COUMARINS OF THE FRUIT OF ANGELICA DECURSIVA

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As has been shown previously, the fruit of Angelica decursiva (Miq.) Franch. et Savat. contains a considerable amount of coumarins forming a mixture of several substances [1-3]. From the fruit of this species collected in the Maritime Territory in the valley of the R. Sandugi, we have obtained the total lactones (1.34%), consisting of six components with R_f 0.97, 0.92, 0.88, 0.84, 0.41 (traces), and 0.03 (Leningrad type B paper impregnated with a 10% solution of formamide in methanol; mobile phase: n-hexane-benzene-methanol (5:4:1)).

By chromatography on a column of alumina, from the purified total coumarins we have isolated five individual lactones: umbelliprenin, $C_{24}H_{30}O_3$, mp 61-62° C, R_f 0.97, isoimperatorin, $C_{16}H_{14}O_4$, mp 107-109° C, R_f 0.92; imperatorin, $C_{16}H_{14}O_4$, mp 101-102° C, R_f 0.88; (+)-oxypeucedanin, $C_{16}H_{14}O_5$, mp 103-104° C, $[\alpha]_D^{22}$ +17.8° (c 0.84; chloroform), R_f 0.84; and (+)-oxypeucedanin hydrate, $C_{16}H_{16}O_6$, mp 129-130° C, $[\alpha]_D^{22}$ +23.4 (c 0.96; acetone), R_f 0.03.

The authenticity of the substances was established by their IR spectra, the preparation of derivatives, and the absence of depressions of the melting points in mixture with known samples.

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
