He received his B.S. in Military Engineering and Science from West Point, his M.S. in Aeronautics and Astronautics from Stanford University, and his Ph.D. in Mechanical Engineering from Brigham Young University. He has nearly 20 years of experience in all phases of the development and management of defense-related, high-technology programs supporting space and ballistic systems. His responsibilities have included conducting trade studies leading to advanced space and ballistic missile concepts; initiating technology thrusts in space data processing, spacecraft autonomy, infrared surveillance, and space power (including nuclear); program management; system integration; and launch operations. Dr. Redd is an Associate Fellow of AIAA and a recipient of the Sigma Xi Certificate of Merit for Outstanding Dissertation, the Legion of Merit with One Oak Leaf Cluster, the Air Force Meritorious Service Medal, and the Army Commendation Medal.
