This special symposium issue of the Journal of Chromatography B is dedicated to papers submitted to the 12th International Conference on Biopartitioning and Purification held in Vancouver, Canada in June 2003. It therefore continues a decade-long alliance between the Journal of Chromatography and the conference organizing committee to bring readers of the journal up to date on production-scale bio-partitioning and purification science by inviting the industrial and academic scientists and engineers who participated in the conference to publish their most recent findings on the merits and uses of all scalable methods for concentrating and isolating biologics.
