





- 1. In My Computer or Explorer, open the player's folder (removable disk or device).
- 2. Open the PLAYER folder.
- 3. Copy and paste or drag and drop the MP3/WMA files from your computer's folder into the PLAYER folder.
- "DOWNLOAD" appears on the player's display. Downloading is complete 10 seconds after "USB CONNECTED" re-appears.
- You can first put files into a new folder and then put that folder into the PLAYER folder. The folders are treated as sublists by the player and the names appear when you select play lists.
- Use only alphanumeric characters, no more than 36 words. If there are no ID3 tags, the display shows the "filename.mp3".
