New Pesticide Uses Approved

Glenn Chemical Co., Chicago, has secured USDA approval and entered the market with Tabutrex, repellent for control of biting flies and other insects. Chemically, it is di-*n*-butylsuccinate. Experimental tests with dairy cattle showed reductions in weight loss and in retardation of milk production, with repellency lasting "for dayssometimes weeks." . . . Hercules Powder Co. has obtained Federal label registration for use of toxaphene insecticides on lettuce and cabbage. Label directions specify a 7-day pre-harvest interval following application, and outer leaves of head lettuce must be removed at harvest. . . . Geigy Chemical Corp. has obtained USDA acceptance of its claim for use of Diazinon to control flies in food processing plants and for Simazin for general weed control on noncropped lands. . . . Malathion, developed by American Cyanamid, has been granted USDA registration for use against boll weevil.

One Subsidiary Formed; One Merger Cancelled

Fabricated Metals Western Export, Inc., newly formed subsidiary of Fabricated Metals, Inc., will extend FMI activities outside the U. S., selling liquid fertilizer plants and storage, transportation, and injection equipment throughout North and South America. For past eight years, FMI has supplied liquid fertilizer equipment to Mexico; last year it built a liquid fertilizer plant for Rainbow Chemical Co., Tilsbury, Ontario. . . . Merger negotiations between Chemical & Industrial Corp. and Clopay Corp. have been terminated. C&I will continue to design and build plants for production of nitric, phosphoric, and sulfuric acids, and ammonia-based chemicals.

Launch New Marketing Procedures and Facilities

Chemical Division of Merck & Co. chose Animal Health Month (April) to launch its new line of Merck-labeled animal health products for over-the-counter sale. Three initial products are trademarked S.Q. (sulfaquinoxaline), Vet-Strep, and Duo-Strep (formulation of antibiotics streptomycin and dihydrostreptomycin). Line will be expanded as Merck's accelerated research in animal health and feed ingredient products begins to pay off. . . . Olin Mathieson Chemical's plant food division has opened new, larger warehouse facilities in Chicago. Complete stocks of the division's fertilizers and pesticides will be maintained for distribution in Wisconsin, Illinois, Indiana, Ohio, and Michigan...Abbott Laboratories is now offering for the first time commercial quantities of its crystalline gibberellic acids. Special technical service representatives of the chemical division have been assigned to assist commercial purchasers with formulation and other problems.
