## Precautions

Before using this unit please read these operating instructions carefully. Take special care to follow the warnings indicated on the unit itself as well as the safety suggestions listed below. Afterwards keep them handy for future reference.

## Safety

- 1. Power Source -- The unit should be connected to power supply only of the type described in the operating instructions or as marked on the unit.
- Polarization -- If the unit is equipped with a polarized AC power plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other), that plug will fit into the AC outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug.
- 3. Power Cord Protection -- AC power supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them. Never take hold of the plug or cord if your hand is wet, and always grasp the plug body when connecting or disconnecting it.
- 4. Nonuse Periods -- When the unit is not used, turn the power off. When left unused for a long period of time, the unit should be unplugged from the household AC outlet.

#### Installation

#### Environment

- 1. Water and Moisture Do not use this unit near water-for example, near a bathtub, washbowl, swimming pool, or the like. Damp basements should also be avoided.
- 2. Condensation -- Moisture may form on the lens in the following conditions..
  - immediately after a heater has been turned on.
  - in a steamy or very humid room.
  - when the unit is suddenly moved from a cold environment to a warm one.

If moisture forms inside this unit, it may not operate properly. To correct this problem, turn on the power and wait about one hour for the moisture to evaporate.

3. Heat - The unit should be situated away from heat sources such as radiators and the like. It also should not be placed in temperatures less than 5°C (41°F) or greater than 35°C (95°F).

#### Placement

- 1. Ventilation -- The unit should be situated so that its location or position does not interfere with its proper ventilation. Allow 10 cm (4") clearance from the rear of the unit.
- 2. Foreign Material -- Care should be taken so that objects do not fall into and liquids are not spilled into the unit. Do not subject this unit to excessive smoke, dust, mechanical vibration, or shock.
- 3. Magnetism -- The unit should be situated away from equipment or devices that generate strong magnetic fields.
- 4. Stacking -- Do not place heavy objects, other than system components, on top of the unit.
- 5. Surface -- Place the unit on a flat, level surface.

6. Carts and Stands -- The unit should be used only with a cart or stand that is recommended by the manufacturer. The unit and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the unit and cart combination to overturn.



7. Wall or Ceiling Mounting -- The unit should not be mounted to a wall or ceiling, unless specified in this operating instructions.

#### Maintenance

Clean the cabinet, panel and controls with a soft cloth lightly moistened with mild detergent solution.

  - (a) The AC power supply cord or the plug has been damaged; or

#### Cautions on moving this unit

Before moving the changer to another location, be sure to remove all discs from the slots and turn off the changer.

Failure to do so will expose the compact discs and the changer to the risk of severe damage.

#### CAUTION


The changer mechanism automatically locks when power is turned off, to protect it against damage in transport.

Therefore, always press POWER and make sure "OFF" appears on the display before you unplug the changer.

#### Other cautions

Outside light or noise may sometimes cause the changer to detect a disc when there isn't one. However, the changer always correctly detects the disc when in the play mode no matter what.

Do not leave the front panel open. Infiltrating dust or other matter may lead to damage or malfunctions.



## Concerning the liner notes organizer 🗉


Your changer comes with a notebook-like binder (liner notes organizer) in which you can keep your CD liners. There are also adhesive numbers for indicating slot numbers in the binder. This is a convenient way to keep track of what disc is in what slot.




# Connections

- Set the changer on a flat, level surface.
- Before connecting the changer to your audio system, make sure that the power of the changer and all other system components is turned off.






Loader carriage Eject button

# Setting/Removing discs

## How to set discs



- Except when setting or removing discs, keep hands out of the changer while open. You could injure yourself if somehow entangled in the internal mechanism.
- Keep cassette tapes away from the magnetic latches.

# 2 Slide the loader carriage to the desired slot No. to insert a disc.

## Note

Slot No. 0 (SINGLE) is reserved for single disc play. (See page 11.)

# 3 Set the disc on the loader and flip the loader upwards.

Caution

- Do not use 3" (8 cm) discs fitted with expander rings. Expander rings could damage the disc slots.
- Do not use cleaning discs or warped discs. All of these could damage your changer.
- Do not use discs with poorly attached labels or stickers. Adhesive protruding from peeled off stickers can cause the changer to malfunction.
- Do not put anything other than discs in the changer.

## Note

If you leave the front panel open while a disc is in play, when the disc is over, the changer will stop.

## How to remove discs

Close the front panel gently.

- 1. Open the front panel.
- 2. Slide the loader carriage to the slot you want.
- 3. Press the eject button on the loader carriage.


## Special notes

You can set discs in the slots and remove them too, while playing discs.

- Do not set a disc in the slot of the disc being played (slot flashes). The disc in play is returned to its slot when finished. If two discs somehow jam in a slot, one or both could be damaged. When this happens, the message "TAKE OUT" will appear on the display. Remove the disc that doesn't belong in the slot and press the stop button.
- Do not open the front panel while the changer is changing discs.
- Sometimes the front panel cannot be opened while a disc is playing. It is a question of time. In such case, wait until you can open it.



## **Basic operations**

## Sequential play

The changer plays all the tracks on all the discs in order and stops automatically when the last track on the last disc finishes playing.

Before starting, load your discs.

## Press POWER.

The unit will switch on. Momentarily, the message "CHECKING DISCS" will appear on the display. When it gover out the last disc played will be displayed.

When it goes out, the last disc played will be displayed.



Press ▶.

Play will begin.

The "▶" indication will illuminate.

The disc number, the track number and the elapsed play time will be displayed.

The disc number is the same as the slot number.

### To stop play 🖪

#### Press 🔳.

The disc number and the total number of tracks of the current disc will be displayed.

The total playing time displayed includes the silent sections between tracks. For this reason, it may be a few seconds longer than the playing time indicated on the disc.

When you open the front panel, the total number of tracks and the total playing time go out.

#### Press ▶ to re-start play.


#### Note

It takes roughly 3 seconds from the time you press  $\blacksquare$  until the disc is returned to the slot.

- When in the stop mode, if you select an empty slot, the message "NO DISC" will appear on the display.
- While a disc is playing, if you select an empty slot, the changer will automatically play the next disc available.
- If you select "0", the changer will switch to the single disc play mode.

### To directly access a specific track



# Single disc play 🖬

Single disc play is convenient when wanting to playback a specific disc right away, without going through the usual selection procedure, for example, to listen to a disc you just bought.

# Open the front panel, and set the disc in the slot No. 0.

Face the disc label to the right and flip the loader upwards to set the disc.

## 2 Close the front panel and press SINGLE ►.

The changer plays all the tracks in order and stops automatically when the last track finishes playing.

# To cancel single disc play mode

- Select another disc with the numeric buttons.
- Skip to another disc with DISK SKIP (- or +).
- Select a group.

# ID scan function 🗉

#### (Only available from the remote control.)

This function is convenient to use when searching for a desired track.

The function will search from the beginning of the track for a loud section, and will play 10 seconds of the track centering around that point.

The order of scanning is the same as for play mode.



# To cancel ID scan

**Press ID SCAN while this function is in operation.** The "ID" indicator will go out.

The changer will continue to play from the track being played.




# Disc grouping play

With disc grouping play, you can register discs under any of five available groups (A-E) and then play back only the discs in a specific group.

- The same disc can be registered in as many groups as you like.
- Each group can hold up to 110 discs.
- You can name each group.

#### To make groups

To select a disc from 1 to 9 For example: "6"  $DISC \rightarrow 6$ To select disc from 10 to 110



Push the buttons within 7 seconds of each other.

#### Note

You cannot select slot No. 0.

#### For your reference

You can select discs with the DISC SKIP - and + buttons.

## 2 [Within 7 seconds]

Press GROUP ENTER.

If any groups have been registered already, their letters will light up.

## 3 [Within 7 seconds]

Press the DISC GROUPING PLAY button you want. (This inputs the disc into the group.)

For example: To input a disc in group A. Press [A].

To cancel disc grouping play mode

#### [In the stop mode]

# Press the DISC GROUPING PLAY button indicated on the display.


The group indication on the display will go out.

#### For your reference

The group contents will remain stored in memory even after the unit is switched off.

However, if the power cord is unplugged or the power supply is otherwise interrupted for an extended length of time, the contents will be erased from memory.

#### To name groups

You can name your groups. The changer has several preset names to choose from.

[During sequential play or while it is on stop] Press GROUP ENTER.

If any groups have been registered already, their letters will light up.

#### To cancel names


Select "RESET" in step 2 and then the name of the group you want to cancel in step 3. Thereafter, the group will appear as "GROUP ... (A,B,C,D or E.)".

#### To check what discs are in what groups

- 1. [During sequential play or while it is on stop] Press the DISC GROUPING PLAY button (A, B, C, D or E) you want and then press ■.
- Press either DISC SKIP button (- or +). Every time you press DISC SKIP, the next disc number in order is displayed.

### Note

After checking, if you press the button of a group that is lit on the display, the disc grouping mode disengages.

## To start play

Unless otherwise specified, the changer selects sequential play.

[During sequential play or while it is on stop] Press the DISC GROUPING PLAY button of the group you want.

Disc grouping play will start. For example: To hear group A Press A.

#### Note

- Unnamed groups will be displayed as "GROUP A, B, C, D or E".
- If you press the group button of a group which has no discs registered in it, the message "NO INPUT" will appear on the display.

#### To cancel discs from groups 🖪

## Select a disc.

After pressing the DISC button, press the number of the disc that you want to cancel.



# Program play

Program play lets you playback your favorite tracks in the sequence you want to hear them. The program can hold up to 32 steps.

If you enter non-existing disc(s) or track(s), the corresponding indicator illuminates and the entry is included in the count. In the play mode, the changer will cancel the non-existing entry.

## Program play

## To check programmed contents SL-MC410 only A

(Only available from the remote control.)

#### Press RECALL.

Each time you press RECALL, the display shows the programmed disc and track number in the sequence you have entered.

#### To clear a single item from the program 🔳

#### (Only available from the remote control.)

[In the stop mode]

#### Press CLEAR.

Each time you press CLEAR, you will cancel the last entry in the order of your programmed selections.

To clear an entry in the middle of the program sequence, press RECALL repeatedly until the display shows the selection to be cleared, and then press CLEAR within three seconds after that.

#### To cancel the program mode C

#### [In the stop mode]

#### Press PROGRAM.

The changer will return to the sequential play mode.

The programmed contents will remain stored in memory until they are cleared, even after the program mode is canceled.

Therefore, after programming, it is possible to cancel the program mode and use another play mode and then hear the same program again at a later time.

In addition, if discs are changed, the program will be played using the new discs. If non-existing entries are found at this time, the changer will cancel them.


#### For your reference

The program will remain stored in memory even after the unit is switched off.

However, if the power cord is unplugged or the power supply is otherwise interrupted for an extended length of time, the contents will be erased from memory.

#### Special note on recording programs

The changer needs time to change the discs and find the tracks. Consequently, it will take the changer slightly longer than the total track time to record everything. Exactly how much longer it will be will depend on the contents of the program.



# Direct programming

If, while listening to a certain track, you decide that you want to add that track to your program, you can with direct programming.

[While the track you want to program is playing] **Press DIRECT.** 

The current track will be added to the tail end of the program. When you make a program as explained under "Program play", and then perform the above procedure without clearing the program first, the selected track is added to the end of the program.

## Note

- You cannot add to the program if already full, that is, if already 32 selections have been programmed. If you press DIRECT in such case, the message "PGM FULL" will appear on the display. Therefore, direct programming is possible only when 31 or less tracks have been programmed.
- During program play, the DIRECT button does not respond to touch.

#### To listen to programmed tracks 🖪

[In the stop mode]

Press PROGRAM and check "PROGRAM" appears on the display, then press ▶.

The program will start from the first track.



# Random play

#### (Only available from the remote control.)

The tracks will be played in random order. There are two types of random play as described below.

#### One disc random play

The changer will play all tracks on the current disc in random order. Then, it will choose a new disc randomly, excluding the discs already played, and play all tracks on that disc in random order.

#### [In the stop or play mode]

# Press RANDOM MODE so that the "1 DISC RANDOM" indicator illuminates.

Each time the button is pressed, the display will change in the following order: 1 DISC RANDOM  $\rightarrow$  FULL RANDOM  $\rightarrow$  (off).

The changer will stop automatically when all the tracks on all discs have been played once.

#### In the single disc play mode

Only tracks from the disc in slot No.0 are played, though played in random order.

Every time you press RANDOM MODE, the display switches between OFF and "RANDOM".

#### In the disc grouping play mode.

The changer randomly plays tracks only from discs included in the selected group.

## Full random play

The changer will play tracks from all of the discs at random. However, it may choose the same track twice. In a single pass, the changer can play up to 250 tracks.

#### [In the stop or play mode]

# Press RANDOM MODE so that the "FULL RANDOM" indicator illuminates.

Each time the button is pressed, the display will change in the following order: 1 DISC RANDOM  $\rightarrow$  FULL RANDOM  $\rightarrow$  (off).

Once the changer has played the maximum 250 tracks, it stops automatically.

#### Note

The disc in slot No.0 will not be played.


#### In the disc grouping play mode.

The changer selects tracks randomly from all discs in the group but not from other groups.

#### To cancel random play mode

#### Press 🔳.

The "1 DISC (or FULL) RANDOM" indicator will go out.



# Repeat function 🛙

#### (Only available from the remote control.)

Play will continue endlessly in accordance with the specific play mode selected.

[Before or during play] Press REPEAT.

#### In the sequential play mode

All tracks of all discs will be played repeatedly.

In the single disc play mode

The changer will repeatedly play all tracks on the disc in slot No. 0. In the program play mode

The changer plays only the programmed selections in the programmed sequence repeatedly.

#### In the one disc random play mode

When the changer has played all the tracks on the current disc in random order. Then, it will choose a new disc randomly, excluding the discs already played, and play continuously. The sequence differs each time.

#### In the full random play mode

Once the changer has played the maximum 250 tracks, it will select a new random sequence and will continue playing.

#### To repeat the same track over and over

- 1. Select the desired track using the program play procedure on page 15.

## To skip discs

Use this function to skip discs when selecting a disc you wish to listen to.

You can use this function in stop, sequential play, one disc random play and disc grouping play modes.

# Press either DISC SKIP (- or +) until you reach the desired disc.

- -: Skips backwards to the preceding disc.
- +: Skips forward to next disc.

#### Note

- The changer skips over empty slots.
- This function does not work in the full disc random play mode or during program play.
- If you attempt to use this function during single disc play, the changer will cancel single disc play.

#### To skip tracks

Use this function to skip tracks when selecting a track which you wish to listen to.

# Press either SKIP/CURSOR (|a| < or >>) until you reach the desired track.



# **CD-TEXT** function

CD-TEXT disc has text informations such as titles, artist's name, etc. The CD-TEXT function is not available until you play a piece of the disc and the changer reads the text information. The same applies when changing discs too.

If the CDs you have are without text information, you can input the information yourself for eventual display. (see pg 23)

## To change the text information on the display

#### Press TEXT MODE.

The display is changed in the following order: In the stop mode


Album title → Artist name → Total playing time



- Text informations will each appear up to a maximum of 32 characters. During play, the recorded album title and/or song title is displayed in its entirety even if it is longer than 32 characters.
- Song titles are not displayed after a certain number of tracks if there are many tracks on the disc or if titles are exceptionally long.





## **CD-TEXT** function

## To input text information (Text edit)

You can input the album title and artist's name for discs without text information. Each album title and artist's name can be up to 32 characters long.



#### Press TEXT MODE until the "ALBUM" or "ARTIST" indication appears on the display.

To input an album title, call up "ALBUM" on the display. For an artist's name, make sure "ARTIST" is displayed.

#### Press TEXT EDIT.

The cursor will start flashing when the changer is in the text edit mode.

#### Press SEARCH/CHARACTER ( **d** or **b** ) to select the character.

If either SEARCH/CHARACTER button is pressed, the character changes.

You can select from the following letters and symbols to input text.

Letters and symbols appearing on the display may vary slightly from the printed listing.

As the  $\mathbf{\nabla}$  and  $\mathbf{A}$  buttons are pressed, character type and case change in the following order:




### Note

- It is not possible to add or overwrite text information on CD-TEXT discs.
- With discs not recorded with CD-TEXT, text information you input is linked to the specific slot No. when you make your input. Therefore, this information is deleted if you move the disc to another slot.



## Concerning compact discs

With this changer, you can only play compact discs having this mark.



### Handling precautions

Handle CDs as shown on the left  $(\mathbf{A} - \mathbf{D})$ .

- If you are taking the disc from a cold to a warm environment, moisture may form on the disc. Wipe this off with a soft, dry, lintfree cloth before using the disc.
- Do not write on the label side with a ball-point pen or other writing instrument.
- Do not use record cleaning sprays, benzine, thinner, static electricity prevention liquids or any other solvent.
- Do not use discs with poorly attached labels or stickers. Adhesive protruding from peeled off stickers can cause the changer to mal-function.

#### **Storage precautions**

Be sure to store discs in their cases to protect them from dust, scratches, and warping.

- Do not place or store discs in the following places:
- Locations exposed to direct sunlight
- Humid or dusty locations
- Locations directly exposed to a heat vent or heating appliance
- In the glove compartment or on the rear deck of an automobile


