### FOURTH EORTC-NIC SYMPOSIUM ON NEW DRUGS IN CANCER THERAPY

Brussels, Belgium, 15-17 December 1983

The Fourth European Organization for Research on Treatment of Cancer (EORTC)-National Cancer Institute (NCI) Symposium on "New Drugs in Cancer Therapy" is scheduled for 15-17 December 1983 in Brussels, Belgium. The symposium will focus on phase I and phase II clinical data, including drug pharmacology with investigational anticancer agents. Preclinical aspects in new drug development areas will also be covered, with particular emphasis on the role of the human stem cell assay in the screening of new antitumor drugs. The program will include invited presentations and free communications. Free communications will be selected on the basis of submitted abstracts. Abstracts must be received at the EORTC Data Center by 31 October 1983. Seating is limited and preregistration is recommended. The registration fee is U.S. \$135.00.
