1974 SEMINAR ON HEAT AND MASS TRANSFER IN THE ENVIRONMENT OF VEGETATION

Dubrovnik, 26-30 August 1974

The International Centre for Heat and Mass Transfer announces a change in the location of the 1974 Seminar on Heat and Mass Transfer in the Environment of Vegetation. The Seminar will be held at the Hotel Dubrovnik Palace, Dubrovnik, Yugoslavia, from 26–30 August 1974.

Heat and mass transfer are central to the problems of plant productivity and conservation, of soil management and of pollution as it affects soil, ground, water and vegetation. These matters will be treated in the Seminar, including observation methods and the bioengineering of plant growth and productivity.
