CALL FOR PAPERS**SYMPOSIUM ON MATERIAL INSTABILITIES**

1994 ASME Winter Annual Meeting

13–18 November 1994

Material instabilities are a very important feature of plastic deformation, and have a direct effect on deformation processing and dynamic deformation. Their initiation and evolution are determined by the thermomechanical response of the material, stress state and rate, as well as by microstructural effects. A broad appraisal of the state of the art in the theoretical, experimental and numerical aspects of material instability will be carried out.

A symposium of about 30 papers is planned. Full-length papers will be published in a book. Authors of accepted papers will be requested to submit full-length papers by 30 June 1994.

One-page abstracts typed single-spaced on white $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$ in. bond paper with $1\frac{1}{4}$ in. margins on all four sides are due by 1 March 1994. The authors' names and affiliations should follow a brief title.
