The crystal structure of di-*p*-anisyl nitric oxide: correction

An error in the above paper by A. W. Hanson (*Acta Cryst.* (1953), 6, 32) has been pointed out to the author by Dr R. W. G. Wyckoff. In the table of atomic coordinates, the *z* coordinate for O₁ should be replaced by $z + \frac{1}{2}c = -0.73 + 3.13 = 2.40 \text{ \AA}$, and that for C₇ by $z - \frac{1}{2}c = 0.75 - 3.13 = -2.38 \text{ \AA}$.

The table was not used explicitly in the calculation of bond lengths and angles, and the paper is believed to be otherwise correct.

Acta Crystallographica

1. The December issue of the current volume will be devoted to a report of the Fourth General Assembly and International Congress of the Union, held in Montreal, Canada, during the period 10–19 July 1957. In addition to a record of the business conducted at the Assembly it will contain corrected abstracts of all papers presented to the Congress.
