PAUL F. HOLLOWAY is Director for Space at the NASA Langley Research Center. In this capacity, he is responsible for direction of a major segment of the Agency's Environmental Quality Program, for research and technology efforts in aerothermodynamics, including Shuttle development support, advanced transportation, and planetary entry; and for selected flight experiments and payload activities in these areas. Mr. Holloway has authored numerous papers in the areas of fluid and flight mechanics and has served the *Journal of Spacecraft and Rockets* as Associate Editor for the past six years. He recently returned to Langley from a tour of duty in NASA Headquarters as Deputy Associate Administrator for Aeronautics and Space Technology (acting).

WOODWARD WAESCHE, senior research engineer at United Technologies Research Center, is manager of the program to develop a propulsion system for an advanced ramjet. He received his B.A. in Physics from Williams College and his M.A. and Ph.D. in Aerospace and Mechanical Sciences from Princeton University. Dr. Waesche's field of research are solid rocket ballistics, propellant combustion, flame spectra, combustion instability, and ramjet ignition and combustion. Before joining United Technologies, he was with the Huntsville Division of Rohm & Haas. Dr. Waesche, an Associate Fellow of AIAA, has just completed a two-year term as Chairman of the Propellants and Combustion Technical Committee. He presently is chairman of JANNAF Airbreathing Combustor Development Committee.
