# Snyder's-Lance Headquarters Showcases Company Culture

Snyder's-Lance moved into its new home this summer. The historical timeline and vintage truck are on display in the lobby.



#### Clean Slate

Lance got its start in 1913 in Charlotte after a coffee bean broker, Philip Lance, received an order of 500 pounds of raw peanuts instead of coffee beans for his customers. Stuck with the unexpected order, he roasted the nuts in his kitchen and sold them for a nickel a bag. The roasted peanuts were a success, and he started crushing them to make peanut butter for sale. Later, his wife and daughter spread the peanut butter between two crackers and created the peanut butter cracker sandwich.

Snyder's of Hanover weaves together three generations of the Warehime family. Harry Warehime began making pretzels in 1909 at the Hanover Pretzel Company. In 1960, Warehime's son, Alan, purchased a potato chip company and expanded into pretzels, using his father's pretzels as the core for the company's Olde Tyme pretzel recipe. Alan's son, Michael, later would lead the company and oversee its expansion across the globe. The company's pretzels even made their way to Antarctica, ordered by a research scientist based there.





"This is where people spend a lot of time," Levy says. "We want people to walk around, interact and run ideas off each other. That's what this space has allowed us to have."





"Incredible" also characterizes the fastgrowing acting career of 40-year-old Ballantyne resident Corey Maher.







### Preserve Garden Bounty to Enjoy Year-Round

AS THE DAYS BEGIN to shorten, the sun rides a little lower in the Carolina sky. Autumn is arriving — and with it, a bounty of fruits and vegetables. It's time to put up the preserves and stock the pantry for the colder months to come.

But what if you're a busy family with no time to garden? A condo dweller with no dirt to dig? Worst of all, what if you've never tried your hand at growing or preserving anything at all, in summer or the rest of the year?

The first rule of (green) thumb is "Keep it simple."

That's the advice from Francie Dunlop, whose family grows everything from asparagus to zucchini in their garden just across the line in Union County. She explains that novices and city dwellers who live in close quarters can still enjoy the process. "For a beginner."

I recommend you start by just growing a few things you love," she says. "Our oldest lives in town, and grew her first tomatoes, peppers and basil in pots this year. Like much of Charlotte, her yard doesn't have a lot of sun, but she managed to position them where they got enough."

This area's mostly mild weather is an advantage. "In our climate, you can grow and eat something out of your garden every month of the year," Dunlop says.



#### Blueberry BALSAMIC VINEGAR

4 cups fresh or frozen blueberries

1 quart white balsamic vinegar

1/4 cup sugar

1 whole lime, strips of zest

3-inch cinnamon stick

Yield: 5 cups

In a large nonreactive saucepan with a potato masher or the back of a large spoon, crush the blueberries. Add vinegar, sugar, lime zest and cinnamon. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer, covered, 20 minutes.

Cool slightly. Pour into a large bowl. Cover and refrigerate for two days to allow flavors to blend.

Place a strainer over a large bowl. In batches, ladle blueberry mixture into strainer. With a large spoon, press out as much liquid as possible. Discard solids. Pour vinegar into clean glass bottles or jars. Refrigerate, tightly covered, until ready to use.

**Tip:** Easily extend this recipe into a blueberry vinaigrette. Combine 3 tablespoons of the above vinegar with 1/4 cup of extra virgin olive oil, 1/2 teaspoon of salt and 1/8 teaspoon of ground black pepper.

#### 'Tower Garden'

Amy Steinmetz has lived in what is now Ballantyne since 1987, long before developers broke ground on what would become the destination it is today. She says that on even the smallest patio or balcony, anyone can set up a vertical "Tower Garden" to grow herbs, fruits and vegetables, without kneeling in the dirt or spending hours in the scorching sun. Best of all, it's never too late to start. Steinmetz says, "I'm receiving pictures of broccoli, kale and strawberries from my 80-plusyear-old mother, a woman I've never seen touch the soil other than to replace a divot on the golf course."

Yet, sometimes a season will slip away before a gardener gets the seeds started. And you need not grow your own fruits and vegetables to enjoy the satisfaction of preserving the harvest. Regardless of whether you've picked or purchased all those berries, cucumbers and herbs, you may be wondering what to do with an overflow, or simply how to enjoy late summer's bounty year-round.

Pickling okra and cucumbers is great way to enjoy a tasty treat anytime of year.

Nothing could be easier than gathering handfuls of fresh herbs, tying them together in loose bundles and hanging them to dry in the sun.

Or, adding plain or flavored vinegars to sliced cucumbers or squash, then putting them in lidded jars, will yield plenty of quick, refrigerator pickles.

For longer-lasting storage, Dunlop explains, "Drying is easy with a dehydrator. We really appreciate our jars of dried veggies in the winter, when we can quickly pour them into the Crock-Pot with broth, water and seasoning and let it





for cooking, growing and harvesting," Davis says.

Backyard or patio gardeners can suffer the same maladies that befall experienced growers. Dunlop's daughter lost her very first tomato to an unseen pest with the good taste to nibble the fruit just as it reached its prime. Deer and rabbits still live inside the city limits, and they can devour a garden with astonishing speed. Mice will eat strawberries. "Raccoons will always let you know a week before your sweet corn is ready," Dunlop says wryly.

Still, there's something uniquely satisfying about looking to your pantry shelf on a gray winter day and seeing those jars of jam filled

#### Uncooked BLACKBERRY or RASPBERRY JAM

3 cups crushed fresh blackberries or raspberries (about 1 1/2 quarts of fruit) 5 1/4 cups sugar 1 box regular powdered pectin 3/4 cup water

Yield: approximately 7 half-pint jars

If blackberries are seedy, put part or all of them through a sieve or food mill. Measure 3 cups of prepared berries. Place in an extra large mixing bowl. Add sugar, mix well and let stand for 10 minutes, stirring occasionally.

Dissolve the powdered pectin in the water, bring to a boil and boil for one minute. Add pectin to berries and sugar and stir for 3 minutes.

Pour the jam into clean, dry freezer containers or half-pint canning jars, leaving 1/2-inch of space above the jam. Cover container. Let stand at room temperature until set (up to 24 hours). Freeze or refrigerate.

# 'Beer Geek'

#### Learn about Brews, Perfect Pairings from Local Expert

Kit Burkholder's passion for golden amber brewed beverages led him to one of the most enviable and refreshing jobs in all of Ballantyne.

Burkholder, 36, is the official "beer guy" for the Harris Teeter Ballantyne Commons East store. He helps patrons navigate and select the perfect brew from a staggering variety of choices on hand, several hundred, according to Burkholder.

"I want people to enjoy the beer experience and have high expectations of what that can be, especially when enjoying beer, cider or mead with family and friends," says Burkholder. "I'm a beer geek and love to share what I know with others."

#### **Lifelong Passion**

The former businessto-business salesman decided to pursue his lifelong interest and passion for beer after losing his corporate job. Burkholder discovered the serious side to the beverage when he happened upon a comprehensive selfstudy program leading to his designation as a certified cicerone through the Cicerone Certification Program.

Similar to a sommelier, an expert with extensive knowledge of wine, a cicerone is becoming the industry standard for individuals with significant expertise in all matters beer, including brewing, sales and service.

"Cicerone is the Italian word for guide," says Burkholder. "Gaining my certification is something I've wanted to do for quite

#### **Craft Brews Take Off**

Burkholder started at Harris Teeter helping with the wine and beer stocking and serving at the in-store bar. He quickly graduated to helping select inventory, working with distributors and forging relationships with local craft brewers.

"The craft beer scene in Charlotte is taking off," says Burkholder, "though it hasn't begun to see its full maturity. We carry several local brewery labels, including beers from Olde Mecklenburg, Birdsong and Sugar Creek. NoDa Brewing Company's Hop, Drop and Roll is the number-one selling beer in our store."

Burkholder's gregarious nature and natural disposition toward educating customers lead people to seek him out, especially for pairing recommendations with food.

"Food pairings are one of the most fun aspects of my job," he says. "I enjoy helping people find unique combinations from our very eclectic selection. It's fun to share nuances of a special beer (to go) with a dessert, something many people don't think of. I love an Allagash Tripel, for example, with a lemon tart. 






#### **Local Norms**






