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



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IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Read these operating instructions carefully before using the unit. Follow the safety instructions on the unit and the safety precautions listed below. Keep these operating instructions handy for future reference.

Safety

- Power source—Connect the unit to a power source of the type described in these instructions or as marked on the unit.
- 2. Polarization—The unit is equipped with a polarized power plug where one blade is wider than the other. This safety feature ensures that the plug fits into your household AC outlet only one way. If the plug doesn't fit one way, try reversing it. If the plug still doesn't fit, contact an efectrician to replace the obsolete outlet. Do not attempt to defeat the safety purpose of the plug.
- 3. Power cord protection—Route the AC power supply cord so that it will not be walked on or pinched by items placed on or against it. Never take hold of the plug or cord with wet hands. Always grasp the plug body firmly when connecting and disconnecting it.
- Overloading—When connecting the AC power supply cord, be careful not to overload the household AC outlet, extension cord, or outlet from any other device as this can result in fire or electric shock.

Installation

Placement

- Foreign material—Ensure objects and liquids do not get into the unit. Avoid exposing the unit to excessive smoke, dust, mechanical vibration, and shock.
- Magnetism—Situate the unit away from equipment and devices that generate strong magnetic fields.
- Stacking—Do not place anything on top of this unit.
- Wall and ceiling mounting— Do not mount the unit on watts or ceilings unless specified in the instructions.

Environment

- Water and moisture----Do not use the unit near water, such as near a bathtub or swimming pool. Avoid damp basements.
- Heat—Situate the unit away from heat sources, such as radiators. Do not leave it in an automobile exposed to direct sunlight with the doors and windows closed as this may deform the cabinet.

Do not situate where temperatures fall below 5°C (41°F) or rise above 35°C (95°F).

Maintenance

Unplug the unit from the household AC outlet before cleaning. Clean with a damp cloth. Do not use abrasive pads, scouring powders, or solvents.

Service

Getting started

Listening caution





Do not play your headphones or earphones at a high volume. Hearing experts advise against continuous extended play.

If you experience a ringing in your ears, reduce volume or discontinue use.

Do not use while operating a motorized vehicle. It may create a traffic hazard and is illegal in many areas.

You should use extreme caution or temporarily discontinue use in potentially hazardous situations.

Even if your headphones or earphones are the open-air type designed to let you hear outside sounds, don't turn up the volume so high that you can't hear what's around you.

Sound can be deceiving. Over time your hearing "comfort level" adapts to higher volumes of sound. So what sounds "normal" can actually be loud and harmful to your hearing.

Selection and care of batteries

Selection


As a safety precaution, this unit is constructed so it is impossible to recharge ordinary batteries.

Only batteries especially designed for this unit can be recharged.

Special rechargeable Ni-Cd batteries (set of 2)

- U.S.A. and Canada: P-3GAVA/2B
- •United Kingdom and Europe: P-3GAVE/2B
- Other areas: P-3GAVT/2B

For details, check with your dealer.




- You can recharge the batteries about 300 times. They have reached the end of their useful life if play time dramatically reduces after recharging.
- Play time may be shorter than usual after recharging batteries for the first time or after they have been unused for a long time. Repeatedly recharge and discharge the batteries if this occurs to restore them to normal.

Care

To prevent battery damage, electrolyte leakage, and short-circuiting, heed the following points.

- Do not peel off the covering on batteries and do not use if the covering has been peeled off.
- Align the poles ⊕ and ⊖ correctly when inserting the batteries.
- Do not mix different types of batteries or old and new batteries.
- Remove the batteries if you do not intend to use the unit for a long time.
- Do not throw into fire, short-circuit, disassemble, or subject to excessive heat.
- Do not attempt to recharge dry cell batteries.
- Do not allow metal objects to touch the battery terminals as this may cause short-circuiting which is dangerous.
- When carrying batteries in a pocket or bag, ensure no metal objects such as necklaces are placed together with them. Contact with metal may cause shortcircuiting which can cause a fire.


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Power supply

Using the AC adaptor

Use only the included AC adaptor. Use of other adaptors can damage the unit.



Note:

- The configuration of the AC adaptor differs according to the area.
- The unit is in the standby condition when the AC adaptor is connected. The primary circuit is always "live" as long as the AC adaptor is connected to an electrical outlet.

For areas except Europe, the U.S.A. and Canada

The AC voltage is different according to the area. Be sure to set the proper voltage in your area before use. (For details, please refer to page 2.)


When the unit is not to be used for a long time

The unit continues to use power (for U.S.A. and Canada: 1.9 W, for United Kingdom: 2.0 W, for Continental Europe: 2.1 W, for others: 1.5 W) when the AC adaptor is connected, even if the unit is off. Disconnect the AC adaptor to save electricity.

Do not connect or disconnect the AC adaptor while recording. This can cause recording to stop and data to be corrupted.

Using dry cell batteries (not included)

Disconnect the AC adaptor.



Use Panasonic alkaline batteries. (Operation time will be extremely short if you use manganese batteries.)

If the battery lid comes loose

Insert the protrusions on the lid into the holes in the unit.



Using rechargeable batteries (not included)

Obtain the optional rechargeable Ni-Cd batteries (- page 5).

Recharging

- Insert the special rechargeable batteries.
 (= Using dry cell batteries)
- Connect the AC adaptor.
 (→ Using the AC adaptor)

Recharging starts.

"CHARGE" flashes. "CHARGE" goes out when charging is complete (3 to 4 hours).



The optional rechargeable batteries take 3 to 4 hours to fully charge. Full charging can take up to 5 hours, depending on the ambient temperature and condition of the batteries.

Disconnect the AC adaptor (leaving it connected can discharge the batteries).

Note:

- You can recharge the batteries before they are fully discharged.
- Recharging may only be performed when the unit is off.
- It is normal for the AC adaptor and batteries to become warm during recharging.

The battery indicator

This indicator flashes when the batteries are almost fully discharged. Replace with fresh dry cell batteries or recharge.



Note:

- •The time between when the indicator starts flashing and when the power is cut off depends on the type of batteries you are using.
- This indicator may not function correctly if you use batteries other than the specified rechargeable batteries (
 page 5).
 - •Settings return to the default values if you disconnect the power sources (AC adaptor and batteries).
 - •If the unit malfunctions or freezes during use, disconnect the power sources (the AC adaptor or batteries).

Re-connect the power source and continue operation.

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Recording and playing on this unit

Recording

This unit uses the "SD Audio Format", an audio standard set down by the SD Association, which uses superior copyright protection technology.

Secure Digital Music Initiative (SDMI)

This is copyright-protection technology that encodes audio data to protect the rights of the producers of music, promote a healthy music industry, and protect the rights of the original purchaser of the music.

The use of this technology entails the following limitations.

- This unit encodes music data for recording. You cannot copy this data to other equipment.
- Encoded data cannot be backed-up or restored.
- It may be impossible to use data if it has copyright protection or if it was recorded on DVD Audio equipment.

Serial Copy Management System (SCMS)

Recordings from CDs to SD memory cards are restricted by this system. Such recordings are of high quality, but it is not possible to record from CDs that are restricted by this system,

Playback

- This unit's CD section cannot play AAC, MP3, or WMA audio data.
- This unit's SD card section can only play audio data (AAC, MP3, and WMA) recorded using the SD Audio Format

- WMA (Windows Media Audio) is a compression format developed by Microsoft Corporation. It achieves the same sound quality as MP3 with a file size that is smaller than that of MP3.



CD and SD card information

CDs

Choose CDs with this mark:

Do not:

- use CDs with labels and stickers that are coming off or with adhesive exuding from under labels and stickers.
- attach scratch-proof covers or any other kind of accessory.
- write anything on the CD.
- clean CDs with liquids. (Wipe with a soft, dry cloth.)
- use CDs printed with label printers available on the market.
- use irregularly shaped CDs.



CD-R and CD-RW discs

This unit can play CD-DA (digital audio) format audio CD-R and CD-RW that have been finalized (a process that enables CD-R and CD-RW players to play audio CD-R and CD-RW) upon completion of recording. It may not be able to play some CD-R/RW due to the condition of the recording.

SD cards

It may not be possible to use cards formatted on other equipment.

Protecting your recordings

- Do not open the SD lid or connect or disconnect the power sources while operating the unit, especially while "CARD Writing" is on the unit's display, as this can damage your data.
- .Set the write-protect switch to LOCK. Release the write-protect switch to make other recordings and to use the editing features.

Handling precautions


- Store cards in their cases when not in use.
- Do not take apart.
- •Do not touch the metal terminals with your hands or metal objects.
- •Do not detach the label and do not attach other labels.

CD and SD card storage

Do not store:

- In direct sunlight,
- In humid or dusty locations,
- In locations directly exposed to heating appliances,
- On the dashboard or rear deck of a car.

Inserting CDs and SD cards



Press on the center to lock into place.

Press on the center of

the card to unlock.



HOLD HOLD mode

HOLD

HOLD causes the unit to ignore short, accidental button presses. You can still open the disc and card lids.

It prevents:


- •The unit powering on accidentally and depleting the batteries.
- Interruption of play or recording due to a button being accidentally pressed.

The unit and remote control each have independent HOLD switches.

To use HOLD

Set [HOLD] to the "HOLD" position.

When HOLD on the main unit is on, "HOLD" appears on the display for a few seconds after pressing a button.



Release

Playing CDs and SD cards



3 Insert the CD or SD card (⇒ page 9).

4 Press [▶, SD] or [▶/II, CD]. The unit comes on and play starts. Play stops after the last track.

5 Adjust the volume.

Choose a level between 0 and 25. Press and hold to change successively.

The level returns to 10 when you disconnect the power sources (AC adaptor and batteries).

To stop play

Press [■, OPR OFF, FUNCTION] (main unit) or [■/▶] (remote control).

The unit turns off about 5 minutes later.



Position you stopped play Total play time

To turn the unit off

While stopped, press and hold [■, OPR OFF, FUNCTION] or [II/>] until the display goes out.

Skipping tracks

During play

Press [44] (Backward) or [11] (Forward).

Searching through tracks

During play

Press and hold [44] (Backward) or [11] (Forward).

Resume

The unit stores the place where you stop play or turn the unit off. Play starts from that position when you restart SD play (from the beginning of the track if you turned the unit off), or from the beginning of the track if you restart CD play.

Depending on the position or track, this may not work correctly.

Play starts from the first track if:


- You open the CD or SD lid.
- (Resume may work if you change the disc or card while the unit is off.)
- Disconnect the power source (AC adaptor or batteries) while off.

Auto power off

To save the batteries, the unit turns off after about five minutes after being stopped, unless menus are being used.

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Other ways of playing CDs and SD cards



Preparation: Press [III, OPR OFF, FUNCTION] to select CD or SD.

Boosting the bass

Press [S-XBS].

Each time you press the button: S-XBS ←→Cancel (no indicator)

Direct play:

Start play from a specific track

- 1. Press the character/numbered buttons to select track.
 - For tracks numbered 10 and over, press [≥10] then the two digits.
 - For tracks numbered 100 and over, press [≥10] twice then the three digits.
 - You can also press [I◄◀] or [▶▶I] to select the track.
 - •"ERROR" appears if you enter a number that doesn't exist on the disc or card.

2. Press [▶/II, CD] or [▶, SD].

Play starts at the selected track and plays through to the end of the disc or card.

Play modes:

Repeat one track (1- (-), all tracks ((-), play them randomly once (RANDOM) or repeatedly ((-) RANDOM)

Press [MODE, DEL].

Each time you press the button:

1- (Cancel (no indicator) ← Cancel (no indicator)

The mode cancels when you open the disc or card lid.

Note:

- When using the above modes (except "
), you can search only within the current track.
- In the "
 "mode, you can also skip and search between the first and last tracks. (You cannot skip or search back from the first track to the last track when playing a CD.)

•You cannot skip or search back to tracks that have been played in random or random repeat.

CD program play: Play up to 24 tracks in the order you choose

- 1 Press the numbered buttons while stopped to select a track.
 - ●For tracks numbered 10 and over, press [≧10] then the two digits.
 - You can also select tracks with [I<<] or [►►].
 - "ERROR" appears if you enter a number that doesn't exist.
- 2 Press [ENTER/MEMORY].



Program sequence

3 Repeat steps 1 and 2 to program other tracks.

4 Press [►/11, CD]. The program is cleared when play finishes.

"PROGRAM FULL" is displayed

If you have programmed 24 tracks.

To check the contents of the program

Press [ENTER/MEMORY] during play.

The track numbers and their sequence appear in order, one after the other.

To clear the program


Press [■, OPR OFF, FUNCTION] during play.

Note:

- •You cannot program tracks on an SD card.
- Tracks are skipped in the programmed order when you press [!◄◀] or [▶➡].

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Recording from a CD to an SD card (Main unit only)



Preparation:

- Release HOLD mode (⇒ page 9).
- Release the card's write-protect switch (⇒ page 8).
- Insert the SD card and CD (⇒ page 9).
- 2 Press [■, OPR OFF, FUNCTION] to switch to "CD".

Each time you press the button: CD↔SD

3 Press [REC PAUSE] to enter the recording standby mode. **Recording time meter** This gives you a rough guide to how much memory is left on the card. **Recording mode**

See next page.

4 Confirm that "REC OK" appears, then press [▶/II, CD].

Recording and CD play start. Recording starts from the first available space.

Play and recording stop when the CD ends.

To stop

Press [, OPR OFF, FUNCTION].

"CARD Writing" appears on the display while the unit writes to the card.

The unit turns off about 5 minutes later.

To turn the unit off

Press and hold [10, OPR OFF, FUNCTION] while stopped until the display goes out.

Note:

Recording modes

Total recording time and sound quality depend on the recording mode you choose for recording.

Changing the recording mode

1 While in the recording standby mode, press [MENU].

You can also change the recording mode while stopped.

- 2 Press [Idd] or [▶▶i] to select "REC MODE?".
- 3 Press [ENTER/MEMORY]. "BITRATE?" appears on the display.
- 4 Press [ENTER/MEMORY].
- 5 Press [I◄4] or [▶▶I] to select the recording mode.

Each time you press the button:



6 Press [ENTER/MEMORY].

To stop partway

Press [MENU] before step 6.

Track marks

These marks are added between tracks when recording. The area between two track marks is counted as one track.

Track marks are added automatically:

When recording CDs

Track marks correspond to those on the CD.

When recording from other equipment

If there is 2-second silence.

When recording through a microphone

Every 5 minutes.

Note:

- •You can change the way track marks are added when recording from other equipment or through a microphone (- page 15).
- •Track marks may not be added correctly in some cases.

Recording a track that is playing

Recording starts from the beginning of the track.

- Press [REC PAUSE] while playing the track. Play stops and the unit enters the recording standby mode.
- 2 Confirm that "1-REC OK" appears, then press [▶/II, CD].

Play and recording stop at the end of the track.

Recording selected tracks
