For each periodical there are given, in addition to the full title and authorized abbreviations, the frequency of appearance, the first number of that volume if other than 1, the number of volumes per year, name and address of the publisher, and libraries of the U.S., Canada and Mexico which currently receive it.

The KEY TO LIBRARY FILES shows 19 Canadian and 1 Mexican library in addition to 276 libraries of the U.S., including one in Alaska, three in Hawaii, and two in Puerto Rico. The 296 libraries are marked to show those which maintain lending, microfilm copying, photoprinting, and/or translating services.

Here is what today's busy chemist has been demanding—an inexpensive reference book for his personal library that will save valuable searching time. Now he can have at his fingertips a book that will locate any scientific journal of importance subscribed to by the major libraries, with a listing of the reproduction facilities available to the scientist in need of reprint copies.
