EDITORIAL

The first January issue already contained a Publishers' announcement on the future improvements of this Journal, however we did not want to let this month pass without mentioning that the Journal of Chromatography celebrated its tenth anniversary in January 1968. In its first ten years 3t volumes were published containing about 2900 papers, notes, short communications and reviews. The origin of these contributions is shown in the Table below listing more than 40 countries. From an original thin bi-monthly volume featuring reviews, original papers and chromatographic data it grew to fortnightly volumes containing original papers, chromatographic data and now the complete bibliography of chromatography (from 1968 also column methods!), while Chromatographic Reviews became an independent journal appearing 2-3 times a year. There are now independent editors for the news section, book reviews, chromatographic data and the bibliographies.

The editor wants to take this opportunity to express his thanks to these editors, the editorial board and the contributors, as well as to the publishers for everything they have done during these years.
