* A longer bibliography has been completed which contains all of Shorey's published writings, classical and nonclassical. The entries, most of them annotated, number 833. In addition, the full bibliography lists typescripts of varying completeness of 106 lectures, exclusive of those given in Germany; it also lists topics of 115 lectures and addresses, with dates and places of presentation. Typescripts of only a few of these have been found.

During the six years since I embarked on this bibliographical project I have been in correspondence with six private, eighteen public, and forty-three university libraries in the United States, as well as libraries in Toronto, Edinburgh, Munich, and Athens, the Library of Congress, the Center for Hellenic Studies, and my own George Washington University. To all of them I give this blanket expression of appreciation. At a later date I hope to thank them more specifically in connection with publication of the longer bibliography.

I owe a special debt of gratitude to Mr. Robert Rosenthal, Curator, Special Collections, The University of Chicago Library, and to his staff; to Ms. Martha Hubbard, Reference Librarian, and Ms. M. C. Beecheno, Special Collections, The Johns Hopkins University; to Ms. Diana Haskell, Curator of Modern Manuscripts, and Ms. Carolyn A. Sheehy, Special Collections, The Newberry Library; to Dr. Rosamond Sprague, Professor of Philosophy, The University of South Carolina; to Dr. James Poultney, Professor Emeritus of Classics, The Johns Hopkins University; to Ms. Lucy Fisher West, Archivist, Bryn Mawr College; to Dr. Jeno Platthy, Librarian of the Center for Hellenic Studies; to Dr. Lilian Bodson, University of Liège; to the late Dr. Edward L. Bassett, The University of Chicago; and to Mrs. Shorey Miller (John P.) Armstrong, Professor Shorey's niece and closest living relative. I also count myself unusually fortunate in having had the advice of Dr. Harold F. Cherniss, Professor Emeritus, The Institute for Advanced Study, and of Dr. Edgar C. Reinke, Professor Emeritus of Foreign Languages, Valparaiso University, who has also given invaluable service by translating Shorey's German lectures and the reviews of his publications by German scholars. And thanks not least of all to my wife, Helen, without whose continuous support and help in numerous ways this bibliography would have been even longer in the making.
