Data which are so comprehensive, that they are difficult to present in other forms than tables and diagrams and very time-consuming to collect by searching databases as MEDLINE. Furthermore, the text contains detailed

references for those readers interested in details in the primary literature. In conclusion, 'Immune reactions' represents a valuable contribution which generally is well presented, although it would have improved the book if it, in addition to the table of content, contained an index for searching in the tables and diagrams.
