New members have been appointed to the Editorial Advisory Board to replace other distinguished scientists, many of whom have given their support to the journal since its inception in 1987. We thank them wholeheartedly for their continuous advice and ideas during these years.

Further, two obvious new features have been introduced with this issue of Catalysis Today: the new cover design and the larger page size. The journal also moves to a two-column format.

There is a trend towards a limited number of standardized journal sizes, which has obvious advantages for the optimization of shelf space use in libraries.

The cover integrates the journal into our complete catalysis publication programme. The new format will enhance readability and allow a more efficient use of space because of the increased flexibility in the positioning of illustrations and tables. The amount of information per volume will not be affected by the changes, and these can be made on a cost-neutral basis.
