ICHMT is an international, professional, non-governmental, non-profit organization established in 1968. The general objective of the Centre is to pursue excellence and foster the international exchange of science and engineering in all branches of heat and mass transfer through symposia, publications, promotion of research, and exchange of personnel for the benefit of people everywhere. With this mission in mind, ICHMT provides a unique apolitical forum for the world's leading heat and mass transfer scientists and engineers. ICHMT has 40 institutional members from 29 different countries. The ICHMTs home page on the Internet http://www.ichmt.org, which has now grown to an appreciable size, is being constantly updated, and accessed by scientists all over the world every day.

The traditional activity of ICHMT is organization of international symposia and seminars. These meetings have always met with increasing interest of the scientific, technical and industrial communities since the first meeting held in Yugoslavia on September 1968. Since then, the Centre organized highly successful meetings usually twice a year, every year, and sponsored several others. These meetings have served as a means of conveying and transferring scientific knowledge, technical know-how, and cultural values.

The general scope of the meetings has always been designed with the aim of active promotion of interesting scientific work and achievements at high technical levels. International participation in the meetings is always a major aim. The total number of participants in the meetings of

ICHMT since 1968 is over 4000 with attendees coming from over 60 different countries.

ICHMT publishes several Proceedings on various specific aspects of heat and mass transfer. Each proceeding is related to a meeting of the Centre. ICHMTs many publications have become among the most sought after collections of scientific literature in the field.
