A second conference, along similar lines to that held in Oxford, England (July 1977) to celebrate the 60th birthday of Professor Benjamin Levich, will be held at Purdue University, West Lafayette, Indiana, USA from 30 October to 1 November 1978. Subjects covered will include: electrochemical processes in science and industry, transport processes in liquids and gases and across phase interfaces, capillarity and the mechanics of interfaces, the properties and behaviour of dispersions, electrophoresis and other electrical effects in liquids, interactions of turbulence and chemical kinetics, nucleation and the growth of crystals, and relevant computational procedures.
