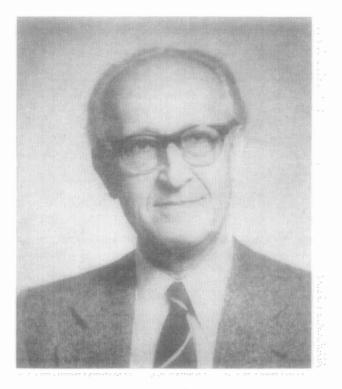
## IN MEMORIAM
