Greek ῥώμη, ῥῶσις

Georgi T. Rikov gives an excellent analysis (*Linguistique Balkanique* 25, 1982, 81–2) of Greek ῥώμη and ῥῶσις. Both formations in IE **-mā¹*) and **-ti-* should show zero-grade; therefore **r_h-*. However, the initial **s-* which is posited depends crucially on the equation with Skt. *sāra-*.

Yet a plausible account of *sāra-* in this context requires Brugmann's Law, i.e. **sóro-*, which in turn presupposes an *aniṭ* formation. Unless further cognates can be identified this ingenious equation hangs on a very slender thread – joining an isolated set (set with a solitary *aniṭ*) instance.

At this point the original Greek initial remains ambiguous.
