NEW VOLUME CODING FOR BBA-BIOMEMBRANES

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The overall volume-numbering system and colour code are to be maintained; however, instead of the series number, each section is to be given its own sequential volume numbers, these being assigned in retrospect to the volumes already published in that section. This system will run parallel to the overall BBA scheme: for the BIOMEMBRANES section the correspondence is indicated below.

Parallel volume coding for Biomembranes

BBA 135 = M 1 (1967)

BBA 150 = M 2 (1968)

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
