One award (US\$1,000) will be presented at the XXII International Symposium on Glycoconjugates (GLYCO 22) scheduled in Dalian, China, from June 23– 28, 2013. The awardee will present his/her accomplishments at GLYCO 22. Travel expenses of up to US\$1,500 will be provided.

Candidates should already have their PhD/DPhil, but may apply no later than 6 years after receiving their doctorate (in case of parental leave, this limit can be extended by up to 2 years per child). As a general guideline, candidates should have minimum of 6 papers as first, last or corresponding author in respected international journals.
