
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Chemistry in Ecology publishes review articles, original papers and short communications on the role of chemistry in ecological processes. The elucidation of the influence of chemical state upon biological activity, broad scale effects and theory is essential to a balanced view of these processes.

Land, sea and fresh water are often treated as isolated systems lacking interaction. This approach is not wholly satisfactory to the ecologist, and while acknowledging that an understanding of whole systems depends upon a proper appraisal of the contributory parts, *Chemistry in Ecology* reflects the wider view.
