## General Information

## Purpose

The purpose of the Fourth International Conference on Antiviral Research is to provide an interdisciplinary forum at which investigators involved in basic, applied, and clinical research worldwide can meet to review recent developments in all areas of antiviral research. Specific topics to be covered in the program include synthesis and chemistry, in vitro evaluation, biochemistry and mechanism of action, molecular biology and targeting, immunotherapy, animal models, pharmacology and drug delivery, toxicology, and clinical trials. Within these areas of interest there will be invited "overview" speakers, oral presentations and poster presentations.

## Date/Location

The conference will be held on April 21 (Sunday) – April 26 (Friday), 1991. All conference activities will be held in the Inter•Continental Hotel in downtown New Orleans. One half day will be left free so you may enjoy the city and its surroundings, and there will be optional programs available during the other days for accompanying persons not attending the scientific sessions. There will also be an opening reception and a conference banquet for all attendees.

More than a dozen tents and stages set up on the grounds of the Fairgrounds offer continuous groups playing jazz, gospel, country, Cajun, and, not the least, rock music. These are all set in surroundings of many craft booths and excellent food booths.
