PLASTICITY '89

The 2nd International Symposium on
Plasticity and its Current Applications
31 July-4 Aug 1989, Mie University, Tsu, Mie Prefecture, Japan

Scope and Special Topics

The main emphasis is on dynamic plasticity (including dynamic fracture mechanics) and micro-mechanics, however research in any area of plasticity will be presented. The topics of papers include plastic and viscoplastic behaviors of single crystals and polycrystalline metals, ceramics, ice, rocks and soils, composite materials and polymers, as well as plasticity aspects of damage, failure and fracture mechanics. The presentations are to include experimental, numerical or theoretical contributions to the inelastic behavior of solids subjected to quasi-static, dynamic, or cyclic thermo-mechanical loadings. The symposium is comprised of invited papers and contributed presentations; poster sessions and exhibitions are also being organized.

Symposium Location and Language

The Symposium will be held at Tsu (Mie University), Japan. This capital city of Mie Prefecture (population 160,000) is between Tokyo (3 hrs by express train) and Osaka (2 hrs), and is about 50 miles from Nagoya, the largest city of central Japan. The temperature in August is usually around 30°C (85°F). Hotel rooms are expected to be as given below (per night).
