Information for authors

The primary purposes of Advances in Nursing Science are to stimulate the development of nursing science and promote application in practice of emerging theories and research findings. Advances in Nursing Science welcomes unsolicited manuscripts prepared in accordance with these purposes and with the specific issue topics given below. Detailed instructions for manuscript preparation and submission of articles are contained in the Author's Guide, which can be obtained from the Editor, ANS, Aspen Systems Corporation, 1600 Research Boulevard, Rockville, MD 20850. All manuscripts must be prepared in accordance with this guide to be considered for publication.

All manuscripts are to be submitted for consideration for publication in a specific issue of ANS. The following descriptions of projected topics for ANS include suggested themes and deadline dates for receipt of articles by the editor. Authors are encouraged to submit articles no more than 4 months in advance of the deadline dates given below but articles should be received *no later than* the deadline date.

VOL. 8:1—QUALITY OF LIFE. Articles are sought that provide a nursing perspective on the definition and promotion of quality of life in health and illness. The focus of articles can include research evidence related to nursing interventions promoting quality of life, conceptual development of theoretical propo-

sitions in nursing related to quality of life variables, and analysis of ethical issues in determining or promoting quality of life. *Deadline date:* March 1, 1985.

VOL. 8:2—GROUP DYNAMICS. Articles are sought that provide theoretical and/or research evidence related to phenomena that are manifested in groups. Measurement of group phenomena and testing and development of strategies for group intervention are of particular interest. Articles should include clear implications for the development of nursing knowledge and nursing practice. *Deadline date:* June 1, 1985.

VOL. 8:3—METHODOLOGIC ISSUES. Articles are sought that focus on research and theory development methods. Reports of research or theory development can be used to illustrate innovative methodologic approaches, or articles may focus on description of creative approaches. Articles that present debates around methodologic issues are also invited. *Deadline date:* September 1, 1985.

VOL. 8:4—VIOLENCE, THE FAMILY, AND SOCIETY. Reports of research and theory development articles are sought that focus on violence, interpreted as a psychological, mental, and/or physical phenomenon. Articles may address ethical and research methodology issues related to the study of violence. Articles should include clear implications for the development of nursing knowledge and practice. *Deadline date:* December 1, 1985.
