Self-implanted subcutaneous penile balls – a new phenomenon in Western Europe

Sir,

I read with intrest Rothschild's paper on subcutaneous penile balls, and note that the phenomenon is as uncommon here in southern Africa as it apparently is in Western Europe.

And in my nine years of doing forensic pathology here, only three other cases were seen by my collegues: all of them Oriental merchant marine sailors who died within our territorial waters, and as a consequence required our services.

I suspect there is no causal relationship between satanism per se and penile implants, although my ignorance of both is vast. It is hoped that Rothschild's paper and this letter will generate elucidative correspondence.
