalizing is a process that enables CD-R/CD-RW players to play audio CD-R and CD-RW.

Operation confirmation tones

This tone sounds when a button on the remote control is pressed. Refer to the parentheses in the illustration for the different types of confirmation tones.





Anti-Skip System

This system deals with skipping in a variety of ways:

- The thinner and lighter construction makes the unit less susceptible to vibration.
- An anti-skip mechanism prevents skipping caused when play speed changes due to swinging of the unit. •A recovery system immediately returns the laser pick-
- up to its original position if it is knocked off the track by a strong shock.
- •The 40-second anti-skip memory fills in interruptions caused by bumps and vibrations.

The anti-skip system works automatically while the unit is on and cannot be canceled.


When bumps continue repeatedly





- Insert batteries even when using the car adaptor to ensure a constant power supply for the unit's memory.
- •When you switch off the car, volume and sound quality may return to the original settings and the resume function may work even if you change the disc.
- It may not be possible to use the unit with some types of car stereos owing to restrictions imposed by the construction of the car stereo cassette adaptor.
- •Move the unit away from the car adaptor if noise interferes with the radio
- For further details, refer to the instructions of the part concerned.

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Turn off this unit and the other equipment before operation.

- 1 Connect the remote control to the unit's headphone jack.
- 2 Connect the stereo connection cable to the remote control's headphone jack and the terminals on the other unit. The unit may malfunction if you connect this cable
- directly to the unit.
- 3 Set the volume to 10. Make further volume adjustments with the other unit.



- If you connect speakers (active or otherwise) directly to the unit's headphone jack, ensure they have an impedance of 1 kΩ or less.



Listening Operation

You can tune directly to the station in Free Mode by finding the station's frequency, or you can store the station in Memory Mode to make tuning simpler. You can choose these modes with [TUNING MODE].

Free Mode Α

- 1 Release [HOLD].
- 2 Connect the wired remote control and stereo headphones/stereo earphones to $[\Omega]$. (Plug in firmly.)






