

Isolation of a Co-ordinated Ketol Intermediate in the Hydrolysis of PF_6^- Initiated by the Labile Cations $[\text{Ru}(\eta^6\text{-arene})(\text{acetone})_3]^{2+}$; X-Ray Crystal Structure of Acetone(4-hydroxy-4-methylpentan-2-one)- $(\eta^6\text{-mesitylene})$ ruthenium Bistetrafluoroborate

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Summary Formation of the tri- μ -difluorophosphato complexes $[\text{Ru}_2(\mu\text{-PO}_2\text{F}_2)_3(\eta^6\text{-arene})_2][\text{PF}_6]$ from $[\text{Ru}(\eta^6\text{-arene})(\text{acetone})_3][\text{PF}_6]_2$ proceeds *via* di-cations $[\text{Ru}(\eta^6\text{-arene})(4\text{-hydroxy-4-methylpentan-2-one})(\text{acetone})]^{2+}$; the mesitylene complex has been isolated as its BF_4^- salt and characterised by single crystal X-ray analysis.

MAITLIS and his co-workers¹⁻⁴ have shown that labile, synthetically useful tris(acetone) species $[\text{M}(\eta^5\text{-C}_5\text{Me}_5)(\text{OCMe}_2)_3]^{2+}$ (M = Rh, Ir) can be generated *in situ* by the action of AgPF_6 on $[\text{MCl}_2(\eta^5\text{-C}_5\text{Me}_5)_2]$. We find that analogous arene ruthenium(II) cations $[\text{Ru}(\eta^6\text{-arene})(\text{OCMe}_2)_3]^{2+}$ (**1**) are formed in solution from the reaction of AgPF_6 or AgBF_4 with $[\text{RuCl}_2(\eta^6\text{-arene})_2]^{2+}$ in dry acetone, and that the salts can be isolated at temperatures below 0 °C as thermally labile, yellow microcrystalline solids. Although satisfactory analytical data could not be obtained, spectroscopic data show unequivocally the presence of three co-ordinated acetone molecules, *e.g.* $[\text{Ru}(\eta^6\text{-C}_6\text{Me}_6)(\text{OCMe}_2)_3][\text{PF}_6]_2$: ¹H n.m.r. ($[\text{C}_6\text{H}_6]\text{-Me}_2\text{SO}$) δ 2.07 (s, 18H, C₆Me₆) and 2.98 (s, 18H, Me₂CO); i.r. (Nujol) 1665 cm⁻¹ [$\nu(\text{C}=\text{O})$].

The normally inert anion in the $[\text{Ru}(\eta^6\text{-arene})(\text{OCMe}_2)_3][\text{PF}_6]_2$ salts undergoes partial hydrolysis at room temperature over a period of 2 h to give mainly mesityl oxide and the tri- μ -difluorophosphato complexes $[\text{Ru}_2(\mu\text{-PO}_2\text{F}_2)_3(\eta^6\text{-arene})_2][\text{PF}_6]$ (**2**) in high yield, *e.g.* for arene = C₆Me₆: ³¹P n.m.r. ($[\text{C}_6\text{H}_6]\text{-Me}_2\text{CO}$)† δ_{P} -13.1 (t, 3P, ¹J_{PF} 951 Hz, PO₂F₂), and -144.5 (septet, 1P, ¹J_{PF} 708 Hz, PF₆); ¹⁹F n.m.r. ($[\text{C}_6\text{H}_6]\text{-Me}_2\text{CO}$) δ_{F} ‡ -63.0 (d, 6F, PO₂F₂) and -67.9 (d, 6F, PF₆); i.r. (Nujol) 1300(s), 1146(s) [$\nu(\text{PO}_2)$], 869(s), 852(s), 836(s) [$\nu(\text{PF})$], 558(s) [$\delta(\text{PF})$], and 486(s) [$\delta(\text{POF})$] cm⁻¹. A similar reaction occurs more slowly (54 °C; 18 h) in the case of $[\text{Rh}(\eta^5\text{-C}_5\text{Me}_5)(\text{OCMe}_2)_3][\text{PF}_6]_2$,^{1,3} and the reaction of $[\text{MnCl}(\text{CO})_5]$ with AgPF_6 is reported to give $[\text{Mn}(\text{O}_2\text{PF}_2)(\text{CO})_5]$.⁶ The first step in our system seems to involve an aldol condensation between two acetone molecules. Thus, $[\text{Ru}(\eta^6\text{-C}_6\text{H}_3\text{Me}_3)(\text{OCMe}_2)_3][\text{BF}_4]_2$ isomerises rapidly at room temperature to give a complex $[\text{Ru}(\eta^6\text{-C}_6\text{H}_3\text{Me}_3)(\text{OCMe}_2)(\text{Me}_2\text{C}(\text{OH})\text{CH}_2\text{COME})][\text{BF}_4]_2$ (**3**) containing bidentate 4-hydroxy-4-methylpentan-2-one, which reacts with NH_4PF_6 to give (**2**) (arene = mesitylene) quantitatively. The structure of (**3**) has been elucidated by single crystal X-ray analysis.

‡ In p.p.m. relative to CFCl₃, measured using C₆F₆ as external reference; downfield is taken as positive.

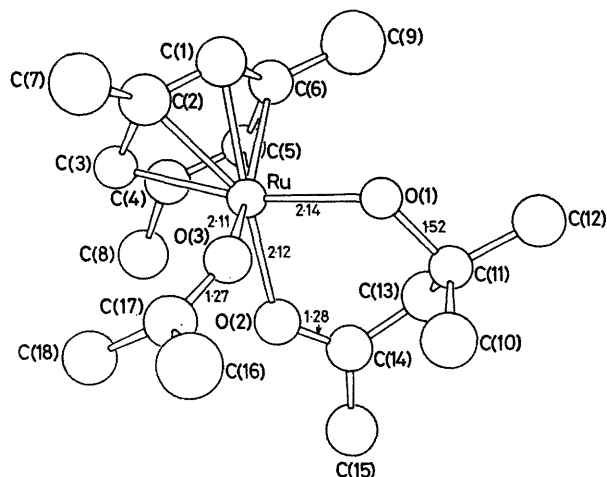

Crystal data: $\text{C}_{18}\text{H}_{30}\text{B}_2\text{F}_8\text{O}_3\text{Ru}$, $M = 569.2$, monoclinic, space group $P2_1/c$, with $a = 8.217(3)$, $b = 16.727(7)$, and $c = 17.431(8)$ Å, $\beta = 94.60(4)^\circ$, $Z = 4$, $D_c = 1.580$ g ml $^{-1}$, $D_m = 1.579$ g ml $^{-1}$, $\mu = 7.35$ cm $^{-1}$, Mo- K_α radiation. The 3763 observed reflections [$I > 3\sigma(I)$] having $2\theta \leq 60^\circ$ were measured with a fully automated Philips PW1100-20 diffractometer. The structure was solved by straightforward application of the heavy atom method and refined

to a current R value of 0.127 employing isotropic thermal parameters on all atoms. One of the BF_4^- groups appears to be disordered. §

The ruthenium atom is bound approximately symmetrically to the six aromatic carbon atoms of the mesitylene ligand (Ru-C bond lengths 2.16–2.20 Å), to the oxygen of an acetone ligand (Ru-O 2.11 Å), and to both oxygen atoms of the pentanone (Ru-O 2.12 and 2.14 Å). That the two oxygen atoms of the pentanone are different is evident from the C-O bond distances. The C(11)-O(1) (alcoholic oxygen) distance of 1.52 Å is significantly longer than the C(14)-O(2) (ketonic oxygen) bond length of 1.28 Å and the C(17)-O(3) bond distance of 1.27 Å for the acetone ligand. Furthermore, the six angles around C(11) range from 105.7 to 113.9° and are all close to the ideal tetrahedral angle of 109.5°, whereas the C(13)-C(14)-C(15), C(13)-C(14)-O(2), and C(15)-C(14)-O(2) bond angles of 102.9, 122.1, and 116.9° respectively indicate that C(14) is trigonally hybridised.

The O-donors in complexes (1)–(3) are readily substituted by other ligands, *e.g.* Me_2SO , pyridine, MeCN, PhCN, or $\text{P}(\text{OMe})_3$ to give $[\text{Ru}(\eta^6\text{-arene})\text{L}_3]^{2+}$ salts, and by both electron-withdrawing and -donating arenes in the presence of trifluoroacetic acid to give almost quantitative yields of dicationic mixed arene complexes $[\text{Ru}(\text{arene}^1)(\text{arene}^2)]\text{Y}_2$ ($\text{Y} = \text{PF}_6$ or BF_4 ; $\text{arene}^1 = \text{C}_6\text{H}_6$, $\text{C}_6\text{H}_3\text{Me}_3$, or C_6Me_6 ; $\text{arene}^2 = \text{C}_6\text{H}_6$, $\text{C}_6\text{H}_3\text{Me}_3$, C_6Me_6 , PhOMe, PhCl, PhCOMe, PhCO_2Me , PhNMe $_2$, or naphthalene).
