Introduction

For the first time, to accompany proceedings at ECCO 11 — the European Cancer Conference, and for successive ECCO conferences, the Board of FECS has decided to produce an Educational Book to further promote the Federation's philosophy of a multidisciplinary approach to the treatment of cancer. The ECCO 11 Scientific Committee and the Education and Training Committee of FECS selected four of the most prevalent tumour types — breast, lung, prostate and colorectal cancer.
